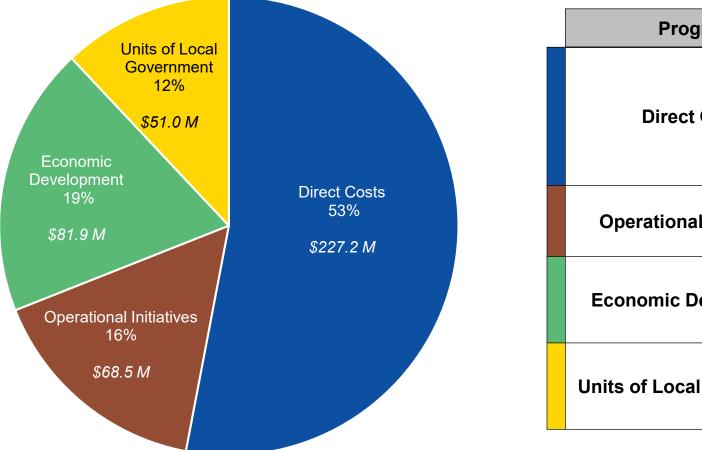

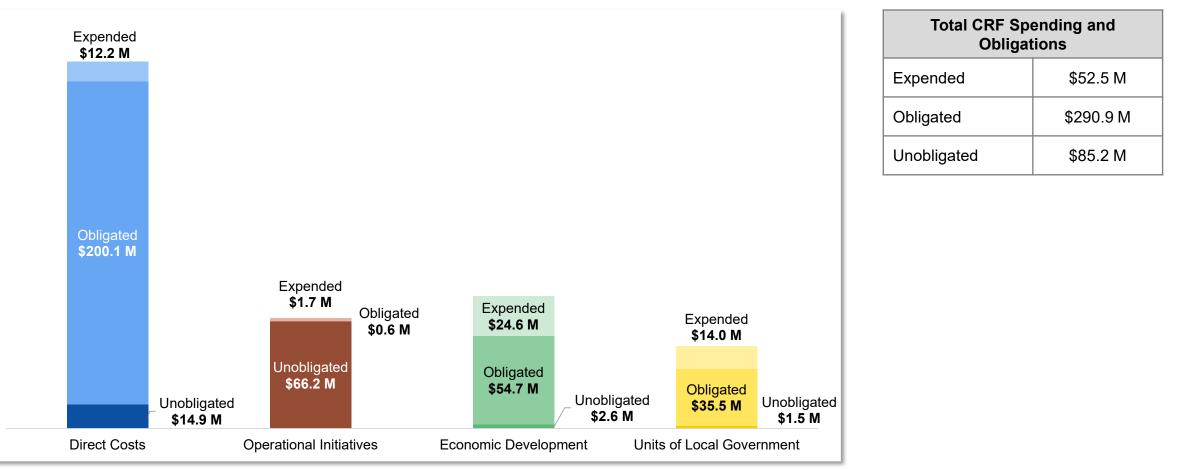

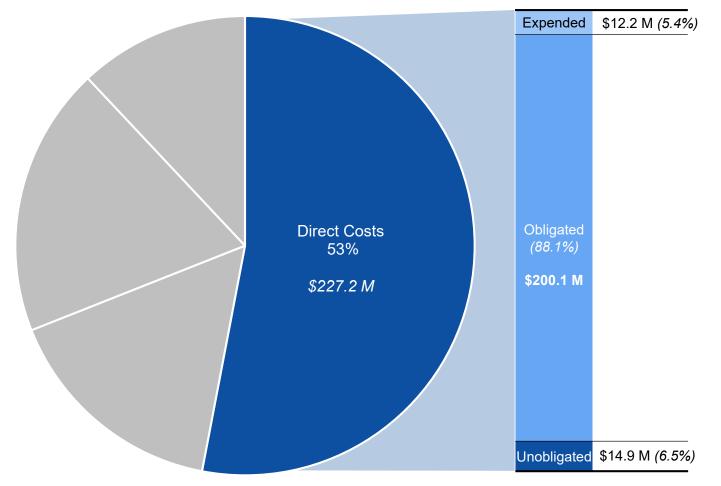

94 percent of funding for Direct Costs has been expended or obligated

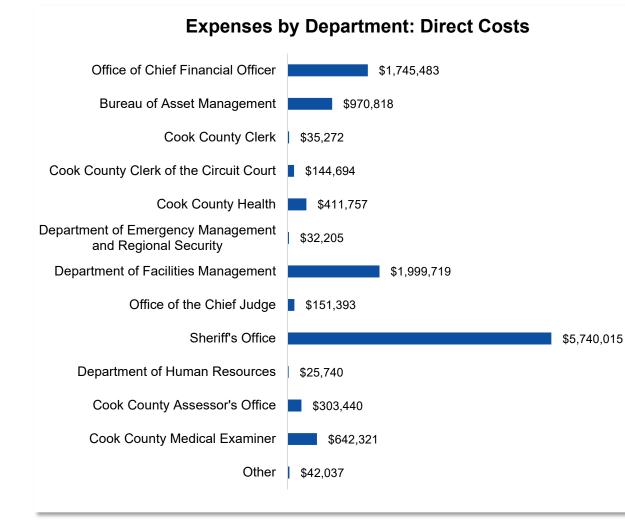

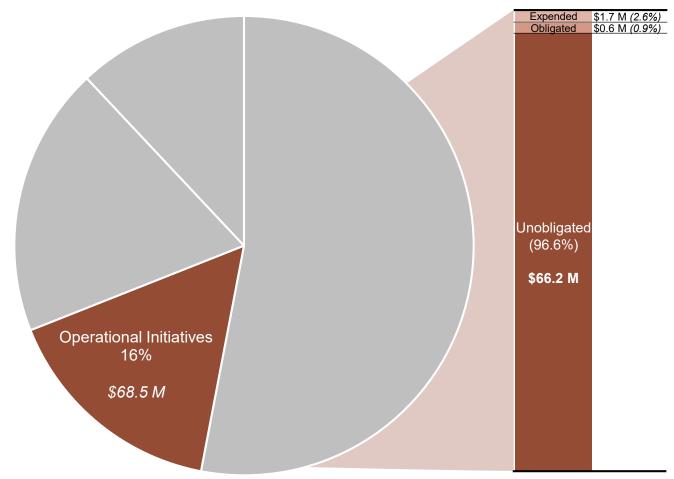

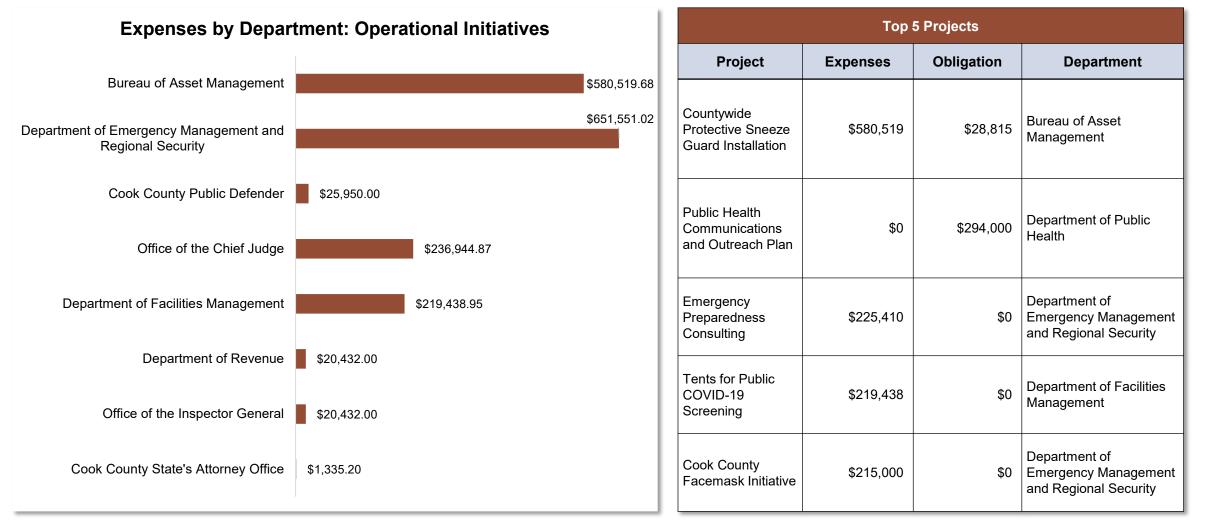

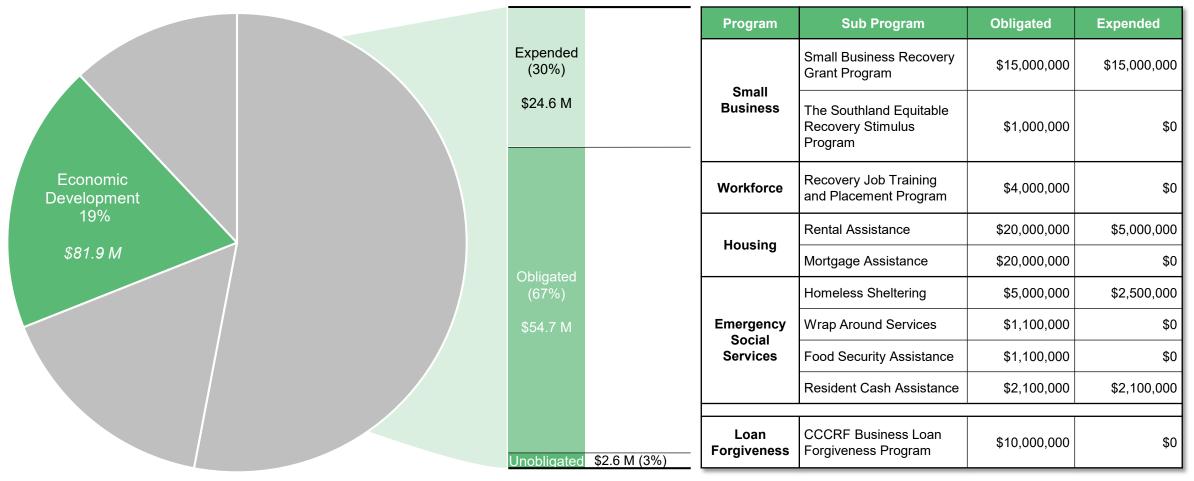

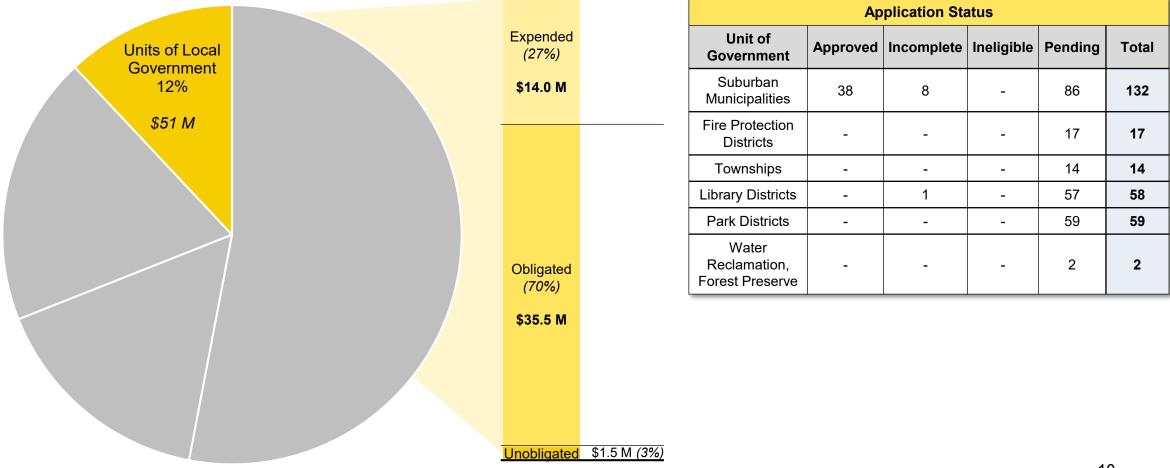
CRF Update | Economic Development

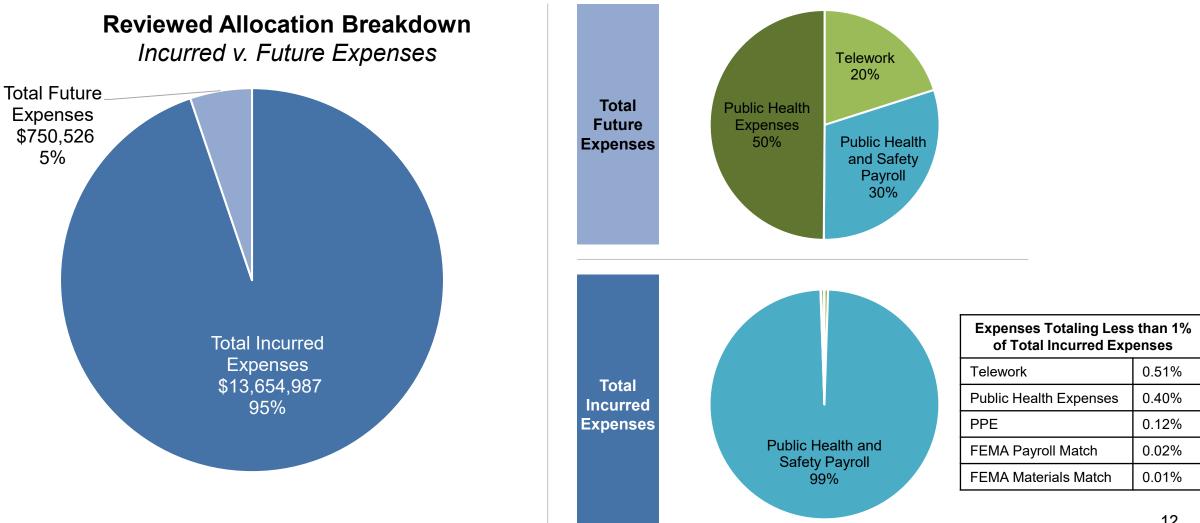

Personnel data has been submitted and PWs will be developed, but PW priority was given to non-personnel expenditures first. PW value may vary from month to month if and as transactions are added or removed from a PW.

** For these PWs, to avoid duplication of benefits, as applicable, deductions may be applied based on reimbursement ratios from Medicare, Medicaid, or insurance programs; or from the US HHS Provider Relief Fund (PRF). For applicable PWs, based on current assessment or charge ratios from the applicable hospitals, it is estimated that approximately 62% of the expense value may be reimbursed by Medicare, Medicaid, or insurance programs, and would thus not be covered by FEMA and CRF. PRF information and guidance is in flux and is being closely monitored for possible impact to CCH PWs.

*** For MS-04, some expenses on this PW may be transferred to other PWs to better connect the expenses to the public health emergency or may be deemed ineligible.
