COMMENTS:

The Alternative Health Intervention and Response ("ALT-HIR") Task Force was first convened on April 25, 2022, in response to Cook County Board of Commissioners Resolution 22-0737. The Resolution called for the creation of the ALT-HIR Task Force to assist in developing and implementing an ARPA-funded pilot program to establish a mobile crisis intervention program. The Task Force created a report with 4 recommendations. One of the recommendations was to embed behavioral health resources in the Cook County 911 Dispatch Center to answer calls related to mental health and crisis stabilization. This amendment creates two new FTEs temporary positions within the ETSB personnel budget to staff these positions. The proposed budget amendment will be funded by the increase in anticipated Tax Increment Financing revenue, reflected in Amendment No. 1.
