PROPOSED ORDINANCE

PROHIBITIONS ON SALE OF FIREARM TO, AND PURCHASE OF FIREARM BY, A PERSON NOT COVERED BY APPROPRIATE LIABILITY INSURANCE

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners that Chapter 54- Licenses, Permits and Miscellaneous Business Regulations, Article III.- Deadly Weapons Dealers, Division 3.- Firearm Transfer Vigilance Procedures and Firearm Safety, Prohibitions on Sale of Firearm to, and Purchase of Firearm by, a Person not Covered by Appropriate Liability Insurance, Section 54-186 be enacted as follows:

Sec. 54-186. Prohibitions on sale of firearm to, and purchase of firearm by, a person not covered by appropriate liability insurance.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for a person to purchase a firearm in Cook County unless, at the time of the purchase, the purchaser presents to the seller proof that the purchaser is covered by a qualified liability insurance policy.
- (b) It shall be unlawful for a person to sell a firearm in Cook County unless, at the time of the sale, the seller verifies that the purchaser is covered by a qualified liability insurance policy.
- (c) It shall be unlawful for a person who owns a firearm in Cook County purchased on or after the effective date of this ordinance not to be covered by a qualified liability insurance policy.

(d) Exemptions.

(1) The foregoing paragraphs shall not apply to the purchase or sale of a firearm for the use of municipal, county, state or federal law enforcement.

(e) Definitions.

In paragraphs (a) through (c), the term 'qualified liability insurance policy' means, with respect to the purchaser of a firearm, a policy that:

- (1) Provides liability insurance covering the purchaser specifically for losses resulting from use of the firearm while it is owned by the purchaser; and
- (2) Is issued by an insurer licensed or authorized to provide the coverage by the Illinois Department of Insurance.
- (f) Any purchaser or seller found in violation of this section shall be fined not less than \$2,500.00 and not more than \$5,000.00.

Effective date: This ordinance shall be in effect after a period of six months beginning with the date of this section's enactment.

PROPOSED RESOLUTION

CALLING ON THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE TO EXPAND ITS PATTERNS AND PRACTICES INVESTIGATION OF THE CHICAGO POLICE DEPARTMENT TO INCLUDE THE CHICAGO POLICE DETENTION FACILITY KNOWN AS HOMAN SQUARE

WHEREAS, Cook County is responsible for the administration of the Cook County Circuit Court, the Cook County Jail, and, as a unit of government, bears a share of responsibility for protecting the health, welfare and safety of the general public; and,

WHEREAS, the action undertaken by the City of Chicago this past November to make public the dashboard camera video depicting the police shooting of Laquan McDonald, and the subsequent public outcry has resulted in the United States Department of Justice moving swiftly to initiate a "patterns and practices" investigation into the Chicago Police Department; and,

WHEREAS, stakeholders throughout Chicagoland, including Mayor Rahm Emanuel, have stated that the current Justice Department investigation provides a clear opportunity to comprehensively reform police-community relations; and,

WHEREAS, in the interests of comprehensive reform of police-community relations, the aforementioned Justice Department investigation should be as wide-ranging as possible; and,

WHEREAS, throughout 2015, and into 2016, questions have arisen in the community, and in the local, national and international media, around the Chicago Police Department detention facility known as Homan Square; and,

WHEREAS, the tactics and practices allegedly employed by special units of the Chicago Police Department at Homan Square include failing to enter arrestees into official police databases; physical abuse of detainees, resulting in serious injury and abuse to detainees; prolonged, uninterrupted shackling of detainees; denial of attorney access to detainees; and, holding detainees for up to 24 hours without access to a lawyer; and,

WHEREAS, the alleged tactics and practices at Homan Square, if true, pose serious concerns with respect to the human rights of Cook County residents who live within the vicinity of the facility; and,

WHEREAS, allegations of torture, denial of counsel and off-the-books detentions raise serious questions of human and constitutional rights violations; and,

WHEREAS, such questions are squarely within the purview of the United States Department of Justice and its Civil Rights Division; and,

WHEREAS, any federal investigation of the Chicago Police Department that does not include Homan Square will be incomplete and woefully inadequate;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and the Board of Commissioners of Cook County that the United States Department of Justice is hereby requested to expand its current "patterns and practices" investigation to look into allegations of civil and human rights violations at the Chicago Police detention facility known as Homan Square; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent at the earliest opportunity to the Honorable Loretta E. Lynch, Attorney General of the United States.

PROPOSED RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS CALLING ON GOVERNOR BRUCE RAUNER TO REQUIRE THE APPOINTMENT OF A SPECIAL PROSECUTOR IN ALL CASES INVOLVING POLICE SHOOTINGS OF UNARMED CIVILIANS IN THE STATE OF ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, in the summer of 2015, Governor Andrew Cuomo of New York issued an executive order requiring the appointment of a Special Prosecutor for all cases involving police shootings of unarmed civilians, and in so doing, stated, "A criminal justice system doesn't work without trust"; and,

WHEREAS, in Chicago and Cook County, trust in law enforcement and the impartiality of the criminal justice system has been significantly eroded by a series of police shootings of unarmed civilians; and,

WHEREAS, it is a common practice of the Cook County State's Attorney, as codified in the Cook County Code of Ordinances, to work cooperatively with and rely upon the Chicago Police Department to investigate, gather evidence, and build cases against criminal defendants; and,

WHEREAS, in Cook County, Assistant State's Attorneys frequently rely upon police officers as witnesses at trial, and the success of many prosecutions by the Cook County State's Attorney hinges upon police officer testimony; and,

WHEREAS, the Cook County State's Attorney, as is the case with prosecutors throughout the State of Illinois, is dependent upon the cooperation of police officers in order to fulfill the basic functions of the office; and,

WHEREAS, the dependence of the Cook County State's Attorney's office upon the Chicago Police Department in order to conduct its basic functions raises legitimate and pervasive concerns about the ability of the State's Attorney to be objective when weighing the potential prosecution of a Chicago Police Officer; and,

WHEREAS, concerns about prosecutorial objectivity are especially problematic when it comes to cases involving police shootings of unarmed civilians; and,

WHEREAS, a critical step in restoring trust in Cook County's criminal justice system is to ensure prosecutorial objectivity in cases involving police shootings of unarmed civilians; and,

WHEREAS, the example provided by Governor Cuomo in the State of New York demonstrates that, while comprehensive reform of community-law enforcement relations will take time, there are simple steps that can be taken in the short term to restore public faith in Cook County's criminal justice system; and,

WHEREAS, one such simple step would be the issuance of an executive order by the Governor of Illinois to require a special prosecutor in all cases involving the shooting of unarmed civilians by police officers;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the President and the Board of Commissioners of Cook County hereby call upon Governor Bruce Rauner to require the appointment of a Special Prosecutor in all cases involving police shootings of unarmed civilians in the State of Illinois; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent by this body at the earliest opportunity to the Honorable Bruce Rauner, Governor of the State of Illinois.

Summary: On 7/17/2013, the Board of Commissioners approved a Lease Agreement ("Master Lease") with the Regional Transportation Authority ("RTA"), granting RTA the right to use and occupy certain premises located in the pedway of the George W. Dunne Cook County Administration Building located at 69 West Washington Street as a customer service and sales center by the RTA for its Reduced Fare Program. The term of the Master Lease expires on 8/31/2025, with an option to extend for an additional five-year term.

The RTA has requested permission to sublease all of the premises to the City of Chicago Board of Elections (CCBOE). The additional office space will allow the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners to provide its services to the taxpayers more efficiently.

The RTA will remain primarily liable for, and will not be released from, the full and faithful performance of all terms and conditions of the Master Lease, or any breach committed by Subtenant under the Sublease.
