

Program Background and Grant Awardee Characteristics



Program Overview



The Cook County Cannabis Development Grant awarded grants totaling \$3.6 million to social equity-licensed cannabis businesses to support startup and operational business costs in Cook County.

To be eligible, businesses must have been awarded licenses under the State of Illinois Adult-Use Cannabis Social Equity Program and be committed to locate their cannabis-based business in Cook County.

Social Equity License Criteria

- 51% or more ownership by individuals who have either:
 - Lived in a Disproportionately Impacted Area (DIA) for five of last ten years OR
 - Had personal or family involvement w/the justice system for cannabis-related offenses
- Businesses w/10+ employees, 51%+ of whom meet one of the above criteria

Four (4) types of grants, based on license type:

- **1. Craft grower** licensees are eligible to receive **\$150,000** grants.
- Dispensary licensees are eligible to receive \$75,000 grants.
- 3. Infuser licensees are eligible to receive \$100,000 grants.
- **4. Transporter** licensees are eligible to receive **\$75,000** grants.



Program Priorities




The Program received more eligible applications than it could fund. Priority consideration was given towards:

- Businesses issued cannabis licenses in 2021 or
 2022
- Businesses that currently operate in a
 Disproportionately Impacted Area (DIA)
- Businesses that are majority-owned (51%+) by individuals who currently reside in DIAs

This is a map of Disproportionately Impacted Areas (DIAs) eligible for participation in the Illinois Adult-Use Social Equity Program.



8 applications did not qualify for review

Duplicate applications (5)

Operating location outside Cook County (2)

No documents uploaded (1)

44 applications did not meet standards for award eligibility

Absence of acceptable documentation required to determine eligibility (26)

Cannabis license not valid, current & in good standing (18)

40 awardees were selected based on 3 identified prioritization factors



Grant Awards



Eligible applications exceeded available grant funds (\$3.6M), so prioritization criteria were applied to identify **40 grant recipients.**






