- MCE is an unprecedented regional collaboration between the seven counties of Northeastern Illinois and the City of Chicago with the goal to increase exports from small and medium-sized businesses, while supporting regional job growth. The initiative is guided by a Steering Committee comprised of economic development organizations from across the area, with the support of the region's elected officials.
