PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDMENT**PROPERTY TAX INCENTIVE - PREVAILING WAGE REQUIREMENT**

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 74 TAXATION, Section 74-71 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 74-71. - Laws regulating the payment of wages.

(a) Living wage requirement.

- (1) Unless expressly waived by the County Board, any Employer occupying a property that receives a property tax incentive for Class 6b industrial property, Class 8 industrial property, or Class 9 multifamily residential property shall pay not less than the Living Wage, as defined in the Cook County Procurement Code (Cook County, Ill., Code, Ch. 34, Art. IV, Div. 1 § 34-121), to each of its onsite Employees, unless such Employees' Wages are governed by Federal or State prevailing wage law. For purpose of this Section, the term "Employee" shall mean an Employee who performs duties or services for an Employer on average at least 30 hours per week in any two-week period for which the Employee is paid; "hours per week" shall mean hours for which an Employee is paid or entitled to payment by the Employer for a period of time during which no duties are performed by the Employee due to vacation, holiday, illness, incapacity, jury duty, military duty or approved leave of absence.
- (2) On and after July 1, 2020, the owner of any property that receives a property tax incentive shall notify all Employers who occupy such property as lessees of the requirements of this Section. Upon commencement of a lease, on or after July 1, 2020, of a property that receives a property tax incentive, any new lessee shall be required to submit to the municipality or the Cook County Board, as the case may be, an affidavit stating that such lessee is paying a Living Wage to its Employees in compliance with this Section. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the requirements of this Section shall not apply to an Employer who was a lessee and not an owner-occupant of a property that receives a property tax incentive prior to July 1, 2020.
- (3) This Section shall not apply to Employers that are not-for-profit organizations or funded by Federal grants or Federal loans or Employers who are lessees but are not owners of a property that receives a property tax incentive prior to adoption of this amended Ordinance. Further, this Section shall not apply to Employers who can demonstrate to the County Board that compliance with the requirements of this Section would cause such Employer to be in violation of the terms of a collective bargaining agreement between the Employer and a labor union.

- (4) Every Employer required to pay the Living Wage shall notify its Employees of the Living Wage requirements and shall notify all of its Employees annually of any adjustment to the Living Wage. In addition, the Employer shall notify its Employees that if any Employee contends that the Employer is not paying a Living Wage or has otherwise violated this section, that Employee may file a complaint with the Cook County Commissioner on Human Rights ("Commission"). The Commissioner shall investigate alleged violations of the Living Wage Ordinance and is authorized to adopt regulations for the proper administration and enforcement of its provisions. If at the conclusion of the Commission's investigation, the Commission finds that the Employer has violated this section, it shall (i) in the case of an Employer receiving a property tax incentive, notify the Assessor; or (ii) in the case of a Contractor or a subcontractor required to pay the Living Wage, notify the CPO, who shall exercise such remedies as are in the best interest of the County, including ordering the Employer to pay back pay and penalties, as provided in this section.
- (5) If an Employer is found to be in violation of this section, such Employer may be required to pay back pay to each affected Employee, and may also be fined by the County up to \$100.00 for each affected Employee for each day paid at less than the Living Wage. Such penalties will not be imposed on any Person except after a hearing (Cook County, Ill., Code, Ch. 2, Art. IX). Further, if an Employer is found to be in violation of this section, the property tax incentive for this property is subject to revocation.
- (6) If an Employer is found to have retaliated against an affected Employee, the Employer's property tax incentive may be terminated unless such Employer appropriately reinstates or compensates such Employee.
- (7) For the purposes of this Section:

Property tax incentive means a reduction in the assessment level as set forth in Division 2 of this Article for Class 6b industrial property, Class 8 industrial property, or Class 9 multifamily residential property. "Property tax incentive" shall not include a Class 9 designation granted to supportive living facilities, which establish an alternative to nursing home care for low income older persons and persons with disabilities under Medicaid and which are certified by the State Department of Public Aid pursuant to Division 2 of this Article; and

Sales tax means the Retailer's Occupation Tax, the Service Occupation Tax and/or the Use Tax.

- (8) Living Wage Affidavit. Every municipality or the Cook County Board that provides a Resolution or Ordinance or authorized officer letter, as the case may be, to an applicant for a Class 6b industrial property or a Class 8 industrial property tax incentive shall maintain in its files and records documentation that such municipality or the County Board received and filed the Living Wage Affidavit submitted by the owner or lessee of such property stating that such owner or lessee is paying a Living Wage to its Employees in compliance with this Section. Further, an applicant or lessee of a Class 9 multifamily residential property tax incentive shall provide the municipality or the Cook County Board, as the case may be, a Living Wage Affidavit which shall be maintained by such municipality or the Cook County Board in its files and records.

(b) Prevailing wage requirement.

- (1) Any owner of real estate that on or after January, 2018 is an applicant for, or recipient of, any Property Tax Incentive under any Assessment Class as set forth in Division 2 of this Article for which a Resolution or Ordinance from the municipality or the County Board is or was required, or where an authorized officer letter is or was obtained in lieu of such Resolution or Ordinance, shall pay all laborers, workers and mechanics engaged in Construction work within, or relating to Construction projects within, the subject property not less than the prevailing rate of wages paid for work of a similar character on public works in Cook County. This requirement extends to all contractors, subcontractors, and lessees who perform such Construction work, whether or not at the direction of the owner.
- (2) The prevailing rate of wages shall be the same as the then-current rate for Cook County determined pursuant to the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.).
- (3) (a) Unless otherwise defined herein, the definition of any terms used in this Section which are also used in the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.) shall be the same as that set forth in the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act.

(b) For the purposes of this Section:

Property Tax Incentive means a reduction in the assessment level as set forth in Division 2 of this Article for any property regardless of the Assessment Class.

Construction means all work on any newly constructed building or structure, or any alteration, improvement, repair, renovation, rehabilitation, demolition, deconstruction, maintenance, or reconstruction of existing building or structure, regardless of the public or private nature of the projects or ownership.

- (4) Any owner of real estate that on or after January __, 2018 is an applicant for, or recipient of, any Property Tax Incentive under any Assessment Class as set forth in Division 2 of this Article for which a Resolution or Ordinance from the municipality or the County Board is or was required, or where an authorized officer letter is or was obtained in lieu of such Resolution or Ordinance, shall:

(a) keep, or cause a contractor, subcontractor, or lessee performing the Construction work to keep, for a period of 5 years from the date of the last payment made, records of all laborers, mechanics, and other workers engaged in Construction work within, or relating to Construction projects within, the subject property; the records shall include (i) the worker's name, (ii) the worker's address, (iii) the worker's telephone number when available, (iv) the worker's social security number, (v) the worker's classification or classifications, (vi) the worker's gross and net wages paid in each pay period, (vii) the worker's number of hours worked each day, (viii) the worker's starting and ending times of work each day, (ix) the worker's hourly wage rate, (x) the worker's hourly overtime wage rate, (xi) the worker's hourly fringe benefit rates, (xii) the name and address of each fringe benefit fund, (xiii) the plan sponsor of each fringe benefit, if applicable, and (xiv) the plan administrator of each fringe benefit, if applicable; and

(b) no later than the 15th day of each calendar month file, or cause a contractor, subcontractor, or lessee performing the Construction work to file, with Cook County a certified payroll for the immediately preceding month. A certified payroll must be filed for only those calendar months during which such Construction work has occurred. The certified payroll shall consist of a complete copy of the records

identified in this subsection (a), but may exclude the starting and ending times of work each day. The certified payroll shall be accompanied by a statement signed by the owner or an officer, employee, or agent of the owner which avers that: (i) he or she has examined the certified payroll records required to be submitted by this Section and such records are true and accurate; and (ii) the hourly rate paid to each worker is not less than the general prevailing rate of hourly wages required by this Section. An owner is not prohibited from relying on the certification of a contractor, subcontractor, or lessee provided the owner does not knowingly rely upon a false certification. Cook County shall keep the records submitted in accordance with this subsection (b) for a period of 5 years from the date of the last payment for Construction work. The records submitted in accordance with this subsection (b) shall be considered public records, except an employee's address, telephone number, and social security number, and made available in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act. Cook County shall accept any reasonable submissions that meet the requirements of this Section.

(5) The recipient must provide credible evidence that, at all times after it receives and maintains any tax incentive designation under Division 2 of this Article, if any Construction, occurs at the subject property, then any contractors, subcontractors, or lessees who perform such work must participate in an active apprenticeship and training program approved and registered with the United States Department of Labor's Office of Apprenticeship, if the contractor or subcontractor employs people in a covered occupation.

(6) Prevailing Wage Affidavit. Every municipality or the Cook County Board that provides a Resolution or Ordinance or authorized officer letter, as the case may be, to an applicant for, or a recipient of, any Property Tax Incentive as set forth in Division 2 of this Article shall maintain in its files and records documentation that such municipality or the County Board received and filed the Prevailing Wage Affidavit submitted by the owner of such property stating that such owner shall pay, or cause a contractor, subcontractor, or lessee to pay, the prevailing rate of wages in compliance with this Section and comply with subsections (b)(4) and (b)(5) of this Section. The failure to file such affidavit and supporting documents within the time established by the Assessor's rules shall result in the loss of the incentive for the period relating to the non-filing or revocation under Section 74-73.

~~(b)(c)~~ State or Federal Laws.

(1) Except where a Person has requested an exception from the Assessor and the County Board expressly finds that granting the exception is in the best interest of the County, such Person including any Substantial Owner (as defined in Cook County, Ill., Code, Ch. 34, Art. V § 34-367) shall be ineligible to receive any property tax incentive noted in Division 2 of this Article if, during the five-year period prior to the date of the application, such Person or Substantial Owner (as defined in Cook County, Ill., Code, Ch. 34, Art. V § 34-367) admitted guilt or liability or has been adjudicated guilty or liable in any judicial or administrative proceeding of committing a repeated or willful violation of the Illinois Wage Payment and Collection Act, 820 ILCS 115/1 et seq., the Illinois Minimum Wage Act, 820 ILCS 105/1 et seq., the Illinois Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act, 820 ILCS 65/1 et seq., the Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act, 29 U.S.C. 2101 et seq., the Employee Classification Act, 820 ILCS 185/1 et seq., the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938, 29 U.S.C. 201, et seq., the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act, 820 ILCS 130/1 et seq., or any comparable state statute or regulation of any state, which governs the payment of wages.

- (2) The Assessor shall obtain an affidavit or certification from every Person and Substantial Owner (as defined in Cook County, Ill., Code, Ch. 34, Art. V § 34-367) who seeks a property tax incentive from the County as noted in Division 2 of this Article certifying that the Person or Substantial Owner (as defined in Cook County, Ill., Code, Ch. 34, Art. V § 34-367) has not violated the statutory provisions identified in Subsection (a) of this Section.

- (3) If the County or Assessor becomes aware that a Person or Substantial Owner (as defined in Cook County, Ill., Code, Ch. 34, Art. V § 34-367) has admitted guilt or liability or has been adjudicated guilty or liable in any judicial or administrative proceeding of committing a repeated or willful violation of the Illinois Wage Payment and Collection Act, 820 ILCS 115/1 et seq., the Illinois Minimum Wage Act, 820 ILCS 105/1 et seq., the Illinois Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act, 820 ILCS 65/1 et seq., the Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act, 29 U.S.C. 2101 et seq., the Employee Classification Act, 820 ILCS 185/1 et seq., the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938, 29 U.S.C. 201, et seq., or any comparable state statute or regulation of any state, which governs the payment of wages during the five-year period prior to the date of the application, but after the County has reclassified the Person's or Substantial Owner's (as defined in Cook County, Ill., Code, Ch. 34, Art. V § 34-367) subject property under a property tax incentive classification, then, after notice from the Assessor of such violation, the Person or Substantial Owner shall have 45 days to cure its violation and request an exception or waiver from the Assessor. Failure to cure or obtain an exception or waiver of ineligibility from the Assessor shall serve as grounds for revocation of the classification as provided by the Assessor or by the County Board by Resolution or Ordinance. In case of revocation or cancellation, the Incentive Classification shall be deemed null and void for the tax year in which the incentive was revoked or cancelled as to the subject property. In such an instance, the taxpayer shall be liable for and shall reimburse to the County Collector an amount equal to the difference in the amount of taxes that would have been collected had the subject property not received the property tax incentive.

Effective date: This ordinance shall be in effect immediately upon adoption.

PROPOSED RESOLUTION

TO ADOPT THE GOOD FOOD PURCHASING POLICY

WHEREAS, Cook County strives to improve the health of all its residents through services and policies that promote health and well-being; and

WHEREAS, The Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) recommended the creation of sustainable local food systems in its *Go To 2040* Comprehensive Regional Plan; and

WHEREAS, The Cook County Commission on Social Innovation, through its internal procedure reviewed, and now recommends, the adoption of a Good Food Purchasing Policy; and

WHEREAS, The Cook County Commission on Social Innovation found that sustainable food is ecologically sound, economically viable, and socially responsible; and

WHEREAS, The Cook County Commission on Social Innovation found that the health and well-being of residents can be supported by the creation of a sustainable local food system; and

WHEREAS, Cook County strives to promote safe, healthy and fair work environments for its workforce; and

WHEREAS, The Good Food Purchasing Program (GFPP) was developed in 2012 to encourage public institutions to procure food produced through values-driven purchasing standards and to support successful implementation through technical assistance and verification; and

WHEREAS, Good Food is defined by GFPP as food that is healthy, local, fair, sustainable and humane, with foods that meet the dietary guidelines for Americans, provide freedom from chronic ailment and are delicious and safe, and where participating food suppliers are evaluated and held accountable for ensuring fair compensation and fair treatment of their workers, and that those workers are free of exploitation, and where Good Food is available to purchase for all income levels and high-quality food is equitable and physically and culturally accessible to all, and where food is produced, processed, distributed, and recycled locally using the principles of environmental stewardship (in terms of water, soil, and pesticide management); and

WHEREAS, Good Food values prioritize nutrition, affordability, geography, and sustainable production practices including sound environmental practices, fair prices for producers, safe and fair working conditions for employees, and humane conditions for animals; and

WHEREAS, Good Food purchasing refers to the sourcing and purchasing of foods and beverages, and food and beverage service contracts, procured by County Departments and Agencies; and

WHEREAS, In participating in the Good Food Purchasing Program, Cook County will help support a regional food system that is ecologically sound, economically viable and socially responsible, and will have an impact on the availability of local, sustainable food; and

WHEREAS, There exists in the food and composting industries limited diversity in the ownership, production and distribution channels; and

WHEREAS, People with arrest and conviction records face significant employment challenges; and

WHEREAS, There is a need to preserve urban and peri-urban farm land with equitable minority community ownership and control; and

WHEREAS, There are significant barriers to entry into the food industry at the ownership level, including access to capital and information, expertise and relationships, resulting in a need for capacity building for disadvantaged and under-capitalized businesses; and

WHEREAS, There are a number of tax credits available at the federal, state, county and city level to incentivize investment in distressed communities and to hire very low- income employees, employees with past criminal records, etc.; and

WHEREAS, It is recognized that the significant buying power of public institutions across the country can reform the food system, create opportunities for smaller farmers and low-income entrepreneurs of color to thrive, provide just compensation and fair treatment for food chain workers, support sustainable farming practices, reward good environmental stewardship including limiting food waste and increasing composting, and increase access to fresh and healthy foods; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That Cook County embrace the Good Food Purchasing Program (GFPP) as a strategy to help improve our region's food system through the adoption and implementation of the Good Food Purchasing Standards, which emphasize the following values:

1. **Local Economies** - support small and mid-sized agricultural and food processing operations within the local area or region.
2. **Environmental Sustainability** - support producers that employ sustainable production systems that reduce or eliminate synthetic pesticides and fertilizers; avoid the use of hormones, antibiotics, and genetic engineering; conserve soil and water; protect and enhance wildlife habitat and biodiversity; and reduce on-farm energy consumption and greenhouse gas emissions.
3. **Valued Workforce** - provide safe and healthy working conditions and fair compensation for all food chain workers and producers from production to consumption
4. **Animal Welfare** - provide healthy and humane care for farm animals.
5. **Nutritional** - promote health and well-being by offering generous portions of vegetables, fruit, and whole grains; reducing salt, added sugars, fats, and oils; and by eliminating artificial additives.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the following priorities are also adopted and implemented as part of Cook County's participation in the Good Food Purchasing Program (GFPP).

Priority Communities- Incentivize investment in low-to-moderate income communities where at least 51% of households have incomes at or below 80% of the area median income (AMI), as defined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Priority will be given to communities that also have scores ranging between 30.1 and 82.7 on the University of Illinois at Chicago Great Cities Institute's Economic Hardship Index

Urban Farm Land Preservation-Preserve publicly-owned vacant land for urban agriculture. Promote conveyance of publicly-owned vacant land to local minority owned and/or controlled social enterprises; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Cook County Departments and Agencies involved in the procurement or service contracting of foods will adopt Good Food Purchasing Standards, which include options and flexibility within each of these five value categories, as a framework for guiding values-driven purchasing; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That all relevant Cook County Departments and Agencies, with assistance from the Chicago Food Policy Action Council, Center for Good Food Purchasing, and other relevant diverse stakeholders, will take the following steps in support of the purchasing of Good Food:

1. Communicate Good Food Purchasing Standards to appropriate suppliers, including distributors and foodservice companies, and ask them to share data that will help the County complete a baseline Good Food Purchasing assessment of food procurement practices within 12 months of the adoption of this Resolution.
2. Incentivize businesses to grow food organically and engage in bio-dynamic agriculture, developing incentives for Requests for Proposal reviews and other potential supports during the contracting period; and
3. Incentivize prospective food vendors to invest in and hire from low-to-moderate income Communities by: 1) developing incentives for Requests for Proposal reviews for prospective vendors that demonstrate a track record of hiring and investing in such communities; and 2) assisting prospective vendors in navigating tax incentives and other financial programs designed to increase investment in disadvantaged communities; and
4. Incentivize conveyance of publicly-owned vacant land to local minority owned and/or controlled social enterprises and/or community land trusts in an equitable fashion by setting ownership goals for minority owned and controlled enterprises; developing incentives for Requests for Proposal reviews; exploring possibilities for technical assistance and financial assistance, including tax incentives; and
5. Incentivize hiring people with arrest and conviction records by developing incentives for Requests for Proposal reviews, exploring options for technical assistance and financial assistance, including tax incentives; and
6. Engage local universities, social enterprises and small consulting firms with demonstrated expertise in providing technical assistance to emerging and/or disadvantaged businesses; and
7. After the baseline assessment has been completed, develop and adopt an multi-year action plan with benchmarks to measure success towards Good Food Purchasing Standards and diversity goals, including accountability systems with appropriate vendors/distributors to verify sourcing commitments and assess current food procurement practices within 6 months; and
8. After the baseline assessment has been completed, establish supply chain accountability and traceability systems with vendors/distributors to verify sourcing commitments and assess current food procurement practices within 6 months; and
9. After the baseline assessment has been completed, incorporate Good Food Purchasing Standards into new procurement requests and contracts within 6 months; and

10. Seek resources as needed to staff and implement the Good Food Purchasing Standards; and

Report progress to the Cook County Board of Commissioners within 12 months of the adoption of this Resolution, and then report annually on implementation progress and host an annual public hearing where diverse community stakeholders and residents can ask questions and provide feedback on implementation, information should include due diligence reporting data to verify compliance, measure progress, and celebrate successes.

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of Illinois ordered that Illinois Circuit Courts create an Electronic Filing system (“e-filing”) on January 22, 2016; and

WHEREAS, Illinois Circuit Courts were to implement their e-filing system by January 1, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Cook County entered into a contract with On-Line Information Services in June of 2016 to provide e-filing services; and

WHEREAS, in April of 2017, Tyler Technologies signed a \$36 million contract with Cook County to provide court docketing services that would include matters filed through e-filing in the Circuit Court of Cook County; and

WHEREAS, to monitor the court docketing services contract, Cook County entered into an agreement with PriceWaterhouseCooper; and

WHEREAS, Tyler Technologies informed the Clerk, under a different contract with the Illinois Supreme court, that it would be unable to complete the payment component of the e-filing system by the deadline; and

WHEREAS, in a November 25, 2017 article in the Chicago Tribune, Circuit Court Clerk Dorothy Brown stated that her office was prepared for e-filing; and

WHEREAS, on December 13, 2017, Cook County Circuit Court Clerk Dorothy Brown petitioned the Illinois Supreme Court to extend the deadline for the implementation of e-filing until January 1, 2018 and to allow permissive e-filing until that time; and

WHEREAS, in her petition to the Illinois Supreme Court, Clerk Brown stated that Tyler Technologies has been unable to integrate its e-filing software with currently existing proprietary software in place at the Court and there have been problems with the system’s ability to set dates for case management and with bulk filing; and

WHEREAS, in response, the Supreme Court gave the Circuit Court an extension of six months until June 30, 2018 to implement the e-filing system and included a number of benchmarks, standards and requirements to be met during the extension period; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Circuit Court Clerk of Cook County and representatives of On-Line Information Services, Tyler Technologies and PriceWaterhouseCooper appear before the Legislative and Intergovernmental Relations Committee of the Cook County Board of Commissioner to review the implementation of e-filing in the Circuit Court of Cook County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Cook County be prepared to explain the confusion set forth by the office by initialing indicating that the office would meet the January 1, 2018 deadline for e-filing, only to file for an extension approximately three weeks later.

WHEREAS, the municipality states the Class 6b is necessary for development to occur on this specific real estate. The municipal Resolution cites the qualifications of this property to meet the definition of abandoned with special circumstances; and

WHEREAS, industrial real estate is normally assessed at 25% of its market value, qualifying industrial real estate eligible for the Class 6b can receive a significant reduction in the level of assessment from the date that new construction or rehabilitation has been completed, or in the case of abandoned property from the date of substantial re-occupancy. (b) *Quarterly Inventory of Civil Actions.* The State’s Attorney shall give a quarterly inventory report to the Litigation Subcommittee of the Finance Committee of the Cook County Board of Commissioners of all civil actions that Cook County is named as a party in all courts of State or Federal jurisdiction.

(a) Public facing Rules and Regulations issued to implement ordinances and resolutions enacted by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, as defined in Sec. 1-3 of Chapter 1 of this Code and issued by County departments, agencies and offices in accordance with this Code shall be transmitted to the Chair of the Cook County Rules Committee and posted on the County department, agency or offices web page at www.cookcountyl.gov at least ~~County Clerk~~ 10 days ~~30 days~~ prior to taking effect, with the exception of emergency Rules and Regulations which shall be transmitted to the Chair of the Cook County Rules Committee ~~Clerk~~ and posted on the applicable department, agency or office web page at the time of issuance. Public facing Rules and Regulations issued by County departments, agencies and offices in accordance with this Code shall be placed on the County Board Agenda by the issuing department, agency or office and referred to the Rules Committee where said Rules and Regulations will be received and filed, unless the Rules Committee has suggested modifications. Should the Rules Committee have suggested modifications, the Rules Committee shall confer with the issuing department, agency or office prior to making any suggested amendments. County departments, agencies and offices will be charged with maintaining a hard copy of its respective Rules and Regulations for public review and shall place a copy of said Rules and Regulations and any amended Rules and Regulations on their respective web page at www.cookcountyl.gov. Regulations shall be maintained by the Clerk and by the issuing department.

(b) The requirements provided in Sec. 1-9 (a) shall not apply to:

- (1) Rules or Regulations that concern only the internal management of a department, agency, office, process, procedure or function and do not affect the private rights or procedures available to the public;
- (2) employee matters/employee personnel rules;
- (3) informal advisory rulings;
- (4) intra-agency memoranda;
- (5) enforcement notices and orders;
- (6) quasi-judicial proceedings; or

(7) the prescription of standardized forms.

(c) A failure to comply in whole or in part with the requirements of Sec. 1-9(a) shall not be grounds for a challenge to a Rule or Regulation’s validity by a person governed by such Rule or Regulation.

(c) Existing incentives classifications, pending applications and eligibility/renewal applications submitted during the 2017 and 2018 assessment year shall not be suspended, revoked or terminated for failure to comply with the affidavit requirements of Sections 74-71(b)(2), 74-72 and 74-74(b) and (d), and all affidavits submitted pursuant to such Sections shall be considered void for any purpose.

INSPECTOR GENERAL

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2 Administration, Article IV Officers and Employees, Division 5 Inspector General, Section 2-285 and Section 2-287 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 2-285. Cooperation.

(a) It shall be the duty of all County employees, officials, agents, contractors, subcontractors, licensees, grantees or persons or businesses seeking County contracts, grants, licenses, or certification of eligibility for County contracts, to cooperate with the OIIG in the conduct of investigations undertaken pursuant to this division. Every County contract and every bid, proposal, application or solicitation for a County contract and every application for certification of eligibility for a County contract or program shall contain a statement that the person, individually and on behalf of the applicant, will abide by all provisions of this division. It shall be unlawful for any person subject to this Section to refuse to cooperate with the Independent Inspector General as required by this Section. The penalty for such violation shall be governed by Section 2-291.

(b) All persons with whom the OIIG requests an interview are required to comply in a timely fashion. Within constitutional limitations, failure by any County employee, official, agent, contractor, subcontractor, licensee, grantee or person or business seeking County contracts, grants, licenses, or certification of eligibility for County contracts, to cooperate with any reasonable request by the OIIG carries the threat of sanctions and/or criminal contempt proceedings, and any other penalties the County Board has within its scope to assess.

(c) Nothing in this compliance section may be interpreted to allow the OIIG to violate any individual's constitutional rights, including the 5th Amendment right against self-incrimination.

(d) It is the duty of every employee, department and elected official to cooperate with the Independent Inspector General in any investigation or hearing. Each department's premises, equipment, personnel, books, records and papers shall be made readily available to the Independent Inspector General.

(e) If the Independent Inspector General issues a recommendation of corrective action to the head of a County department or bureau, that department or bureau head must respond to that recommendation within ~~30~~ 45 days with a written response to the Independent Inspector General and Chief of the Bureau of Human Resources. This response must include either (1) a description of any corrective action the department or bureau head has taken or (2) a request for a 30-day extension of the ~~30~~ 45 day decision period if additional time is needed by the department or bureau head to review the recommendation of corrective action. If the head of that department or bureau did not take any corrective action, or took a different corrective action than that recommended by the Independent Inspector General, the department or bureau head must describe the different action and explain the reasons for the different action in the written response. This response must be submitted to the Independent Inspector General and Chief of the Bureau of Human Resources within the 30-day decision period. The Independent Inspector General may approve a request for an extension of this ~~30~~ 45-day decision period for a period of time not to exceed 30 days if additional time is needed by the head of the department or bureau to review the recommendation of corrective action. If a department head, bureau chief, or separately elected official fails to meet the 45-day requirement or, if approved, the 30-day extension the Independent Inspector General shall notify the Chair of the Litigation Sub-Committee and the President when there is a failure to reply. The chair of the Litigation Sub-Committee may then call the department head, bureau chief, or representative of the separately elected official to appear before the Litigation Sub-Committee to explain the lack of response.

(f) It shall be the duty of all County employees, officials, agents, contractors, subcontractors, licensees, grantees or persons or businesses seeking County contracts, grants, licenses, or certification of eligibility for County contracts to report, directly and without undue delay, to the Independent Inspector General any and all information concerning conduct which they know to involve corruption, allegations of political discrimination in nonexempt positions or other criminal activity, by another County employee or official, which concerns his or her office of employment or County related transaction. The knowing failure of any employee to report as required above shall constitute cause for discipline up to and including termination. For purposes of this Section, a report made to the Inspector General Hotline shall be considered a direct report.

Sec. 2-287. - Quarterly reports.

No later than the 15th day of January, April, July and October of each year, the Independent Inspector General shall submit to the President and the County Board a publicly available report, accurate as of the last day of the preceding month, indicating:

- (1) The number and type of investigations initiated, concluded, or pending since the date of the last report.
- (2) The number and type of investigations of the conduct (corruption, fraud, waste, mismanagement, unlawful political discrimination or misconduct) of any County

employee, appointed officials, elected officials, contractors, subcontractors, persons seeking County contracts, or persons seeking certification of eligibility for County contracts or other County programs.

- (3) The number of and types of investigations conducted by the OIIG regarding employees under the separately elected officials.
- (4) The number and type of recommendations made to any department heads or elected official and whether or not the recommendation was followed or if the
- (5) The number of concluded investigations that have not yet been responded to within the 45-day requirement or, if approved, the 30-day extension,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 10 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act (20 ILCS 3305/10, Cook County Ordinance created the Cook County Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHSEM) to coordinate the efforts of the County to develop, plan, analyze, conduct, provide, implement and maintain programs for disaster mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery within the

County and with private organizations, other political subdivisions, the State and federal governments, established; and

WHEREAS, DHSEM is tasked, among other things, with the preparation of an emergency operations plan in the event of an emergency, such as inclement weather, domestic terrorism, or hazardous contaminations; and

WHEREAS, numerous security threats and disasters, both natural and man-made, have frequently occurred throughout the last year in the United States, and internationally, causing for an increased security awareness and the need to be adequately prepared to respond to such threats and disasters; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners hereby requests that an executive session of the Homeland Security and Emergency Management Committee be convened to discuss security protocols and procedures, preventative measures, and available county resources in the event of an emergency situation in Cook County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cook County Board of Commissioners does hereby request that a meeting of the Homeland Security and Emergency Management Committee be convened to discuss Cook County’s preparation and action plan with respect to said security procedures; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Executive Director of the Homeland Security and Emergency Management appear before the Homeland Security and Emergency Management Committee and be prepared to update the Committee on the Cook County’s preparation and action plan with respect to said security procedures.

CALLING FOR COOK COUNTY PUBLIC SAFETY STAKEHOLDERS

TO WORK TOGETHER ON A COURT UTILIZATION STUDY

WHEREAS, based on Clerk of the Circuit Court for Cook County data for 2016 and 2017, there has been a 47.8% decline in new court cases over the last 10 years across all case types. More specifically, there has been a 35.4% decline in civil cases, a 56.8% decline in criminal cases, and a 49.5% decline in traffic cases; and

WHEREAS, this continued decline in case volume suggests that the Circuit Court of Cook County's 333 courtrooms, originally built to handle the large case volume of the 1970s and 1980s, may currently have excess capacity; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County Circuit Court Branch Court locations are in some of the poorest physical conditions of any Cook County court houses, needing \$25.3 million in repairs over the next 10 years; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County Criminal Justice Stakeholders are working continuously and cooperatively to safely reduce the financial burden of operating the criminal justice system upon Cook County taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, effective reforms may be instituted only with the support of comprehensive data, accessible to and acceptable to all of the stakeholders; and

WHEREAS, in light of the need for functional and safe courthouses for the efficient operations of the Cook County Circuit Court System as well the aging facilities, there is a need to determine what resources will be needed in the future and what alternatives are available to secure those resources; and

WHEREAS, a courtroom utilization study should be performed so that the use of the Cook County Circuit Court courtrooms (including Branch Courts and District Court Houses) may be maximized, with court calls correctly sized and scheduled based on a complete understanding of when, for how long and in what ways, courtrooms are used; and

WHEREAS, such a study should be obtained from an appropriate vendor, capable of providing a brief but comprehensive report outlining the best practices and recent trends. The scope of the study should include but not be limited to:

- A review of the existing documents and reports prepared by the Bureau of Asset Management including but not limited to space utilization plans and Facilities Building Assessment reports;
- A review of the needs for the judicial system and its' associated spaces;
- A review of the organizational needs for each of the public safety offices;
- Proposed solutions for reallocation & reorganization; and
- Probable cost(s) for the work proposed.

WHEREAS, the commissioned study shall also at a minimum include a break downs of the following:

- Number of cases heard;
- Types of cases heard;
- Length (time) of each hearing(s); and

- Location of hearing.

WHEREAS, the selected vendor, in coordination with the Bureau of Asset Management, will work with Department of Budget and Management Services, Sheriff’s Office, and Office of the Chief Judge to establish a formal process and reporting mechanism to ensure that all stakeholders understand roles and responsibilities as well as project deliverables, budgets and schedules for the Project Team; and

WHEREAS, in partnership with the Bureau of Asset Management and Department of Budget and Management Services, all the public safety offices including the Office of the Chief Judge, Sheriff’s Office, Public Defender’s Office, State’s Attorney’s Office, Clerk of the Circuit Court’s Office and the Justice Advisory Council shall participate in the planning process and provide any and all necessary data and evidence needed for the study, excluding any data and evidence limited by law; and

WHEREAS, time is of the essence and to the extent possible the project should be completed as quickly as possible but no later than May, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the courtroom utilization study will provide valuable guidance for further consideration of the investment of general revenue in the operation as well as repair and rehabilitation of courtrooms used by the criminal justice stakeholders and the buildings in which such courtrooms are located.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners that the public safety stakeholders work collaboratively with an external vendor managed by the Bureau of Asset Management on a Court Utilization Study and that they be prepared to brief the Board on their progress and final results of the study.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDMENT**AN AMENDMENT TO THE ORDINANCE LIMITING CONTRIBUTIONS TO CANDIDATES AND ELECTED OFFICIALS**

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2 - Administration, Article VII - Ethics, Division 2 - Code of Ethical Conduct, Section 2-585 - Limitations of contributions to candidates and elected officials of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as Follows:

Sec. 2-585. - Limitations of contributions to candidates and elected officials.

(a) No person shall make contributions exceeding the limits established by the Election Code, 10 ILCS 5/9-1 et seq., when making contributions to any of the following elected officials or candidates for such office: County Board President; Cook County Commissioner; Cook County State's Attorney; Cook County Clerk of the Circuit Court; Cook County Assessor; Cook County Treasurer; Cook County Board of Review Commissioner; Cook County Sheriff, Cook County Clerk; and Cook County Recorder of Deeds except as otherwise provided in Section 2-585.

(b) No person who does business with the County or who has done business with the County within the preceding four years; or is seeking to do business with the County; or is a person required to register as a lobbyist with the County; or who has sought official action by the County within the preceding four years, or is an officer, director or partner of a firm, contracted by the County to act as financial counsel, bond counsel, underwriter's counsel, legal counsel, or financial manager for the issuance of any bond and directly working on said bond transaction; or firm, officers, directors or partners, contracted by the County to provide financial audits of County finances and directly working on said contract shall make contributions in an aggregate amount exceeding \$750.00:

- (1) To any candidate for County office or elected County official during a single candidacy; or
- (2) To any elected official of the government of the County during any nonelection year of his or her term.
- (3) To any local, state, or federal political committee that is established in support of, a specific candidate for County office or an elected County official. The combined effect of these provisions is intended to permit total contribution up to, but not exceeding, \$1,500.00 in a year in which a candidacy occurs. A year, for purposes of this Section, is from January 1 to December 31 of each year.

(c) For purposes of Subsection (b) of this Section, an entity and its subsidiaries, parent company or otherwise affiliated companies (including a separate segregated fund of an entity, as that term is described in 52 U.S.C. § 30118(b)), shall be considered a single person. The political contributions of an entity's employees, officers, directors, and/or partners for which they are reimbursed by the entity or its affiliates shall also be considered those of a single person. However, nothing in this provision shall be construed to prohibit such an employee, officer, director or partner from making a political contribution for which he is not reimbursed by a person with whom he or she is affiliated.

(d) Effective October 2, 2013, no Board or commission appointee of a County official whose board or commission appointment provides for compensation and requires confirmation by the Cook County Board of Commissioners shall make contributions in an aggregate amount exceeding \$750.00:

- (1) To the appointing County official or the Members of the Cook County Board of Commissioners during a single candidacy; or
- (2) To the appointing County official or the Members of the Cook County Board of Commissioners during any nonelection year of his or her term.

The combined effect of these provisions is intended to permit total contribution up to, but not exceeding, \$1,500.00 in a year in which a candidacy occurs. A year, for purposes of this Section, is from January 1 to December 31 of each year.

(e) Any contributions made under this Section shall be reported as required by the Election Code, 10 ILCS 5/1-1 et seq.

(f) Any candidate for any County office or any current elected official in Cook County government shall return contributions found in excess of the limitations set forth in this Section within 30 days of notification from the Board of Ethics. Failure to return contributions within 30 days shall be a violation of this Section and subject to fines under Section 2-602.

(g) Ethics shall be transparent and apparent to the public.

Effective date: This ordinance shall be in effect immediately upon adoption.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

ILLINOIS BLIND VENDORS ACT

WHEREAS, The Illinois Business Enterprise Program for the Blind with the guidance and federally mandated oversight of the Illinois Committee of Blind Vendors is created for the purposes of providing blind persons with remunerative employment, enlarging the economic opportunities of the blind, and stimulating the blind to greater efforts in striving to make themselves self-supporting. In order to achieve these goals, blind persons licensed under this Act shall be authorized to operate vending facilities on any property within Cook County as provided by this Ordinance, and

WHEREAS, According to the U.S. Department of Labor blind persons suffer 70% rate of unemployment, and

WHEREAS, The United States Congress enacted the Randolph-Sheppard Act in 1937 giving blind persons the right to employment on Federal property through the Act, and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Legislature enacted “The Blind Vendors’ Act” on January 1, 2010 affirming and expanding the rights of blind persons licensed under the Randolph-Sheppard Act the right to operate vending facilities on state property, and

WHEREAS, The mission of the Illinois Committee of Blind Vendors is “To provide the highest level of self-employment opportunities to blind men and women while employing people of all disabilities, and

WHEREAS, President Barack Obama on January 20, 2012 declared his full support of the Randolph-Sheppard act by requiring full federal compliance with the Randolph-Sheppard Vending Facility Program, and

WHEREAS, Cook County currently partners with 11 blind operators and had done so successfully for the past 40 years, and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Committee of Blind Vendors and its blind managers on Cook County property have partnered with PepsiCo for a 10-year exclusive commission structure benefitting Cook County revenues, and

WHEREAS, Partnering with blind managers secures excellent service, equipment, oversight and future partnering opportunities for the County with the backing and support of the Illinois Committee of Blind Vendors and the Illinois Business Enterprise Program for the Blind that benefit Cook County, and

WHEREAS, Overall revenue and earnings for Cook County Blind Vendors have dramatically decreased in recent years causing once good jobs to be lost, and

WHEREAS, Large multi-national vending and foodservice companies have overwhelmingly benefited from County contracts, and

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2 - Administration, Article V, Departments and Similar Agencies, Division 2, Real Estate Management Division, Section 2-363-365 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as Follows:

Sec. 263. Illinois Blind Vendors Act Definitions

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this division, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Business Enterprise Program for the Blind (BEPB) means a state agency in the Department of Human Services that administrates the Blind Vending Program in Illinois.

Blind Vendor means a blind person licensed by the Business Enterprose Program for the Blind to operate a vending facility on State, federal, or other property. "Blind person" means a person whose central visual acuity does not exceed 20/200 in the better eye with correcting lenses or whose visual acuity, if better than 20/200, is accompanied by a limit to the field of vision in the better eye to such a degree that its widest diameter subtends an angle of no greater than 20 degrees. In determining whether an individual is blind, there shall be an examination by a physician skilled in diseases of the eye, or by an optometrist, whichever the individual shall select.

Blind Vendor Trust Fund means a regulated account owned by the Illinois Committee of Blind Vendors for the benefit of Blind Vendors.

Building means only the portion of a structure owned or leased by the County or any County Department.

Cafeteria means a food dispensing facility capable of providing a broad variety of prepared foods and beverages (including hot meals) primarily through the use of a line where the customer serves himself or herself from displayed selections. A cafeteria may be fully automatic or some limited waiter or waitress service may be available and provided within a cafeteria and table or booth seating facilities are always provided.

Committee means the Illinois Committee of Blind Vendors, an independent representative body for blind vendors established by the federal Randolph-Sheppard Act.

Commission means commission income paid directly to the blind vendor, the Illinois Committee of Blind Vendors or the Business Enterprise Program for the Blind.

County means Cook County.

County Department means any department, board or agency created by Cook County.

County property means all property owned, leased, or rented by any Cook County department, agency, board or instrumentality.

Department means Cook County Department.

Federal property means any structure, land, or other real property owned, leased, or occupied by any department, agency or instrumentality of the United States (including the Department of Defense and the U.S. Postal Service), or any other instrumentality wholly owned by the United States, or by any department or agency of the District of Columbia or any territory or possession of the United States.

Illinois Committee of Blind Vendors means a federally mandated oversight committee for the Illinois Blind Vending Facility Program (ICBV). ICBV is a 501c3 non for profit.

License means a written instrument issued by the Department to a blind person, authorizing such person to operate a vending facility on State, federal, or other property.

Normal working hours means an 8-hour work period between the approximate hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Priority means the right of a blind person licensed by the Department of Human Services, Division of Rehabilitation Services, to operate a vending facility on any and all County property leased or owned, in the same manner and to the same extent as the priority is provided to blind licensees on federal property under the Randolph-Sheppard Act, 20 U.S.C. 107, and federal regulations, 34 C.F.R. 395.30.

Vending facility means automatic vending machines, snack bars, cart service, counters, office coffee service, micromarket and such other appropriate auxiliary equipment that may be operated by blind vendors and that is necessary for the sale of newspapers, periodicals, confections, tobacco products, foods, beverages, and notions dispensed automatically or manually and prepared on or off the premises in

accordance with all applicable health laws, and including the vending and payment of any lottery tickets or shares authorized by State law and conducted by a State agency within the State. "Vending facility" does not include large cafeterias.

Vending Machine for the purpose of assigning vending machine income under this Act, means a coin, currency, or debit card operated machine that dispenses articles or services.

Vending machine income means the commissions or fees paid to the ICBV from vending machine operations on County property where the machines are operated, serviced, or maintained by, or with the approval of, a County Department by a commercial or not-for-profit vending concern other than Licensed Blind Vendors that operates, services, and maintains vending machines, micromarkets, office coffee service or other non-cafeteria foodservice concern.

Vendor means a blind licensee who is operating a vending facility on State, federal, or other property.

Sec. 2-364. Purpose.

(a) The Randolph-Sheppard Act, 20 U.S.C. Sections 107-107f shall serve as a model for minimum standards for the operation of the Business Enterprise Program for the Blind. The federal Randolph-Sheppard Act provides employment opportunities for individuals who are blind or visually impaired through the Business Enterprise Program for the Blind. Under the Randolph-Sheppard Act, all federal agencies are required to give priority to licensed blind vendors in the operation of vending facilities on federal property. It is the intent of this Cook County Ordinance to provide the same priority to licensed blind vendors on County property by requiring County Departments to give priority to licensed blind vendors in the operation of vending facilities on County property and preference to licensed blind vendors in the operation of cafeteria facilities on State property, as such the County shall:

- (1) Establish, continue, maintain, and promote the opportunities for vending facilities in conjunction with Business Enterprise Program for the Blind on all property owned or leased by the County.
- (2) Provide documents detailing all current vending, office coffee, micromarket and foodservice contracts including contracting company, location, type of service, commission structure, overall sales and expiration date.
- (3) Facilitate transitions from outside companies to the Blind Vendor and the Business Enterprise Program on County property.
- (4) Monitor vending machine income payments from outside contractors to Blind Managers or the Business Enterprise Program for the Blind.
- (5) Assure that priority is given to blind vendors in the operation of vending, micromarket, Office Coffee Service (OCS) and lottery operations on county property owned or leased
- (6) Bid preference is given the Blind Vendors in the operation of cafeterias operated with the County property. If a tie is rendered by the County's bid process than the counteract goes to the Blind Vendors. The Blind Vendors may partner with contractors in the County Bid Process.

- (7) No County Department may impose any commission, service charge, rent or utility charge on a licensed Blind Vendor who operates a vending facility on Cook County property.
- (8) The County shall actively pursue all commissions from vending facilities not operated by blind vendors as provided in this Ordinance, and shall propose new placements of vending facilities on County property where a facility is not yet in place.
- (9) A commission rate equal to commission currently paid to the County or of 20% on Net Sales (whatever is greater) shall be paid by outside vending micro-market or Office Coffee Services contractors to the Illinois Committee of Blind Vendors for use by the ICBV to benefit blind vendors through the existing Blind Vendor Trust Fund.
- (10) Partnerships and teaming arrangements between blind vendors and private industry, including franchise operations, shall be allowed and encouraged by the County.

Sec. 2-365 Satisfactory Vending Facility Sites

(a) Beginning March 1, 2018, all County real estate agreements shall: With the BEPB jointly undertake to determine whether a current or future building constructed, altered, renovated or currently occupied by the County constitutes a suitable, satisfactory site for a Vending Facility. Any current Vending Facility site not operated by Blind Vendors shall be considered a suitable site for a Blind Vendor.

(b) Upon receiving a request for a determination of satisfactory site, the BEPB and the Committee shall have 20 days in which to notify that requesting County agency as to whether the new property or building is satisfactory or not satisfactory for the operation of a blind vendor vending facility. A site shall be deemed to be a satisfactory site by examining the potential customer base, including, but not limited to, County employees, County contractual employees, and the general public. The determination shall be based upon a site survey or any other reasonable means enabling an accurate assessment of the location. If the property has an existing private vendor, bottler, or vending machine operator, then the property shall be presumed to be a satisfactory site. If the BEPB, in consultation with the Committee, determines that the number of people using the location is or will be insufficient to support a vending facility, then the BEPB shall determine the property to be not satisfactory. Upon a determination by the BEPB and the Committee that the new property or building is satisfactory for the operation of a blind vendor vending facility, the the Director of County Real Estate shall inform the County Department to comply with the priority established for the operation of vending facilities by blind persons under this Ordinance. All County departments shall fully cooperate with the BEPB to ensure that priority is given to blind vendors in the operation of vending facilities on County property. This includes notifying the Department prior to the expiration of existing contracts or agreements for vending facilities or when such contracts or agreements are considered for renewal options. The notification must be given no later than 6 months prior to the potential expiration or renewal of the existing vending facility contract or agreement.

Effective date: This ordinance shall be in effect March 1, 2018.

Sec. 18-4. Quarterly Reporting.

(a) The offices of the Chief Judge and Clerk of the Circuit Court shall report to the Board of Commissioners quarterly on the cost their offices incur due to processing court cases involving firearms.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2 Administration, Article IV Officers and Employees, Division 9 State’s Attorney, Section 2-338 is hereby amended as Follows:

Sec. 2-338. Quarterly Reporting

(a) The State’s Attorney shall report to the Board of Commissioners quarterly on the cost that the office incurs due to processing court cases involving firearms.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 38 Health and Human Services, Article VI Medical Examiner, Division 1 Generally, Section 38-157 is hereby amended as Follows:

Sec. 38-157. Quarterly Reporting

(a) The Medical Examiner shall report to the Board of Commissioners quarterly on the cost that the office incurs due to performing autopsies on cases involving firearms.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 38 Health and Human Services, Article V Cook County Health and Hospitals System, Section 34-94 is hereby amended as Follows:

(a) The Health and Hospitals System shall report to the Board of Commissioners quarterly on the cost it incurs due to processing medical cases involving firearms.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 46 Law Enforcement, Article II Sheriff, Division 1 Generally, Section 46-40 is hereby amended as Follows:

(a) The Sheriff’s Office shall report to the Board of Commissioners quarterly on the cost that the office incurs to investigating and processing cases involving firearms.

Effective date: This ordinance shall be in effect March 1, 2018.

A motion was made by Commissioner Boykin, seconded by Commissioner Moore, that the Ordinance be referred to the Criminal Justice Committee. The motion carried.
