# CCH Community Vaccination Program





### Community Vaccination Program Important Updates

#### Vaccine Administration

CCH has administered more than 700,000 doses of vaccine

#### CCH Mass Vaccination Sites

- Expanded hours Monday-Friday 8AM-8PM/ Saturday 8AM-6PM
  - Des Plaines, Forest Park, Matteson, South Suburban College (South Holland), Triton College (River Grove)
- Existing Hours Monday-Saturday 8:30AM-5:30PM
  - Tinley Park
- Open to walk-ins

### Supply & Demand

After several months of demand outpacing supply, we are seeing reduced demand



### Community Vaccination Program Important Updates

### Pfizer Emergency Use Authorization Expansion

- CCH expects to offer the Pfizer vaccine to those age 12+ after FDA and CDC approval
- FDA has approved Pfizer's request to expand the Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) to include adolescents age 12-15
- CCDPH is working with regional Offices of Education to plan for reaching children
  - working with their schools to provide opportunities for vaccination
- State of Illinois encouraging health care providers, including pediatricians, to encourage them to apply to be vaccine providers
  - children and families can be vaccinated at the office where they get their routine care
  - CCDPH will also reach out to those providers to support their vaccination efforts

#### Johnson & Johnson vaccine

- CHH paused use following guidance from the FDA & CDC on April 13
- After the FDA and CDC lifted the J&J pause CCH reinstated use of J&J and CCDPH is utilizing J&J in appropriate settings
  - Patients have choice of vaccine

- Site will continue to be updated with upcoming pop-up/mobile sites

- Mother's Day promotion at all sites
- Chicago Medical Society Partnership
  - Physicians to refer patients
- College Students Days
  - Encourage college students to get vaccine & not wait until fall at schools where it will be mandatory



## CCH Vaccine Strategy Points of Distribution (PODs)

CCH has developed a multi-pronged approach to vaccine administration to expand capacity, ensure an equitable distribution of vaccine in vulnerable communities and to help safely restore critical public services to the community.

CCH PODs	As indicated in the March 22 <sup>nd</sup> briefing, CCH is transitioning its community health centers to a pre-COVID state to ensure CCH patients are able to see their physicians in a timely fashion. Morton East is serving as both a targeted POD as well as a CCH POD. By appointment and/or walk-in depending on site.   - 1.5M unique registrants since January 25<sup>th</sup> launch
  - Last week, site averaged 9,000 hits each day from nearly 8,500 unique IP addresses

#### **Call Center Stats**

- 1-8**33-308-1988** 
  - Monday Friday 7:00AM 10:00PM
  - Saturday 8:00 AM 10:00 PM
- Over the past week
  - o 6,105 calls received averaging 1,018 calls per day
  - Outreach to 27,960 residents averaging 4,660 outbound calls per day
  - Average wait time 1:01
- Additional capacity continues to be added
- Call center has responded to more than 664,243 inquiries from January 25<sup>th</sup> to May 8<sup>th</sup>




COVID-19 Vaccinations by District in Suburban Cook County, IL



Percent of Population with at Least One Vaccine Dose




COVID-19 Vaccinations by Age in Suburban Cook County, IL




As of 5/6/21 more than 91% of adults 65+ have received at least one dose of vaccine.




# CCDPH Response Activities Data as of 4/30/21

- 150,000 Binax tests allocated 31,000+ inquiries from the public responded to Doses provided at 189 mobile clinics throughout SCC; 33 more scheduled 28,900+ Homebound vaccinations completed 774 food establishment and workplace complaints responded to 632 317 schools with cases/contacts provided with ongoing technical assistance & support order violation investigations completed 296
- 220+ congregate settings provided with ongoing technical assistance & support

# **Priority Communities** *Populations*

- Communities were prioritized based on having:
  - High CCVI score (≥ 0.6) among CCDPH jurisdictional municipalities
  - High SVI score (top 15 ZIP codes) among CCDPH jurisdictional municipalities
- In addition to the 32 prioritized communities chosen, CCDPH will also focus on low wage workers, and undocumented, non-English speaking, unhoused and disabled individuals throughout suburban Cook County

## **Priority Communities** *Vaccine Sites*

"Equity is our goal and we know in order to achieve this goal, we must bring the vaccine closer to people's homes, particularly when access to transportation might be a barrier." Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle.

- Strategically located to draw residents from the 32 Priority Communities
- Appointments and walk-ups
- Locations
  - Thornton Fractional High School South, Lansing, IL April 26 to June 5
    - serving Lansing, Burnham, Calumet City, Chicago Heights, Dolton, Harvey, South Chicago Heights, South Holland
  - Summit Recreation Center, Summit, IL April 13 to May 20
    - serving Summit, Bridgeview, Chicago Ridge, Hodgkins, Justice, McCook
  - West Leyden High School, Northlake April 30 to June 12
    - serving Northlake, Bellwood, Berkeley, Franklin Park, Harwood Heights, Maywood, Melrose Park, Norridge, Stone Park






# Priority Communities Partnership Opportunity for Community Based Organizations

- RFP issued and sent to over 50 CBOs focused on CCDPH identified 32 priority communities and equitable administration of vaccine
  - Must support:
    - Outreach and Education
      - decrease vaccine hesitancy, increase vaccine acceptance, and ultimately increase vaccine uptake
  - Can choose between:
    - Community Assisted Scheduling and Transportation
      - connect individuals to vaccine appointments and transportation as needed
    - Local Vaccine Events
      - host, promote vaccination clinics for community residents
  - Deadline to respond May 11, 2021





## Worker Protection Program Updates Worker Centers' Activities



- All 6 worker centers conducted worker trainings
- 22 total worker trainings all held virtually
- 1,071 worker attendees across all trainings
- In addition to training attendees 25,107 individuals reached through other view, media engagement and recorded trainings
- 7 target populations reached





## **Worker Protection Program Updates Successes**

### Community Outreach + Education

- Community Navigators distributed information in front of many workplaces
  - Noticed a great response when talking to workers and individuals about the protocols and guidelines around COVID-19 protections
- Adapted to using safe, socially distanced strategies to reach workers (virtual workshops, town halls, community flyers, etc.)
- Recruited more Community Navigators to support this work

#### Virtual events

- Established a virtual communication line
- Captive audiences
- Building trust and stronger relationships with workers and community



# Worker Protection Program Updates On Site Workplace Vaccination

### Collaboration with Workers Centers, worker advocates

- Part of mobile initiative
  - onsite vaccinations serving vulnerable populations that lack access to the COVID-19 vaccine
- Identify employers with low wage, essential workers
- Reach out to them to offer/encourage on site vaccination
- Approximately 30 workplaces have hosted vaccine clinics more in progress



### Mitigation Order 2021-7 / April 30, 2021

- Aligned with the City of Chicago and Stickney Township
  - Indoor restaurant capacity
    - lesser of 50 % capacity or 100 individuals.
  - Festivals & general admission outdoor spectator events
    - increase to 15 people per 1,000 square feet.
  - Outdoor social events
    - lesser of 50% capacity or 100 people.
  - Indoor & outdoor ticketed and seated spectator events, theater and performing arts
    - capacity of 200 or more capacity of 25 percent
  - Fully-vaccinated guests at private social events (e.g. weddings) do not count towards COVID-19 capacity limits.



# Mitigation Bridge to Phase 5

- Governor Pritzker announced Illinois will move to Bridge Phase on May 14.
  - New phase added to Restore Illinois reopening plan which slows the return to a fully-open state.
- CCDPH anticipates moving to a Bridge Phase this week as well.
  - Plans to continue to align with the city of Chicago in a slightly more gradual approach
    - Provides one set of guidelines for the region
  - Allows CCDPH to continue to take steps toward reopening while also monitoring our positivity rate and availability of ICU beds
    - Indicators in suburban jurisdiction that lag behind improvements in much of the state



# CCDPH Contact Tracing Initiative





## **CCDPH Contact Tracing Initiative Update**

#### Staffing

- The Contact Tracing Initiative (CTI) includes 187 contact tracers and 63 case investigators
- CTI includes more than 50 bilingual staff speaking eight different languages

#### COVID-19 Positive Case Outreach Metrics (April 2021)

- 16,067 cases
  - Outreach to 14,758 or 91.9%
  - Interviewed 10,256 or 64%

#### Close Contact Outreach (April 2021)

- 8,270 actionable close contacts
  - Outreach to 7,640 or 92%
  - Interviewed 6,241 or 75.4%

#### Resource Coordination

- 450 total cases referred to Care Coordination team in March
  - 20.9% requested food resources; 19% household items and cleaning supplies; 17% income assistance
