

Introduction

In accordance with Section 2-671 of the Cook County Vehicle Ordinance, the Vehicle Steering Committee presents the FY2025 Annual Vehicle Collision Report. This report summarizes collisions reviewed by the following Collision Review Boards across county agencies:

- **Offices Under the President (OUP)**
- **State’s Attorney Office (SAO)**
- **Department of Transportation and Highways (DoTH)**
- **Office of the Sheriff (CCSO)**

271 collisions were reviewed that occurred while operators were driving County-owned vehicles.

Agency Summaries

Offices Under the President (OUP)

From December 2024 to November 2025, the OUP Collision Review Board reviewed 14 incidents involving county vehicles.

The incidents range from minor scrapes with stationary objects to multi-vehicle collisions and hit-and-run events.

No incidents resulted in employee discipline, and all internal procedures were consistently followed.



Department of Transportation and Highways (DoTH)

Between December 2024 and November 2025, a total of 24 reported incidents involving DoTH county vehicles were reported to the DoTH Collision Review Board. The incidents range from minor collision with a parked vehicle to multi-vehicle collisions and hit-and-run events.

Six incidents resulted in employee discipline, and all internal procedures were consistently followed.



State's Attorney Office (SAO)

Between December 2024 and November 2025, a total of 20 reported incidents involving SAO county vehicles were reported to the SAO Collision Review Board. The incidents range from minor scrapes with stationary objects to multi-vehicle collisions and hit-and-run events.

One incident resulted in employee discipline, and all internal procedures were consistently followed.



Office of the Sheriff (CCSO)

Between December 2024 and November 2025, a total of 213 reported incidents involving CCSO county vehicles were reported to the CCSO Collision Review Board. The incidents range from minor scrapes with stationary objects to multi-vehicle collisions and hit-and-run events.

63 incidents resulted in employee discipline, 18 incidents resulted in personal injury and all internal procedures were consistently followed.
