



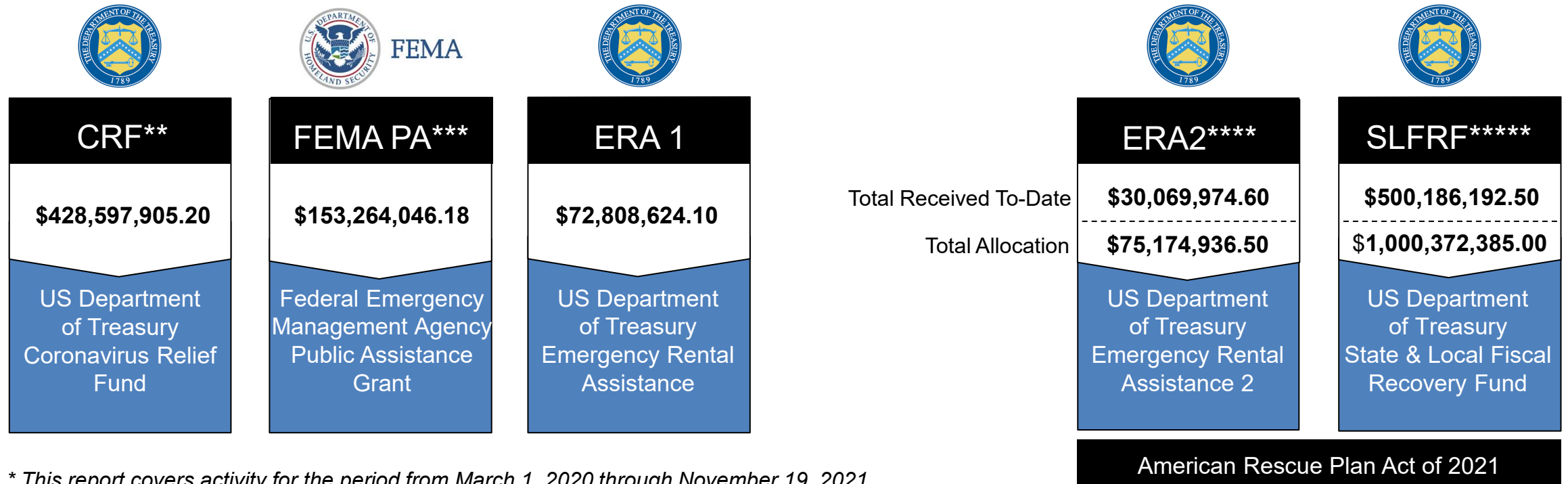
# COVID-19 Financial Response

**Report to the Board of Commissioners**

December 16, 2021

# Purpose

This report is intended to serve as an update on the County's COVID-19 funding.\*



\* This report covers activity for the period from March 1, 2020 through November 19, 2021.

\*\* The expended amount in the CRF fund may vary from month-to-month as costs originally reimbursed through the CRF fund are transferred to the County's FEMA PA grant.

\*\*\* Amount reflected above is the amount of the current grant budget. During the February 25, 2021 Board meeting, the budget was increased by \$75m to account for anticipated vaccination and labor costs. During the September 23, 2021 Board meeting, the budget was increased by \$16.5m to account for additional labor and non-personnel costs.

\*\*\*\* Cook County was allocated \$75,174,936.50 under ERA 2 including the Base Allocation of \$57,610,056.70 and High Need Allocation of \$17,564,879.80. Cook County has received 40% of the award allocation to-date, or \$30,069,974.60.

\*\*\*\*\* Cook County was allocated \$1,000,372,385.00 under SLFRF and has received 50% of the award allocation to-date, or \$500,186,192.50.

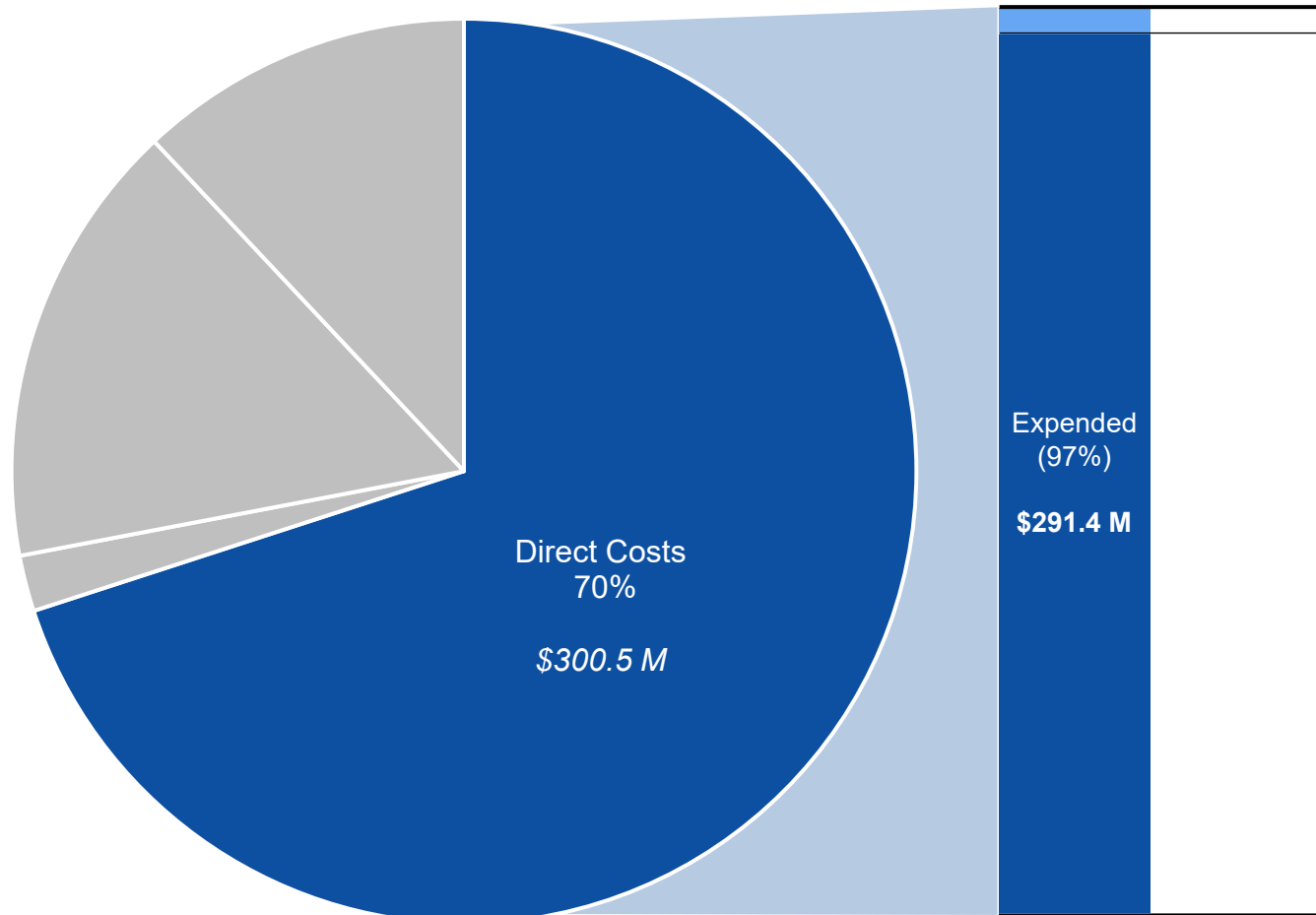

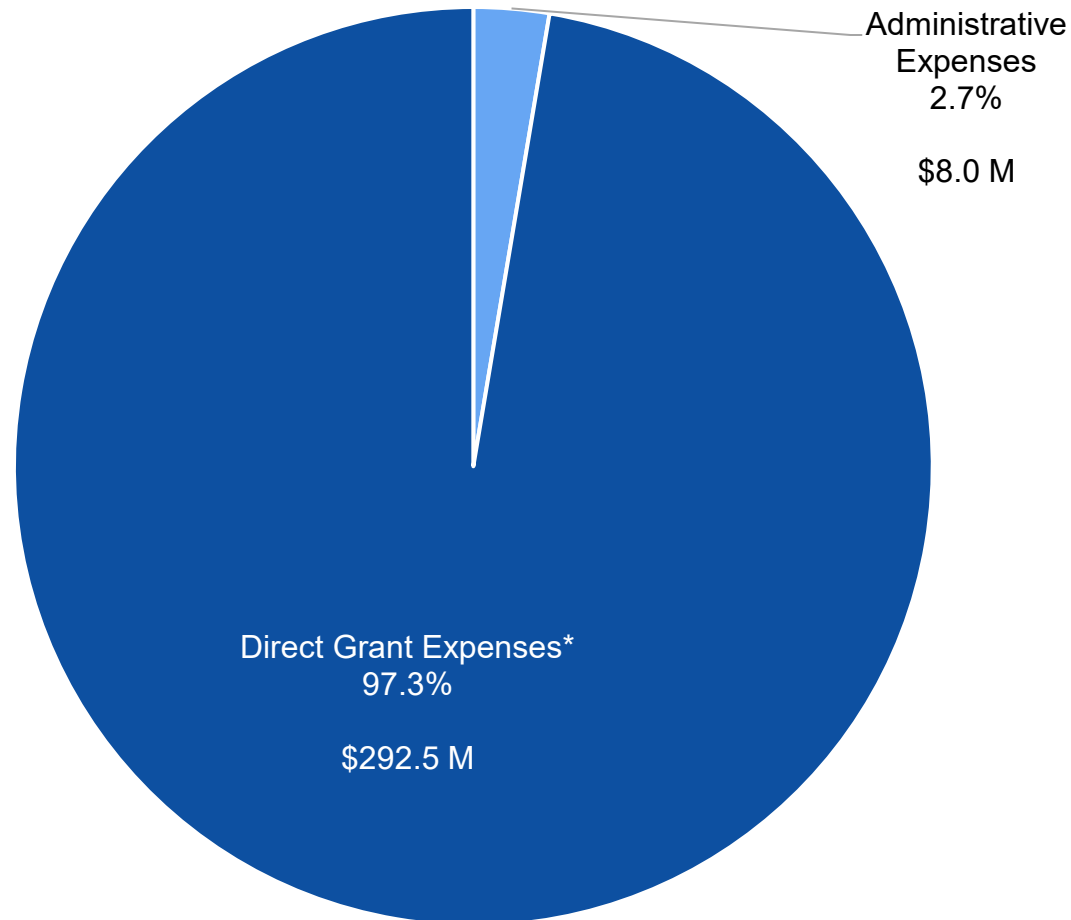

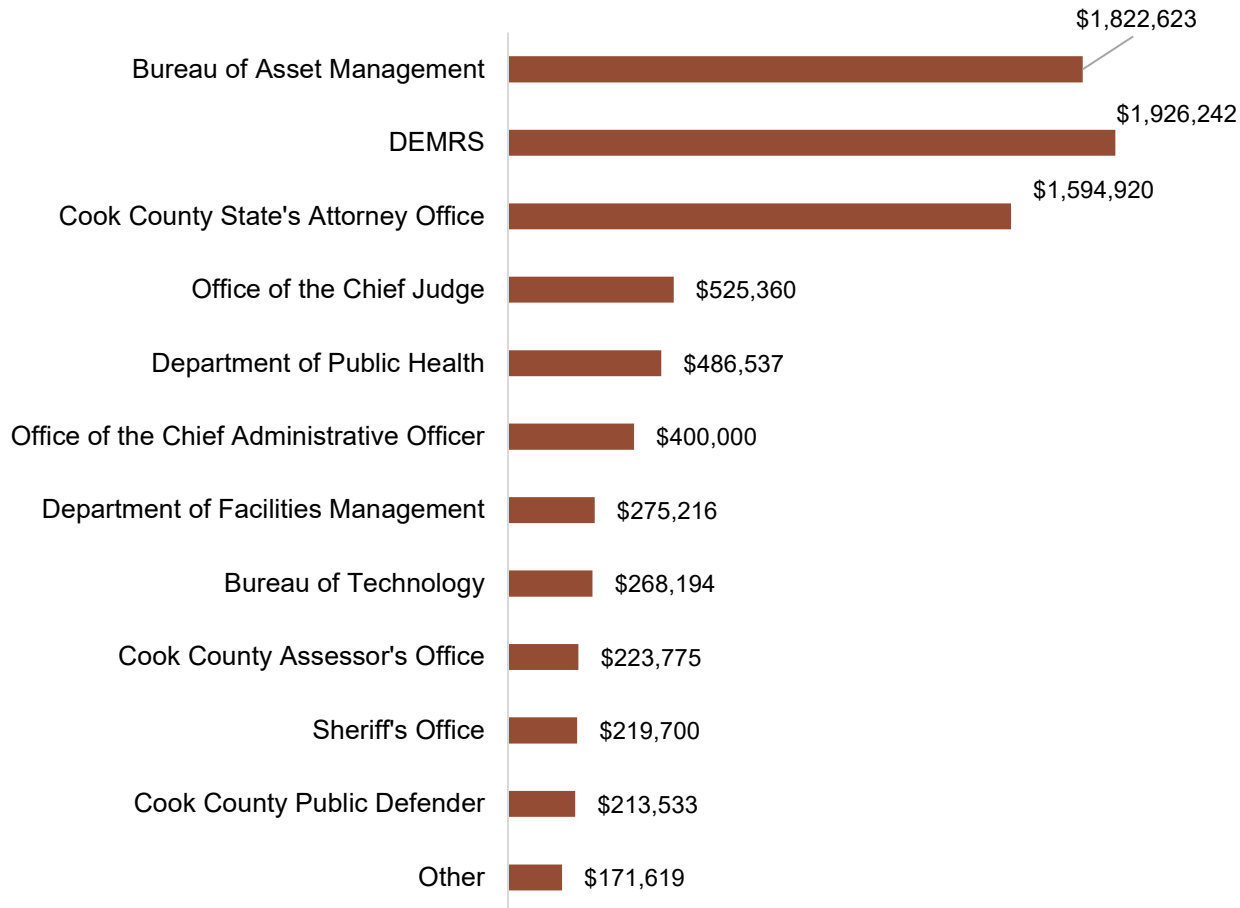

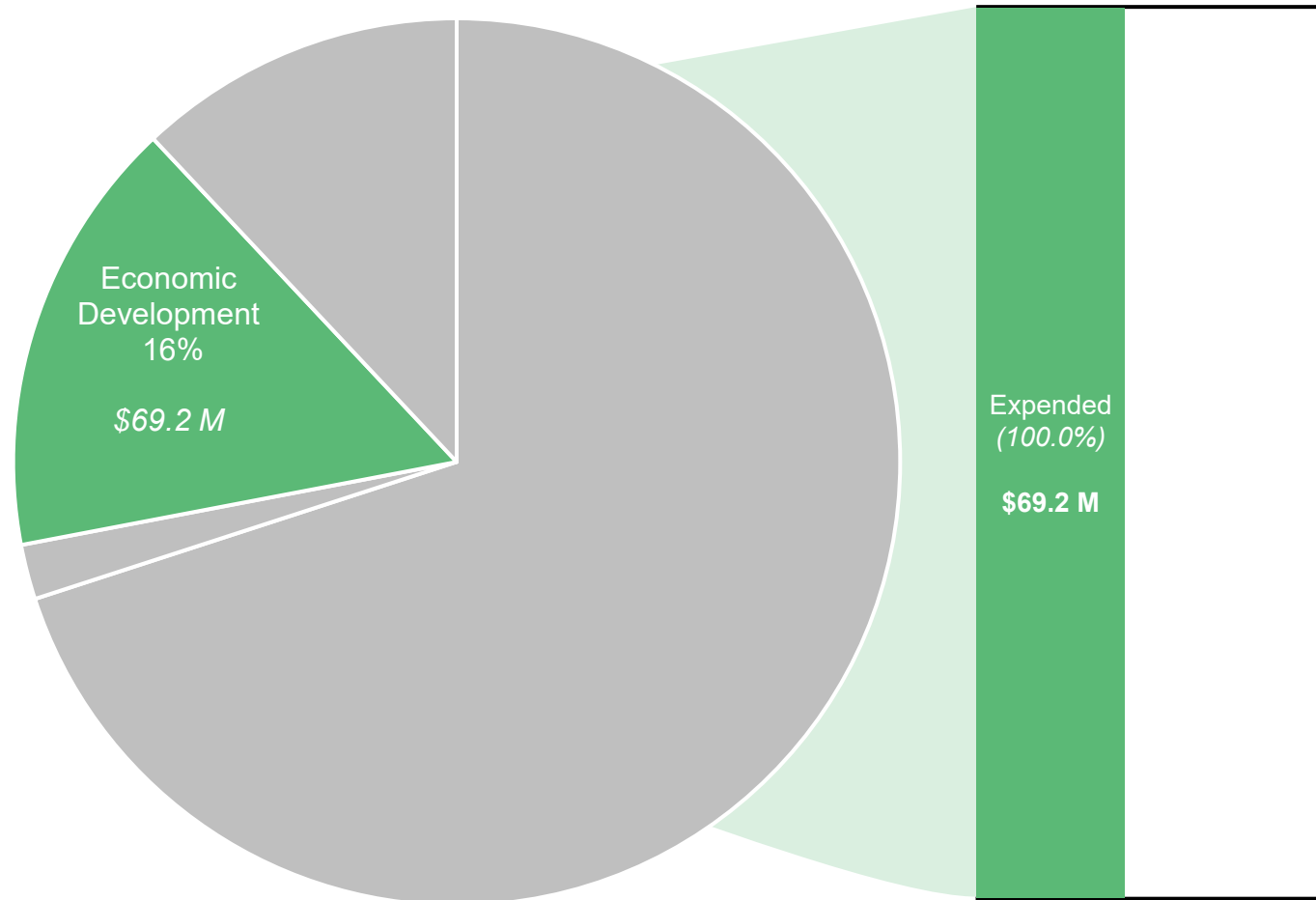

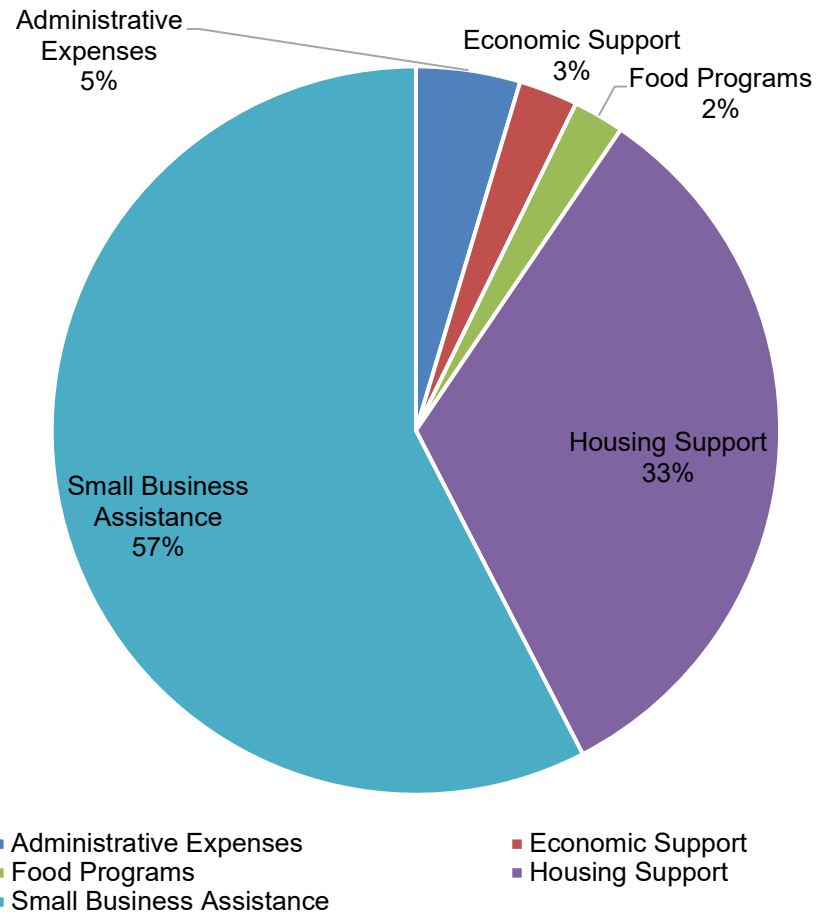

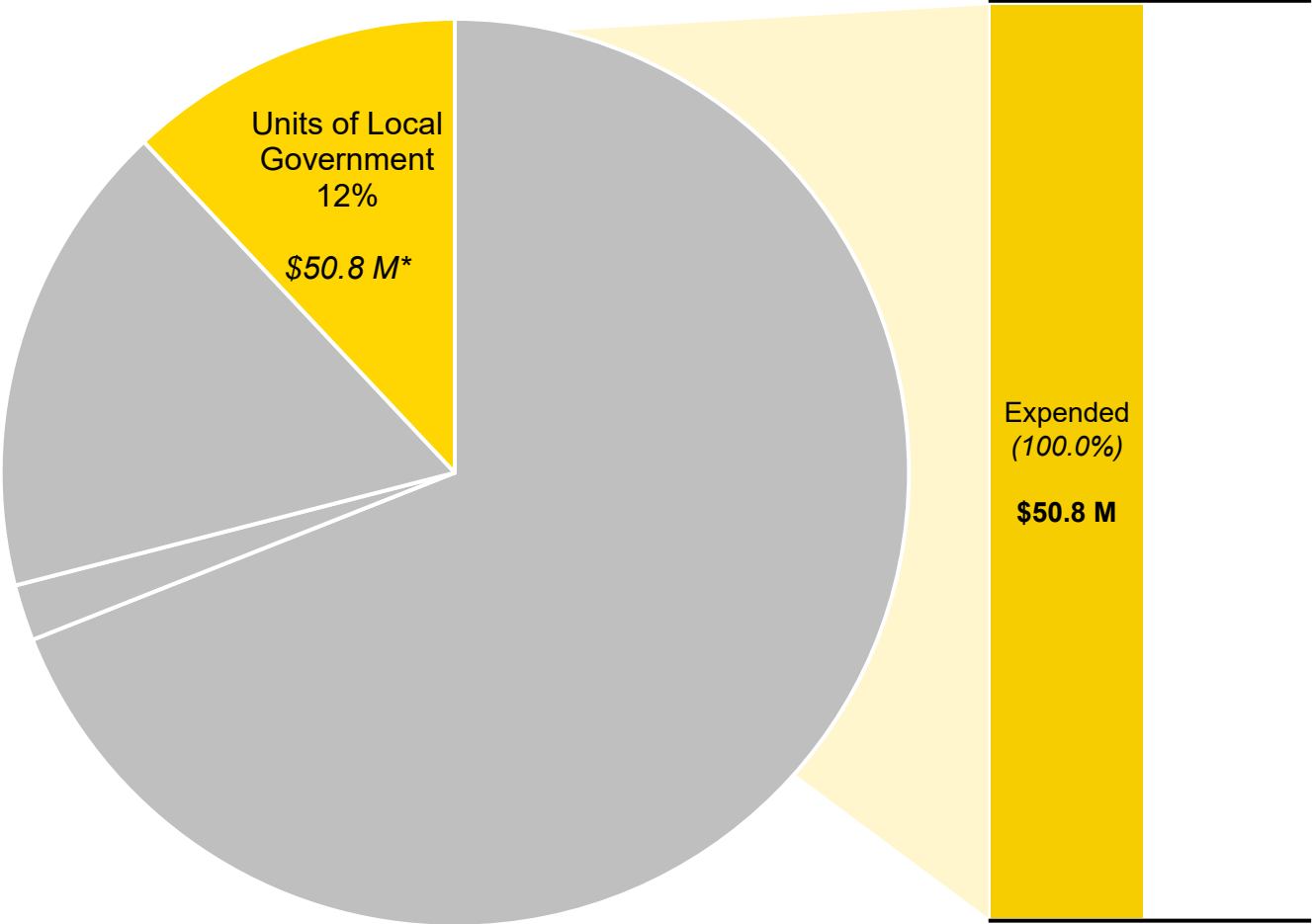

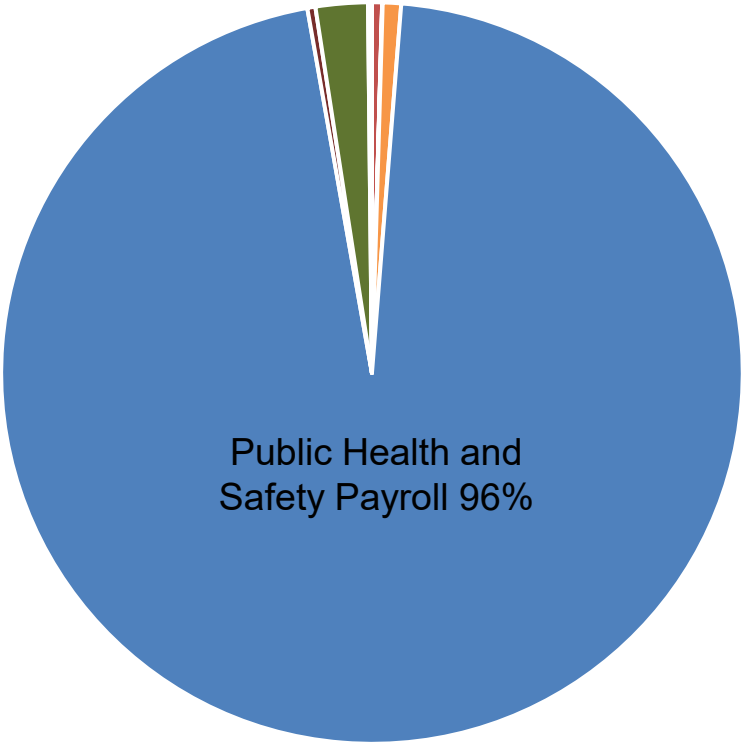

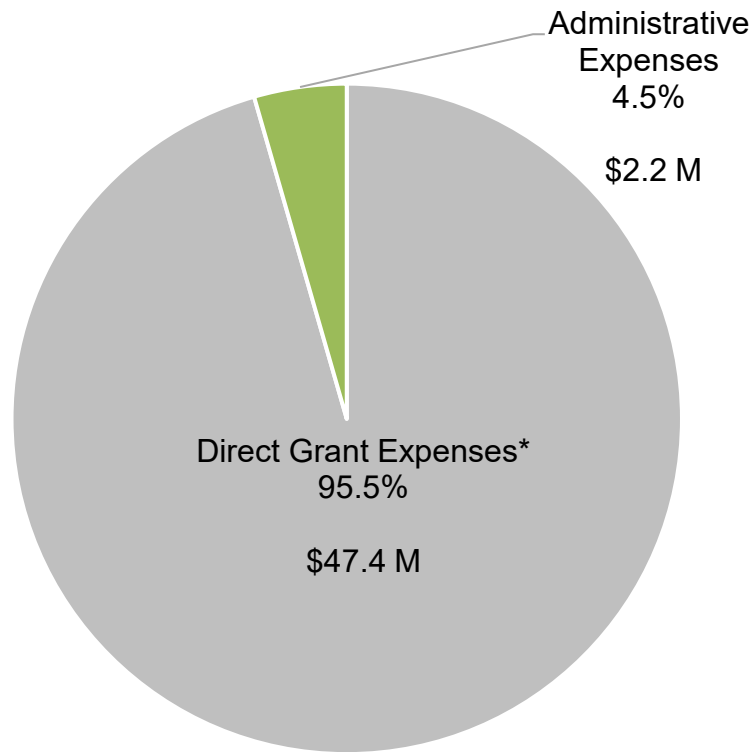

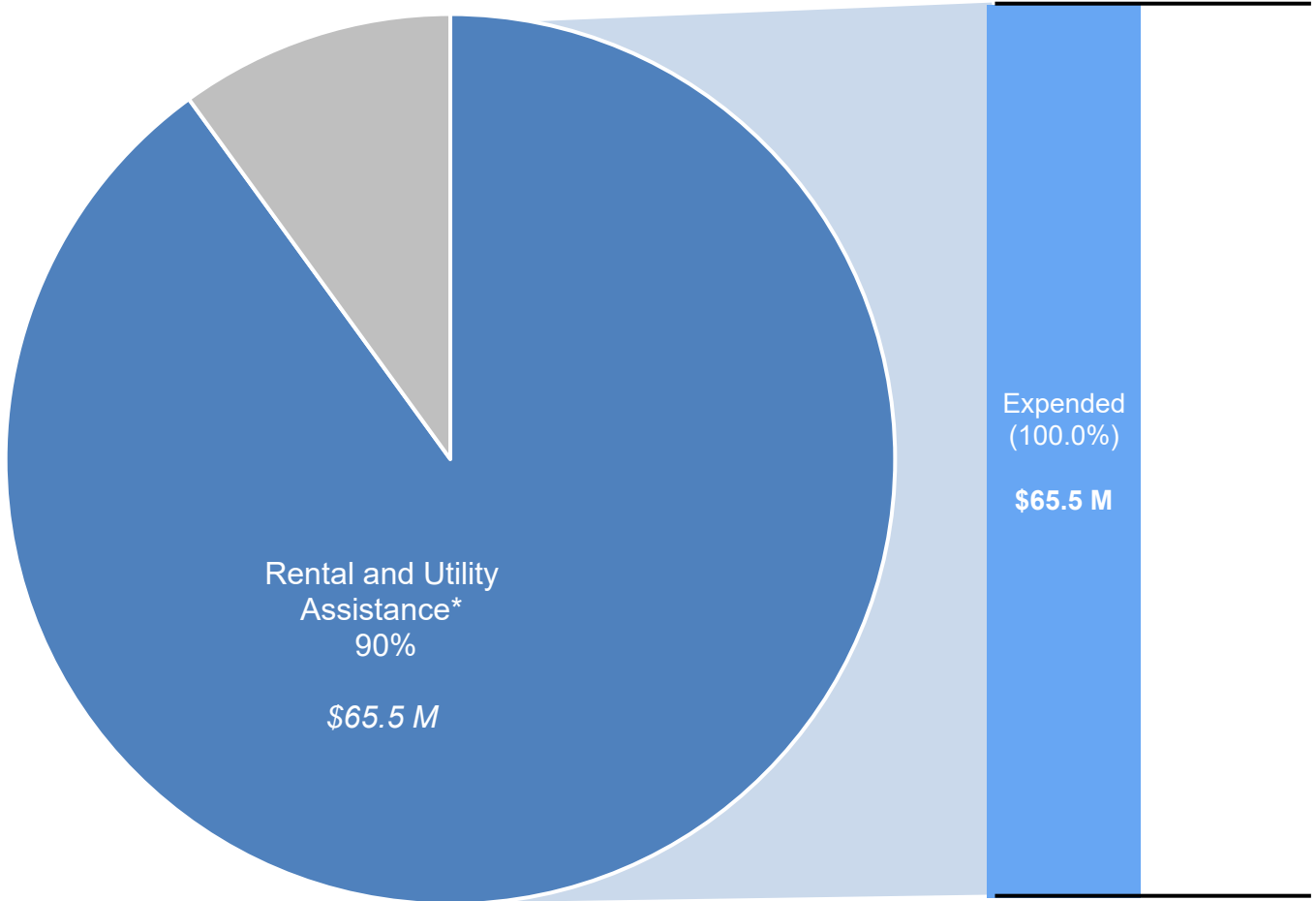

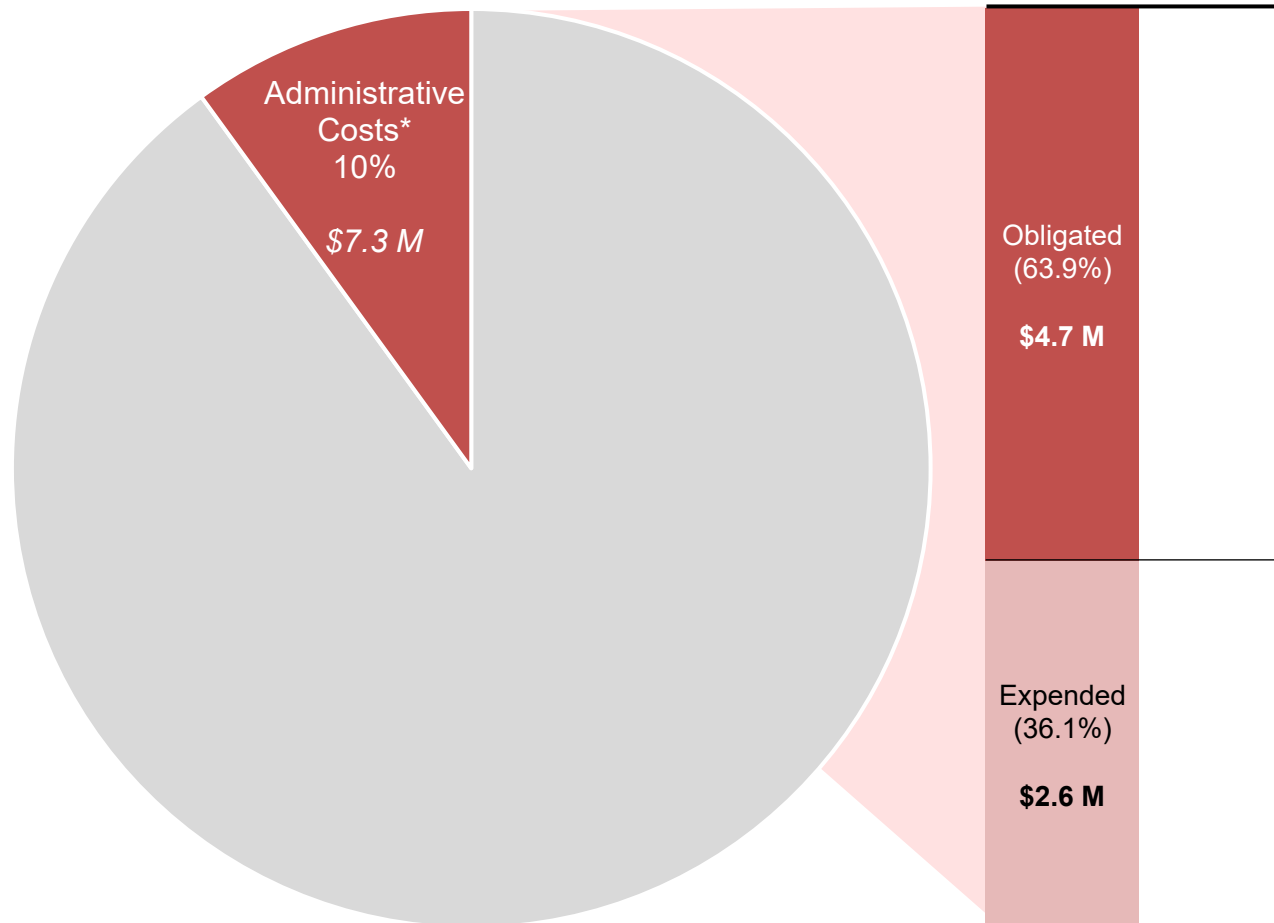

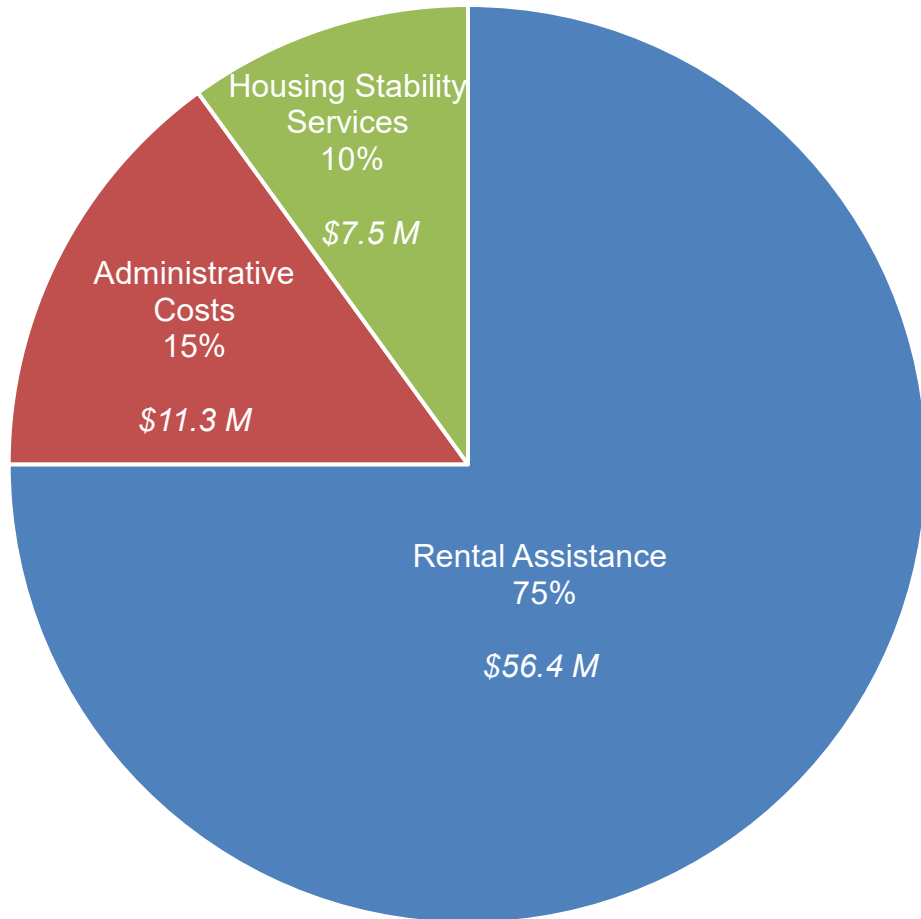

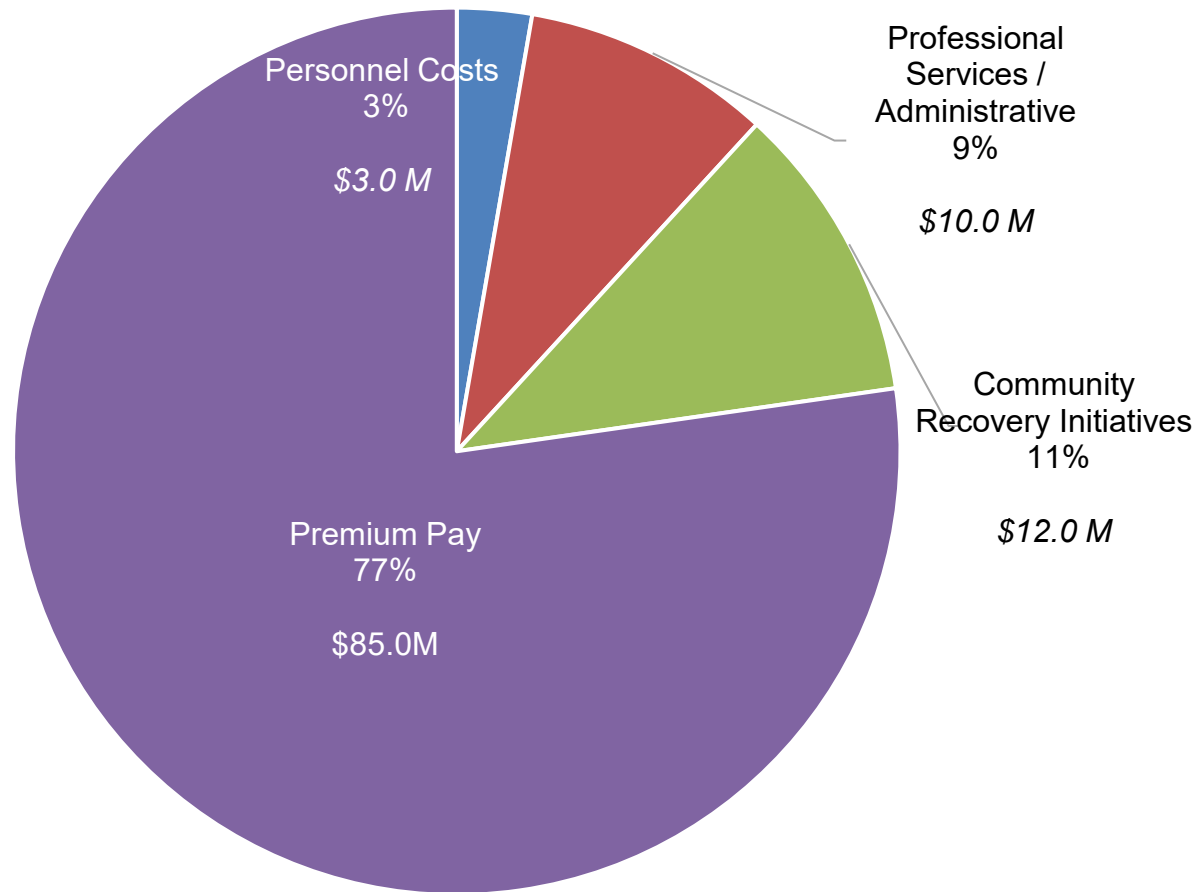

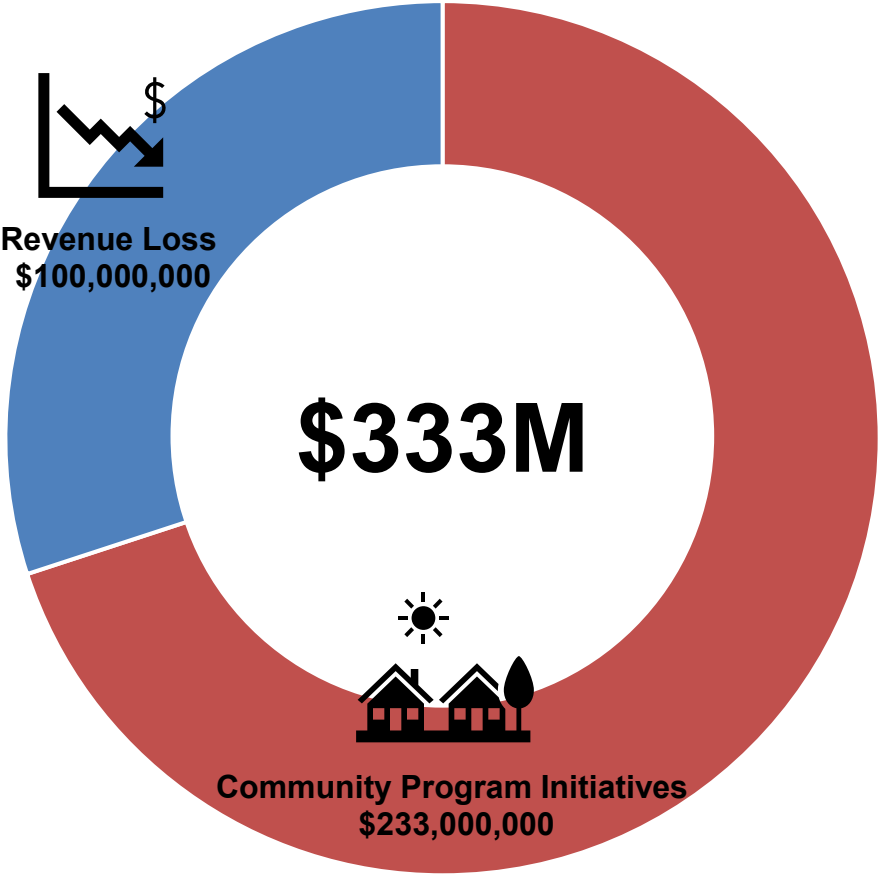
