

Q & A for the Indigenous Peoples' Day Resolution for Cook County (March 2021)

Who else in the USA has changed Columbus Day to Indigenous Peoples' Day?

This is a growing National movement, since 1992, in which 14 states,
9 counties, over 150 cities/towns including Bloomington, IL, a few dozen
Universities and school districts, including the Chicago Public
Schools, Evanston, Oak Park, Niles Township, and more in Illinois
have already made this change. Over 72 million people around the
country live in states, cities and counties that recognize Indigenous
People's Day. In Cook County, over 7,000 people have signed the
petition, as well as over 100 organizations which represent many

thousands of constituents. The list of supporting organizations and policy makers is attached.

Why should Cook County change Columbus Day to Indigenous Peoples' Day?

When discussing Columbus, it should be noted that this so-called hero was an invader upon Indigenous lands and caused irreparable damage through the extraction, exploitation and unimaginable acts of physical, mental, and sexual abuse inflicted upon the original inhabitants. Christopher Columbus' kidnapping of 500 Native Americans on his first bumping into modern day Dominican Republic morphed into the trans-Atlantic slave trade by the mid-16th century. Despite the atrocities committed by Columbus and the colonizers, Indigenous communities are still here and thriving. In Cook County alone, the Native population is over 65,000 and home to the sixth largest Urban Native population in the country. By continuing to commemorate Columbus as a hero, we undermine the rich history and diversity that created modern-day Cook County.

Is this resolution Anti-Italian?

No, this resolution is not Anti-Italian. We have respect and love for our Italian American sisters and brothers, and we know they had been discriminated against in terms of housing, employment, education, and health care, in decades past. However, this resolution IS Anti-Columbus. The purpose of this movement is to end the celebration of a man who represents for rape, murder, genocide, and the origins of the trans-Atlantic slave trade.
