


Justice Advisory Council FY2015 Budget Presentation


Budget and staffing

- Partnered with stakeholders and Supreme Court to reduce reliance on pretrial detention in Cook County
- Engaged juvenile justice stakeholders and advocates in discussions on solutions to reduce the impact of Raise the Age legislation, strategies to address the impact, and continuous monitoring of the impact
- Coordinated Offices Under the President efforts to transition JTDC from the Transitional Administrator to the Office of the Chief Judge
- Piloted effort in partnership with the Public Defender's Office and a community organization to provide individuals awaiting trial better access to mental health treatment
- Awarded \$680,000 in anti-recidivism grants to community-based organizations to help support initiatives for individuals as they re-join their communities from jail or prison
- Funding from the MacArthur Foundation has been sought to expand and continue bond court project in 2015
