#### PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

#### ANNUAL REPORT OF JTDC ADVISORY BOARD

**BE IT ORDAINED,** by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2 - ADMINISTRATION, ARTICLE VI. - BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES, DIVISION 3. - JUVENILE TEMPORARY DETENTION CENTER ADVISORY BOARD, of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

#### Sec. 2-520. - Annual report of the JTDC Advisory Board.

(a) The JTDC Advisory Board, <u>within six months after the end of each Fiscal Year</u>, shall submit to the Executive Director of the JTDC, the Chief Judge, the Board of Commissioners, and the President an annual report. <u>prior to the end of the Cook County fiscal year</u>.

(b) Included in the report shall be any recommendations for additional legislation or other action which may be necessary to carry out the mission, purpose, and intent of the JTDC.

#### PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

#### ANNUAL REPORT ON THE INFORMATION SECURITY FRAMEWORK

**BE IT ORDAINED,** by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2 - Administration, ARTICLE XII. - COOK COUNTY INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, DIVISION 1. - COOK COUNTY INFORMATION SECURITY, of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as Follows:

#### Sec. 2-968. - Reporting.

(a) At least once each calendar year, the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) shall report to the Information Security Working Group on the Information Security Framework.

(b) At a minimum, the Chief Information Security Officer's (CISO's) annual report shall detail:(1)The status of all Agencies' adoption and compliance with the Information Security Framework; and(2)A summary of all advice and recommendations of each Agency regarding their unique considerations.

Based on information provided by the Information Security Working Group, the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) may modify his or her annual report.

(c) The Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) shall present the annual report, within six months after the end of each Fiscal Year, to the Cook County Board of Commissioners following the presentation of that report to the Information Security Working Group.

# CELEBRATING INDIGENOUS PEOPLES' DAY RESOLUTION

**WHEREAS**, Cook County, IL currently occupies territory that Sovereign Nations, including the Potawatomi, Ojibwe and Odawa, Ho-Chunk, Miami, Sac and Fox, Peoria, Illini and many others consider to be a part of their historical and modern day homelands; and

WHEREAS, Cook County, has a responsibility to support diversity, equity and inclusion from all communities, however, this effort must begin with acknowledging and reconciling with the fact that America's Native peoples were systematically removed and killed in order to provide economic opportunities to European settlers on this land; and

**WHEREAS**, Cook County recognizes that Native Americans in the county make up the ninth largest Urban Native community in the country who continue to practice their cultural traditions, caretaking of the land and educating others about the American Native perspective; and

**WHEREAS**, Indigenous Peoples' Day was proposed to the United Nations in 1977 by a delegation of Native Nations as a way to bring education around the ongoing impact of colonization and awareness of genocide committed against Native Peoples; and

WHEREAS, Cook County, IL has always been home to American Native Nations with vibrant cultural traditions and relationships to the land. This land has a violent history of genocide and removal that must be acknowledged and reconciled in order to create a County where diversity, equity and inclusion are the cornerstone of policies and procedures.

WHEREAS, Indigenous Peoples' Day shall be an opportunity for celebration of Indigenous cultures and contributions to the County.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, the second Monday in October shall exclusively be recognized as Indigenous Peoples' Day in Cook County in perpetuity.

#### **PROPOSED RESOLUTION**

#### COUNTY REQUESTING **PUBLIC** HEARING OF THE COOK Α HEALTH AND COUNTY **COMMITTEE** COOK HOSPITALS FOR Α DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH BRIEFING ON COVID-19 VACCINE PLANS FOR SUBURBAN COOK COUNTY

WHEREAS, On January 27, 2020, the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services declared that COVID-19, a respiratory illness spread by close contact through respiratory droplets, presents a public health emergency, and the World Health Organization characterized the COVID-19 outbreak as a pandemic on March 11, 2020; and

WHEREAS, The Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH) is the Illinois certified local health department for suburban Cook County, Illinois, with the exception of Evanston, Skokie, Oak Park, and Stickney Township, serving 127 municipalities; and

WHEREAS, on December 14, 2020, in the CCDPH's jurisdiction 157,083 cases of COVID-19 and 2,899 deaths attributable to the pandemic have been reported; and

**WHEREAS,** the FDA approved emergency use authorization of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine on December 11, and first shipments of the vaccine are expected to be delivered to suburban Cook County by the Illinois Department of Public Health the week of December 14, 2020; and

WHEREAS, CCDPH, working alongside the Cook County Department of Emergency Management and Regional Security, will be working to ensure receipt and distribution of the vaccine to the health care entities in its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, CCDPH is working with partners to reach diverse populations and communities, including regional healthcare coalitions, federally qualified healthcare centers, pharmacies, long term care facilities, and community leaders, to develop flexible and responsive COVID-19 vaccination programs that can accommodate different vaccines; and

**WHEREAS,** CCDPH will take the lead in coordination, immunizing critical populations, and identifying and bridging gaps in vaccine coverage, and is committed to planning for the equitable distribution of vaccine and ensuring health equity is a driving component of any vaccine plans;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Cook County Health and Hospitals Committee convene a public hearing to discuss the Cook County Department of Public Health's COVID-19 vaccine plan for suburban Cook County.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Cook County Health and Hospitals Committee will provide a monthly update to discuss the Cook County Department of Public Health's COVID-19 vaccine plans as well as contact tracing plans for Suburban Cook County.

#### COOK COUNTY LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

#### Sec. 2-107. - Board of Commissioners; meetings of the Board.

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- (i) Order of business.
  - (1) At each regular meeting of the Board, the order of business (unless otherwise directed by the Board) is as follows:
    - a. Public testimony.
    - b. New business.
    - c. Committee items requiring board action.
  - (2) All questions relating to the priority of business shall be decided by the presiding officer, without debate, subject to appeal.
  - (3) Meetings of the Board may commence with a prayer or invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance
  - (4) The County Board shall break for lunch from Noon to 12:45 p.m. or as soon as is practical thereafter on days of the Meeting of the Board of Commissioners, Committees, and Subcommittees.
  - (5) The County Board shall commence full Board of Commissioner meetings with a Native American Land Acknowledgement that has had input from Native American residents of Cook County
