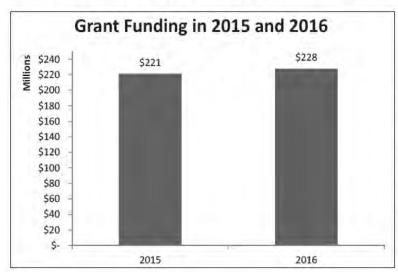
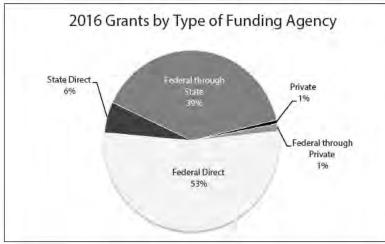
2016 GRANTS OVERVIEW

Cook County receives grant funds from federal, state, and private agencies for a variety of direct and indirect services provided by Cook County under the program areas of Economic Development, Healthcare, Finance and Administration, and Public Safety. The FY2016 recommended Grants budget is \$228M, which is a 3 percent increase from FY2015, primarily attributed to carryover funding from the Department of Planning and Development and Homeland Security and Emergency Management's formula grant programs. Below is a comparison of grant funding received by the County in FY2015 and FY2016.

The County receives the majority of its grant funds from the Federal government through direct funding or passthrough funding from the State of Illinois. Below is an overview of the funding types supporting grant programs.





ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The Office of Economic Development crafts strategies and programs to enhance the County's position within the region and facilitates the implementation of this work with the six surrounding collar counties of Lake, Will, Kane, DuPage, McHenry, Kendall, and the City of Chicago. To support this effort, the Office of Economic Development secured the Chicago Metro Metal Consortium grant for \$200,000 to promote economic development by collaborating with the Illinois Manufacturing Excellence Center to assist firms in primary metals, metal fabricating, metal working, and machinery industries. The Department of Planning and Development in the Bureau of Economic Development is the primary recipient of grant funds in this category. The Department of Planning and Development's primary objective is to retain and expand economic opportunities by investing and fostering economic

partnerships in communities. In 2016, the Department of Planning and Development's grant funding is expected to increase by 7 percent due to carryover funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Community Development Block Grant/Disaster Recovery funding in the amount of \$83.2M, focused on providing long term support for recovery efforts in areas of suburban Cook County impacted by flooding. Grants are given to support affordable housing, community development, economic development, and long-term planning efforts in communities impacted by the Spring 2013 FEMA declared floods.

Other grant programs under this category include:

- Community Development Block Grant awarded for \$9.6M is aimed at providing funds for improving public infrastructure, supportive community services, and expanding economic opportunities for persons of low and moderate income communities.
- HOME investment grant awarded for \$4.2M creates and preserves affordable rental or ownership housing for low-income households.
- Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) for \$819,584 is aimed at assisting homeless individuals through shelters, prevention programs, and improving access to necessary social services.

FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

The primary recipients of grant funding under this category are the Cook County Justice Advisory Council, Departments of Environmental Control, Medical Examiner's Office, Transportation and Highways, and Elections*. These grants provide education and prevention activities, drug and alcohol treatment, advocacy and case management services, and anti-recidivism activities aimed at reducing the population in the Cook County Jail. In addition, grant programs under this area are used for various transportation and road related construction projects and redevelopment, recycling and reuse programs, and for air quality inspections and monitoring at various sites throughout the County, as well as support for the development of a market of community solar projects in the County. This category decreased by 6.6 percent from the 2015 budget as a result of 1) the elimination of the Youth Employment (Summer Jobs) program from the State of Illinois that supported youth employment during the summer months; and 2) the implementation and phase out of various construction related projects, like: 151st Street Vincennes to 2nd Avenue, 139th Street to 135th Street, County Road Center, Freight and Rail Study projects. Grants in this category include:

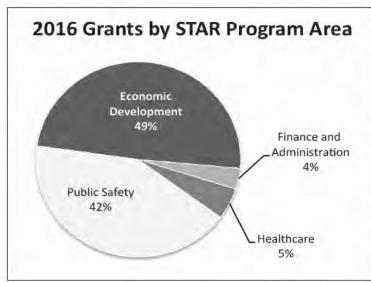
- Adult Redeploy Initiative grant for up to \$1M helps divert low-risk, non-violent offenders from entering the Illinois Department of Corrections by providing community-based services with the expected result of reducing the prison population over time and end the expensive cycle of crime and incarceration.
- Brownfields Assessment Grant with a carryover amount of \$571,000 to assist in the environmental assessment and eventual redevelopment of potentially contaminated properties in Bellwood, Franklin Park, Forest Park, Maywood, Melrose Park, Northlake, and Schiller Park.
- The 167th Street in Harvey from Center Street to Lowe Avenue Project funded at \$2.5M, to improve deteriorated road conditions and provide funding for street improvements, upgraded traffic signals, street lighting, enclosed drainage and traffic control for staged construction that will allow businesses continuous access to the corridor and ingress and egress of the road.
- State Board of Election grant for \$362,500 to support the maintenance and cost associated with the voter registration system to allow for the transmission of information through the Centralized Statewide Voter Registration System, as required by Title III Section 303 of the Help America Vote Act.
- SunShot Solar Pathways grant for \$1.2M to help bring community shared solar power to the region. In partnership with other governmental and non-profit groups, this grant provides funding for an opportunity assessment of the potential community solar market in Cook County, identifying best practices and identification of pilot sites to show how community solar can be scalable in urban areas.

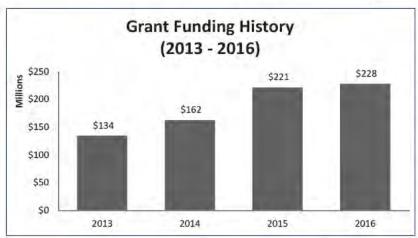

HEALTHCARE

Healthcare and Community Services grant recipients are the Department of Public Health and Stroger Hospital. The primary function in this category is to provide primary care to patients through a variety of services ranging from HIV/AIDS care, lead poisoning prevention activities, and women, children, and infant related services. Programs funded under this category expect to receive an increase of 19.6 percent over the 2015 budget, as a result of the Partnerships to Improve Community Health grant, awarded for \$2.5M to support the implementation of population-based strategies that expand the reach and health impact of policy, systems, and environmental improvements that promote healthy living and reduce the burden of chronic disease. Grants funded under this category include:

- Bioterrorism Preparedness funding estimated at \$1.2M provides support for the preparation and planning of emergency or hazardous situations.
- Local Health Protection funds for \$2.1M provide assistance to prevent the spread of infectious diseases, food protection, potable water supply, and private sewage disposal.
- Women, Infant and Children Nutrition funding at \$3.1M provides supplemental nutritious foods at no cost, nutrition education and referrals for health and social services to low-income pregnant, breastfeeding, and postpartum women; and infants and children up to age 5 determined to be at nutritional risk.





PUBLIC SAFETY

The Public Safety category grant recipients consists of the Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, Office of the Chief Judge, Cook County Sheriff, State's Attorney, Public Defender, Asset Management, and the Clerk of the Circuit Court. Departments funded under this category provide a variety of assistance to aid in protecting and serving the residents of the County. Grants in this category focus on crime

reduction, enforcement, prosecutions, case management services, and drug and alcohol treatment. In addition, grant funds under this program area are used to prepare, respond, and recover from acts of terrorism and/or catastrophic events. Grants in this category anticipate a decrease of 2 percent from 2015, mainly attributed to reduction of funding for the Child Support Enforcement programs.

The primary grants in this category include funding for:

- Urban Area Security Initiative estimated at \$54.1M provides resources to the Cook County Urban Area to include the City of Chicago and the 128 municipalities and all township governments within the boundaries of Cook County. This program provides funding to defray the cost of initiatives targeted at preventing, protecting against, mitigating the effects of, responding to and recovering from natural disasters and acts of terrorism. Funding allows for the development and implementation of preparedness outreach initiatives, security assessments of key critical facilities, the planning for, operation and evaluation of exercises, providing training for first responders and purchase of needed equipment for first responders.
- Port Security for \$487,500 provides financial assistance for the continuation and expansion of maritime security initiatives, and aligns with the mission, goals and objectives of the federal, state and local homeland security strategies. This grant program further supports existing efforts to prevent, protect, mitigate, respond and recover from threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk. This grant program seeks to support and strengthen the local, regional, state and federal maritime security posture.
- Child Support Enforcement grants are managed through several departments within the County and are estimated at \$18.6M. Funding under the Child Support Enforcement grants provides support for the enforcement of the Uniform Reciprocal Enforcement of Support Act on behalf of participants living in other counties and states. The program supports enforcement of child support obligations through income withholding. In addition, this program supports community outreach to identify children with disabilities in an effort to seek higher child support awards and establish procedures to modify child support orders.
- Misdemeanor Deferred Prosecution Enhancement Program (MDPEP) for \$372,689 provides and expansion to the State's Attorney's existing suite of diversion court programs that aid in the reduction of the jail and prison populations. The MDPDP aims to: minimize the collateral consequences resulting from convictions for the low-level, non-violent offenses; reduce recidivism, and reduce the cost to the system. The MDPDP utilizes evidence-based screening tools to determine risk/needs of misdemeanants who are eligible for the program (non-violent, non-DUI offenders). Participants are ordered to complete service requirements based on their risk-need score (ranging from community service to more intensive interventions). This will provide a more comprehensive evaluation and more individualized approach to the interventions. If the participant successfully completes the requirements, the misdemeanor charge will be dismissed, and the defendant will be immediately eligible to apply for expungement.
- High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area grant is estimated at \$4.9M and is aimed at eliminating and/or reducing the production, manufacturing, distribution, transportation and chronic use of illegal drugs in Cook County.

GRANT IMPROVEMENTS

The County is committed to streamlining processes while improving fiscal controls in order to remain current with Federal and State reforms. The Department of Budget and Management Services partners with central service departments, like the Comptroller's Office, County Auditor, Bureau of Technology, Office of the Chief Procurement Officer, as well as grant-funded departments to implement policies, procedures, technology aimed at enhancing the County's grant management structure. The reforms are aimed at improving service delivery and performance, increasing revenue, coordinating services, and streamlining processes. The 2016 budget includes an increase of \$6.5M in grant revenue from 2015. The County is dedicated to increasing grant revenue by 5 percent in 2017 to expand the services provided to the residents of Cook County. As external grantors continue to reform processes, emphasizing the importance of performance outcomes, the County will continue to develop more effective performance measures to increase transparency and accountability of our grant programs.

STATE BUDGET IMPACT ON COUNTY GRANTS

The State of Illinois' delay in passing the FY2016 budget creates uncertainty for the County, as it relates to the continuation of future grant programs affecting County residents that rely heavily on the associated services and the financial impact on the County's ability to support grant programs. The State of Illinois provides 6 percent, or \$12.6M, in direct funding from the State's general revenue that will be used to support health and violence prevention programs in FY2016. The State is also responsible for the oversight and disbursement of 39 percent, or \$89.7M, in grant revenue for FY2016 passed through from the Federal government allocated towards homeland security programs, nutrition programs for youth at the juvenile temporary detention center and for women, infant and children, in addition to a variety of violence prevention and social service grants. The County budget recommendation assumes that the State will ultimately adopt a Fiscal 2016 budget and fund direct grants consistent with historic practices, and that in light of the passage of Senate Bill 2042, signed into law on August 20, 2015, that Federal pass-through grants will ultimately be funded in the County Fiscal Year 2016.

The County is committed to ensuring that the current grant programs outlined above realize the least impact on services and communities; however, the uncertainty of future State-funding does hold the potential to negatively impact the associated services provided to residents of the County.

To be accepted, participants must meet objective legal, criminogenic, and behavioral health criteria. In order to graduate the ACT Court, participants must complete 18 months of court-supervised, community-based treatment and community services. The ACT Court targets nonviolent offenders with behavioral health needs who are likely to be facing a prison sentence on their current offense. Legally eligible ACT Court candidates are newly arrested for Class 4 Felony Possession of a Controlled Substance and Class 3 and 4 Retail Theft offenses. ACT candidates' criminal history must also include at least three prior felony convictions, and one prior IDOC commitment, without any disqualifying convictions under Illinois law. After undergoing validated risk and behavioral health assessments, candidates found to be both high risk and high need will be offered admission to the ACT Court.
