#### Important Updates – School Mask Mandate Temporary Restraining Order

- Late last week, a downstate judge instituted a temporary restraining order (TRO) against the governor's order for mandatory masking for plaintiff students in several school districts around the state, including 21 in suburban Cook County and in Chicago.
- This ruling -- which applies only to the individuals in the complaint, not other students or employees in their school districts -- did not limit IDPH or local health departments from issuing orders within their jurisdiction.
- Guidance from IDPH will be forthcoming and we will share that as it becomes available.
- We are reviewing the TRO and potential options for suburban Cook County's mitigation efforts.

#### Important Updates – Mass Vaccination Sites to Sunset

 We encourage people to get their COVID-19 vaccine at one of Cook County Health's three largescale community vaccination sites before they close.

o Forest Park 7630 W. Roosevelt Road, Forest Park, IL

Matteson 4647 Promenade Way, Matteson, IL

- The sites' last day of operation will be Sunday, February 13, 2022.
- This marks the conclusion of the sites' planned three-week run.
- Appointments can be made at <u>vaccine.cookcountyil.gov</u> Walk-ins are also welcome.
- Vaccines will continue to be provided at Cook County Health hospitals and health centers.

#### Important Updates – Gift Card & Mask Giveaway

- Beginning on Wednesday, February 9 through Sunday, February 13, any person who gets a COVID-19 vaccine at a Cook County Health site will receive a \$100 Visa gift card, while supplies last.
- Cook County Health is committed to making getting vaccinated as simple as possible. It is not always easy for people to take time off work or find childcare in order to get vaccinated, or to lose a day of work if they experience side effects. Gift cards are being offered in part to reduce these barriers.
- This promotion is open to any person age 5+ who receives a first, second or booster shot. There is no limit to the number of gift cards a single household can receive.
- Appointments can be made at <u>vaccine.cookcountyil.gov</u> and walk-ins are also welcome.
- Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson vaccines are offered at all sites. Individuals getting a second or booster shot must be within their window to receive a subsequent dose.
- CCH sites are also offering free KN95 masks regardless of vaccination status. Thanks to the Cook County Department of Emergency Management and Regional Security for supplying masks for distribution to community members.


# Vaccines for children 6 months - 5 years of age

- May 2021 Pfizer clinical trials began
- December 2021 Results announced
  - Safe (no severe events)
  - Effective at dosage for age 6 months 2 years of age
  - Not effective at dosage for 2+ years 5 years of age
    - Not enough response with two doses
- January 2022 Pfizer applied to FDA for Emergency Use Authorization for two doses for the age group
  - Will prep the 2-5 yr group for receipt of 3<sup>rd</sup> dose




### **Hyperlocal Vaccination Events**

#### Suburban Cook County


CCDPH Local Vaccination Initiative

to-date as of 1/31/22






# COVID-19 Data Hospitalizations by vaccination status

## Mitigation Order 2021-11

#### Masking and Vaccine Requirements

- Monitoring data in CCDPH's jurisdiction
- Discussing approaches with other local health departments in Cook County, including Chicago
- Intention is to rescind the mitigation order 2021-11 when data indicates there is no longer a danger of overwhelming healthcare systems and the surge is subsiding





### TRO - School Mask Mandate

- CCDPH continues to strongly endorse universal masking in all schools public and private consistent with CDC guidance.
- Monitoring response to Temporary Restraining Order (TRO) on the governor's school mask mandate.
- Layered approach to mitigation in schools:
  - o getting vaccinated and staying up to date on boosters,
  - wearing an appropriate mask indoors,
  - maintaining physical distance from others when possible,
  - having proper ventilation in school buildings, and
  - washing one's hands frequently.

# **COVID-19 and Contact Tracing**

- The state IDPH Surge Center has taken over most tracing and case investigation activities
- Individuals testing positive are contacted by text and can opt in to tracing
  - advice is provided on isolation and quarantine
- CCDPH remains responsible for
  - congregate care settings
  - high risk facilities and populations
  - o specific outbreaks in other settings
  - o school guidance
- Move away from tracing every case as we prepare for dealing with COVID-19 post pandemic
