Case counts as of May 17, 2023

- CCDPH continues to monitor cases closely in suburban Cook County. CCDPH is in regular contact with CDPH and IDPH to discuss cases and potential mitigation strategies should the trends indicate the need.
- Cook County Department of Public Health's (CCDPH) suburban jurisdiction remains in "low" transmission status.
- All of Cook County, including the city of Chicago, is now in the "low" community level, according to the CDC.




% Change in Case Count

- The recent percent change is calculated by comparing counts from the past 14 days to the 14 days preceding that.
- Percent change is not calculated if there were 1-4 cases in the past 14 days or in the 14 days preceding that.
- <u>Negative</u> numbers mean a town is likely trending *down* in new cases reported.
- <u>Positive</u> numbers mean a town is likely trending *up*.

Suburban Cook County Vaccination as of May 17, 2023



- One dose total increased over 3,000 doses since April report; Up to date total up almost 16,000 people








Mpox in Chicago



Mpox (Monkeypox) Cases Diagnosed in Chicago Residents, by Week



Mpox in Suburban Cook County CCDPH Response

CCDPH is closely monitoring the situation and raising public awareness about the recent uptick in cases in our area.

- Web and social messaging about signs and symptoms, prevention (e.g., getting vaccinated, safer sex, avoiding social gatherings), testing, isolation and home care, and treatment.
- CCDPH redistributes vaccine and treatment to medical providers, and collaborates with other health departments in suburban Cook County to ensure residents are served.
- CCDPH currently has a large supply of mpox vaccine.
- CCDPH's communicable disease program investigates potential cases of mpox and close contacts and provides technical assistance to medical providers so that people get the treatment they need.



Mpox Key Messages





If you or your partner have recently had Mpox symptoms or a new or unexplained rash anywhere on your body, do not have sex and see a healthcare provider. In some cases, symptoms may be mild, and some people may not even know they have Mpox.

Cook County COOK COUNTY



- Vaccination is an important tool
- Vaccine <u>may not be 100% effective</u> in preventing disease, but may prevent severe illness, hospitalization, and death.
 - Get vaccinated NOW if you are at increased risk
 - If you've been exposed to mpox, <u>vaccination can still help</u>,
 - within 2 weeks of exposure, with the vaccine being
 - most effective within 4 days of exposure.
 - Second dose is needed four weeks after the first dose for best protection.
- a. See your healthcare provider, especially if you have been exposed.
- b. Consider altering your behavior temporarily while there is an uptick in cases:
 - Exchange contact information with any new partner so you can follow up with each other, if needed.
 - Talk with your partner about any mpox symptoms
 - If you or your partner recently had mpox symptoms or a new or unexplained rash anywhere on your body, do not have sex, cover the rash with clothing and see a healthcare provider.
