

Offices Under the President make up 8% of the General Fund Budget






OUP - FY2019 Adopted Budget








- All Offices are currently below their YTD budget and are on target to end the year within the adopted budget
- Bureau of Technology expenses will become due in 4th quarter

OUP Revenue Projections



- OUP manages various revenue sources including projections for Sales Taxes
- The Department of Revenue projects and collects the County's Home Rule
- To date, Non-Retailer Use Tax is trending below budget by \$2.1M/11.4% due to low private vehicle sales
- Cigarette Tax is down by \$9.3M/7.8% due to "Tobacco 21" which raised the age to purchase tobacco products from 18 to 21
- All other revenue categories are meeting or modestly exceeding budget




