The sharing of this information with our dispatch agency would allow our first responders to be better prepared for calls they may be dispatched. We all understand the guidelines for use of PPE when responding to certain calls We have all had to adjust our response practices due in large part to the limited supply of PPE as well as the lack of information being shared by the County. As you are aware, the Attorney General has indicated that providing this information to first responders is not a violation of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). To date, Palatine has had three positive COVID-19 tests within our Police Department and have lost many additional days of employees being able to work due to suspected exposure. We can't afford to keep losing public safety employees from work. There will be no "false sense of security" as some Commissioners have indicated. The sharing of information is one step towards protecting the health and safety of our first responders. For communities like ours with numerous multi-family dwellings, the information becomes even more critical for officers that may be standing by to assist our paramedics on a call.
