Answer:


From 2014 to 2015 in Chicago and all of Cook County, the rate for Latino 20 to 24 year olds increased; the rate for Black 20 to 24 year olds in Chicago remained relatively flat but improved in Cook County; and Whites stayed relatively flat in Chicago and Cook County.

Concentrations are highest on the South and West Sides of Chicago and in the South Suburbs of Cook County.



These are most heavily concentrated in the Loop and in the Northwest Suburbs.



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

Answer:

From the Loop, individuals have access to over 700,000 of these while Community Areas on the South, Southwest, and Northwest Sides had access to fewer than 50,000.

- Increase public education expenditures
- Provide on-the job training
- Expand training and workforce development
- Remove the impediments to employment, including those related to criminal records

Strategies for \$500

What is:

Preparing young people for livable wage jobs that do exist and equipping them to participate in the emerging economy?

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Strategies for \$1,000

Answer:

- Tie tax incentives for corporations to actual job generation, which are then monitored for adherence to agreements with penalties for non-compliance
- Accelerate incentives to investments in neighborhoods and evaluate their effectiveness

Strategies for \$1,000

What is:

Stopping the bleeding of job loss and reversing policies that reward extraction of wealth from communities?

Strategies Daily Double!

Answer:

- Attract anchor employers that hire neighborhood residents
- Assist and incentivize small business development
- Create incentives for venture capital investments that are not totally predicated on immediate profit recovery
- Enhance conditions for community led initiatives such as worker cooperatives and small business incubators that harness the skills and talents of young people, both of which can become the basis for revitalized commercial districts to supply the much-needed access to a wider range of goods and services
- Increase funding for community organizations that provide mentorship and capacity building of young people
