This Fourth Amended and Restated Intergovernmental Agreement with the Cook County Forest Preserve District consolidates prior agreements into one Intergovernmental Agreement, so the parties can refer to one agreement detailing the cooperative services and reimbursement costs and expands the cooperation to address technology related services, landscaping and various other services. URGING THE STATE OF ILLINOIS TO ENACT OPIOID PRESCRIPTION LIMITS

WHEREAS, the opioid epidemic in our country has risen to extreme levels, causing the deaths of tens of thousands of Americans, and billions of dollars in economic costs; and

WHEREAS, according to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, in 2016 116 people died every day from opioid-related drug overdoses; and

WHEREAS, 42,249 people died from overdosing on opioids in that year alone; and

WHEREAS, of those deaths, 17,087 were the result of overdosing on commonly prescribed opioids; and

WHEREAS, the cost of these drugs totaled \$504 billion in 2016; and

WHEREAS, most recently, the state of Florida passed a bill to combat this crisis by instituting prescription limits on opioids and increasing funding for treatment; and

WHEREAS, Florida will be the 25th state since 2016 that has passed legislation that imposes some limits or guidelines on opioid prescriptions, and only the 3rd to create statutory limits of three or four days for Schedule II painkillers like OxyContin and Fentanyl; and

WHEREAS, Illinois is not one of the states with any of these imposed limits, and as a result the opioid epidemic remains relatively unchecked; and

WHEREAS, Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers of America (PhRMA) now supports policies limiting the supply of opioids for acute pain treatment; and

WHEREAS, PhRMA has concluded that too often, individuals receive a 30-day supply of opioid medicines for minor treatments or short-term pain, and that overprescribing and dispensing can lead to patients taking opioids longer than necessary or to excess pills falling into the wrong hands; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the members of this board, as public servants to the residents of Cook County, urge the Illinois General assembly to pass comprehensive legislation to limit prescriptions to these opioids to five days in order to combat the crisis currently affecting our communities and state as a whole.

PROPOSED RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A HEARING OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE COOK COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO DISCUSS THE BILLING, COLLECTIONS AND ACCOUNTS PAYABLE PRACTICES OF THE COOK COUNTY HEALTH AND HOSPITALS SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the Cook County Health and Hospitals System (“CCHHS”), recognized as part of its *IMPACT 2020* strategic plan the need to adjust its billing and collection systems to address the changes in national healthcare financing; and

WHEREAS, following the implementation of the Affordable Care Act, the payer mix at CCHHS drastically changed from majority uninsured to majority insured; and

WHEREAS, this change in payer mix required the creation of a new billing and collection system; and

WHEREAS, the billing and collection practices are vital to maintain the fiscal health and stability of CCHHS and crucial for the realization of the System's strategic plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cook County Board of Commissioners does hereby request that a meeting of the Finance Committee be convened to discuss the billing and collection practices of the Cook County Health and Hospitals System; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Chief Financial Officer and any other pertinent representatives of the Cook County Health and Hospitals System appear before the Committee and be prepared to update the Committee on the billing, collections and accounts payable cycle of the Cook County Health and Hospitals System.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Chairman of the Finance Committee of the Cook County Board of Commissioners shall develop an agenda for the hearing in consultation with the Board of Commissioners.

A motion was made by Commissioner Suffredin, seconded by Commissioner Daley, that the Proposed Resolution be referred to the Finance Committee. The motion carried.
