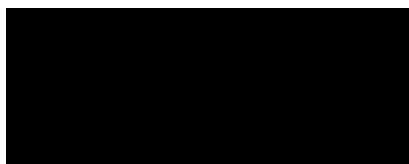


Thomas C. Munz



Munz served 39 years with the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency (OCC). Prior to his retirement he was an Assistant Deputy Comptroller heading up the Chicago Field Office. In this position he had responsibility for supervision of 40 national banks and thrifts ranging in size from 50 million to 7 billion dollars. The banks and thrifts were located in Chicagoland area, northwest, IL and Wisconsin.

Munz also served as examiner in charge of banks ranging from small community banks to regional banks. In these roles he headed examination of banks with bank ratings from 1 to 5. A particular focus of his work centered on the assessment of bank management, board oversight, loan portfolios, and the overall condition of the bank. Examination work included investigation of fraud. He was an award recipient from Chicago Cook County Crime Stoppers.

His activities included serving as an instructor for both internal OCC schools as well as OCC programs for bank directors. He also served as a speaker at many Illinois Bankers Association programs. Munz assisted the Community Bankers Association of Illinois in the development of their Directors' College and served as an instructor at this program.

Since retirement from the OCC he now the principal Munz Consulting, LLC that offers banking and regulatory services as well as a speaker at various banking programs.

From 1987 until 2003 he was a school member of Mount Prospect School District 57 serving as board president for 12 years. Munz currently serves as chairperson of the Village of Mount Prospect advisory audit committee.

Munz received his Bachelor of Science degree in accounting from Millikin University in Decatur, IL and is also an alumnus of the Graduate School of Banking at University of Wisconsin.
