


Good afternoon Chairman Daley and County Commissioners. Thank you for your continued support for time- and money-saving initiatives in the Cook County Clerk's office. I am pleased to present you with our budget for 2015.

We continue to do more with less. We have implemented many new projects and technologies while our budget has remained flat, and far below prior years:

- $\sqrt{\text{Our total FY 2015 budget is $27,786,331*}}$.
- $\sqrt{\text{Our }524\text{ Elections account for FY }2015\text{ is }$18,867,847.}$
- $\sqrt{}$ Our head count has shrunk by 8.27 percent since 2010. It will remain flat for 2015 with no additional positions requested.
- $\sqrt{\text{Our revenue will again exceed our corporate }110\text{ budget by about }$2.7\text{ million.}}$

MARRIAGE EQUALITY

With the legal questions surrounding marriage equality finally settled, we began issuing marriage licenses to same-sex couples on February 21.

Marriage licenses issued to same-sex couples: 5,400 as of Oct. 16

Of those:


4,116 – new licenses

TIF AMOUNTS ON TAX BILL


For the property tax bills mailed in July 2014, we added a long-awaited transparency feature: the tax amount any associated Tax Increment Financing district receives.

This information was added to the TIF line item on 222,937 of 1.8 million property tax bills – about 13 percent of bills – with the help of the Bureau of Technology.

TIF GIS TOOL

Soon after, we unveiled an online, interactive TIF mapping tool in conjunction with our annual 2013 TIF Report.


This "TIF Viewer," accessible by desktop or mobile device via cookcountyclerk.com, gives visitors a birds-eye view of TIF districts in Cook County



and allows users to zero in on any TIF district from an intuitive dropdown menu. Historical TIF revenue is also summarized and totaled.

The TIF Viewer was developed in concert with the Bureau of Technology and has already drawn thousands of hits since July.

ELECTRONIC WARRANT BOOKS



On October 1, in collaboration with the Treasurer's office we launched the first electronic warrant books, which are for tax year 2012. This new feature will make its web debut sometime later this year via the Treasurer's office. It will eliminate the need to print more than 600 books.

In the future this will result in a reduction in printing costs and return needed space back to the counters at Real Estate and Tax Services. It also allows many taxpayers to examine records simultaneously, which is particularly userful to mortgage companies, title companies and other real estate professionals.


ELECTIONS

Already this year, we have successfully implemented several new election initiatives:

- √ 17-year-old voting in primaries
 - More than 5,500 studentsregistered in January at89 high schools
- √ Online mail ballot applications
 - Started with the primary, improved for the general
 - Eliminates snail mail steps, more accurate and efficient
 - 9,382 applications with a week before Oct. 30 deadline

- √ Online voter registration
 - Nearly 3,200 registrations for suburban Cook County voters between July and the Oct. 7 deadline
- $\sqrt{}$ Election training videos
 - 30 new election training videos are now available to help election judges review procedures or troubleshoot on election day
 - Our video library has grown from 87 to 213 in just one year

NOV. 4, 2014 ELECTION


This election marks a procedural and technological watershed for Illinois. As a result of HB 105, passed in May 2014, and our own initiatives, there are several changes for this election.

√ Changes to Early Voting

- Extends to Sunday, Nov. 2
- Open until 7 p.m. the M-F of second week (Oct. 27-31)
- No ID required; will use signature verification like on election day
- Grace period registration at all 43 sites

√ Election Day Registration

- 18 sites for suburban Cook County residents
- Voters may register for first time or update their address
- After registering, voters will immediately cast a ballot, which will be counted after we verify they didn't vote anywhere else
- I support making this pilot permanent and expanded to all precincts in time for the 2016 presidential elections

NOV. 4, 2014 ELECTION

√ E-Pollbooks

- Our grant-funded electronic poll books will be in all precincts for the first time
- The pilot during the March primary election was successful
- E-pollbooks replace the Application for Ballot book, so judges search for the voter on a laptop, print
 - the voter on a laptop, print a label for the voter to sign, then verify the signature
- Precincts will be equipped with standard paper materials as a backup



ALL IN



Altogether, these advances provide the foundation for my ultimate goal – electronic data sharing between government agencies to provide eligible citizens with instantaneous voter registration when they utilize government services. This "ALL IN" program will have the power to bring all of Illinois' eligible citizens into the voter pool.

For example, voters think when they move and complete a National Change of Address Form at the Post Office, it changes their voter registration. And it

does if you move from Oak Park to Evanston. But not if you move from Oak Park to Rogers Park or from Orland Park to Will County. The tools and the information are available to remedy that and we should do it.

LOOKING TO 2015

School Board Candidate Filing & Electoral Boards

Beginning with the April 7, 2015 Consolidated Election, the legislature transferred to us the responsibility for accepting school board candidate filings and resolving candidacy disputes for nearly 150 school districts.

We are working with the districts and broader population to help ensure candidates have access to the information they need to successfully complete their paperwork. Candidate filing will be held Dec. 15-22 at our downtown office, but we will also offer suburban filing locations on the first day of filing.


If candidates are challenged, the County Officers Electoral Board will resolve those disputes. We are working to make the process convenient for candidates, and training a cadre of hearing officers to work through the caseload in a timely manner.

LOOKING TO 2015

New Voter Registration Management System

We are seeking proposals to replace the legacy Voter Registration Management System (VRMS) used by the Elections Division for nearly 20 years. Significant design and programming may be required. Work will begin in 2015 with a phased deployment culminating by the end of 2017.

The goal of the project is twofold. First, to conduct business successfully under the current



laws and rules. Second, to deploy a sound foundation and architecture that also adapts to changing business needs. Like my earlier mention of All In, my vision of the future of voter registration is an increasingly-centralized, highly-automated network of voter datasets that are compared on a routine basis to increase enrollment and improve the accuracy of the voter rolls. Further, communications with voters will be increasingly automated and digital.

LOOKING TO 2015

Integrated Property Tax System (IPTS)

In collaboration with the Bureau of Technology and the other county tax offices, our Real Estate and Tax Services Division is firmly committed to the County's mission to replace the current legacy property tax system with a modernized and integrated system.
