

Percentage of Economic Activity in Illinois, 2019




Proposed 2025 Regional Operating Budget

- Total regional expenses projected at \$4.147 billion
 - 5.7% increase from 2024 Regional Budget
 - Continued service restorations, higher labor expense amid workforce challenges
- Federal relief funding now expected to begin to exhaust in early 2026
 - Projected annual shortfall of more than \$700 million starting in 2026
 - New funding sources and policy reforms need to be in place to avoid extensive service cuts and fare increases




2025 operating budget still being stabilized by federal relief







Fiscal cliff is not a one-time event

Fiscal cliff begins a negative feedback cycle.

Revenue shortfall and a declining annual operations budget is the new normal for the Service Boards.

Year 1 is a 40% cut in service but each following year will bring additional cuts.



Preparing for major legislative action in 2025

- Outreach to Governor's Office, ILGA leadership, and individual members
- Senate Transportation Committee hearings
- House Public Transit Working Group
- Key Dates:
 - Election Day: November 5, 2024
 - Veto Session: November 12-14, 19-21
 - Lame Duck: Early January 2025
 - New Session: Late January May 2025



Even a small delay in finding a funding solution could set the system back and make the current problem harder or impossible to solve.

2025 Legislative Agenda - Funding

Fully fund regional transit operations

- Fill projected operating budget gap
- Increase operations funding by at least \$1.5B annually
- Eliminate farebox recovery ratio requirement
- Fully fund free and reduced fare programs (\$150M annually) and ADA Paratransit service (\$250M annually)



2025 Legislative Agenda - Safety

Strengthen partnerships and investment to enhance personal safety and security on public transit

- Increase law enforcement presence
- Increase social services presence
- Advance a multi-layered approach using strategies identified at 2024 RTA Safety and Security Summit



2025 Legislative Agenda - Reform

Reform transit governance to establish a stronger RTA that improves service and accountability for riders and taxpayers

- RTA serves as rider hub for fares and customer service
- RTA sets service standards with mechanisms to monitor and enforce compliance
- RTA leads planning for major regional transit and transportation capital projects



Next Steps

- November/December County Board hearings, service board public hearings
- November 15 December 10 Regional Budget open for public comment
- November 22 Agencies present to RTA Board
- December 3 RTA virtual public hearing
- December 19 RTA Board of Directors votes on budget adoption
