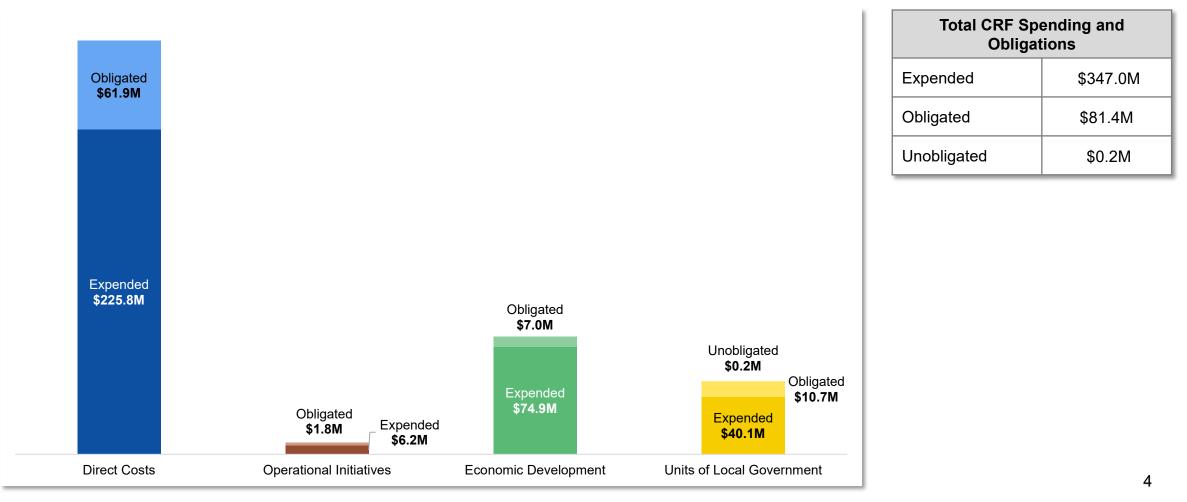

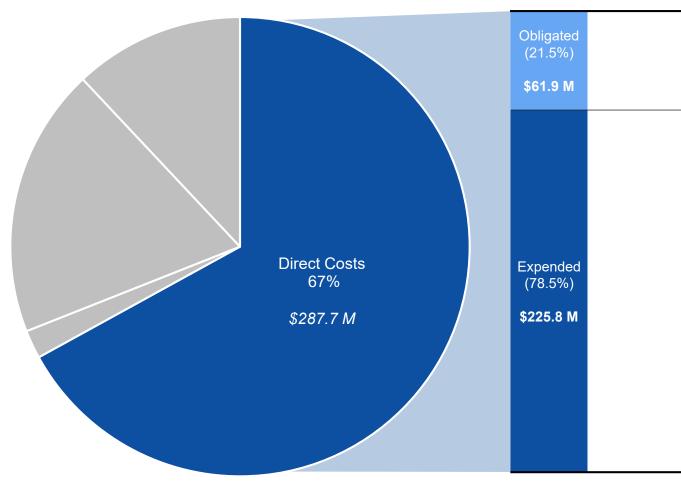

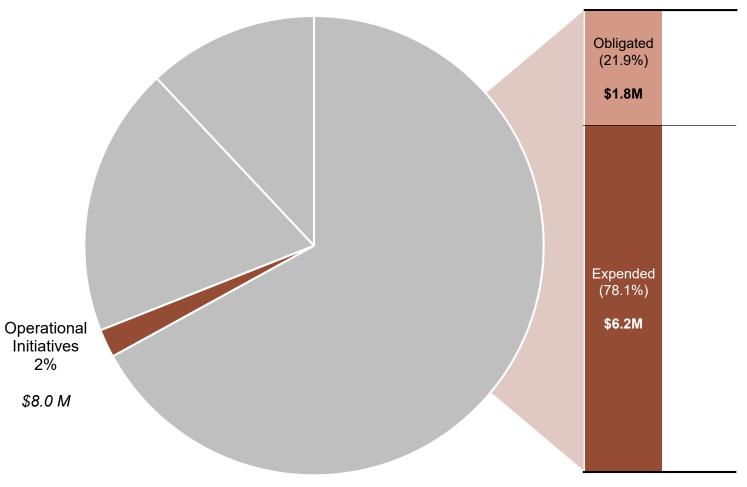

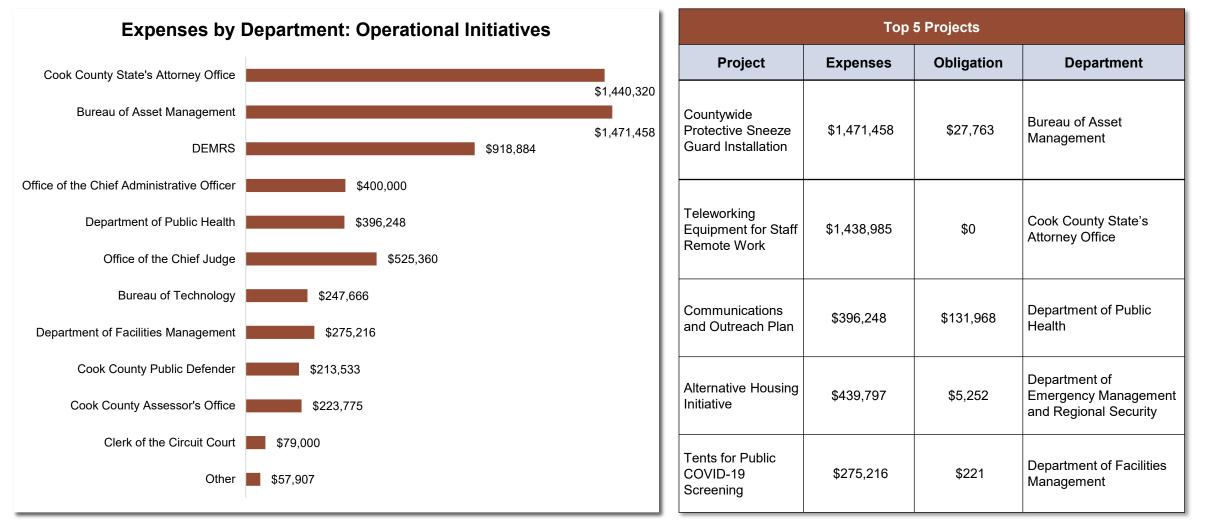

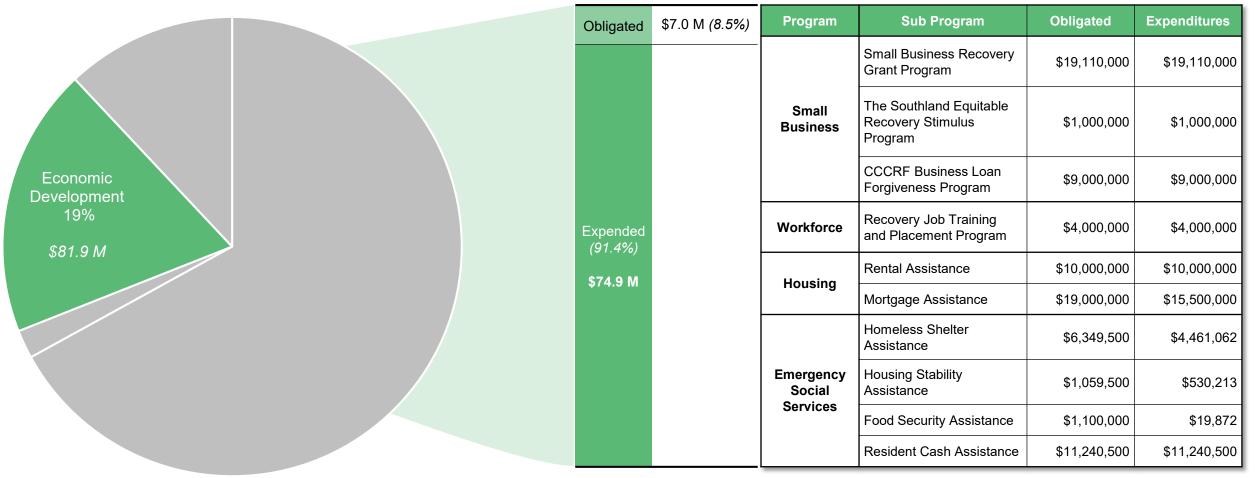

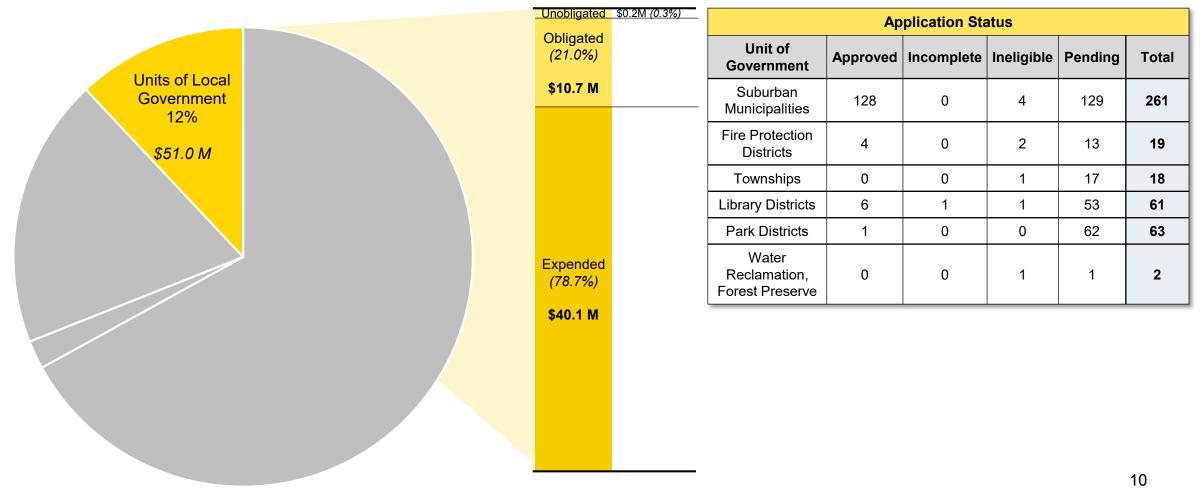
CRF Update | Economic Development

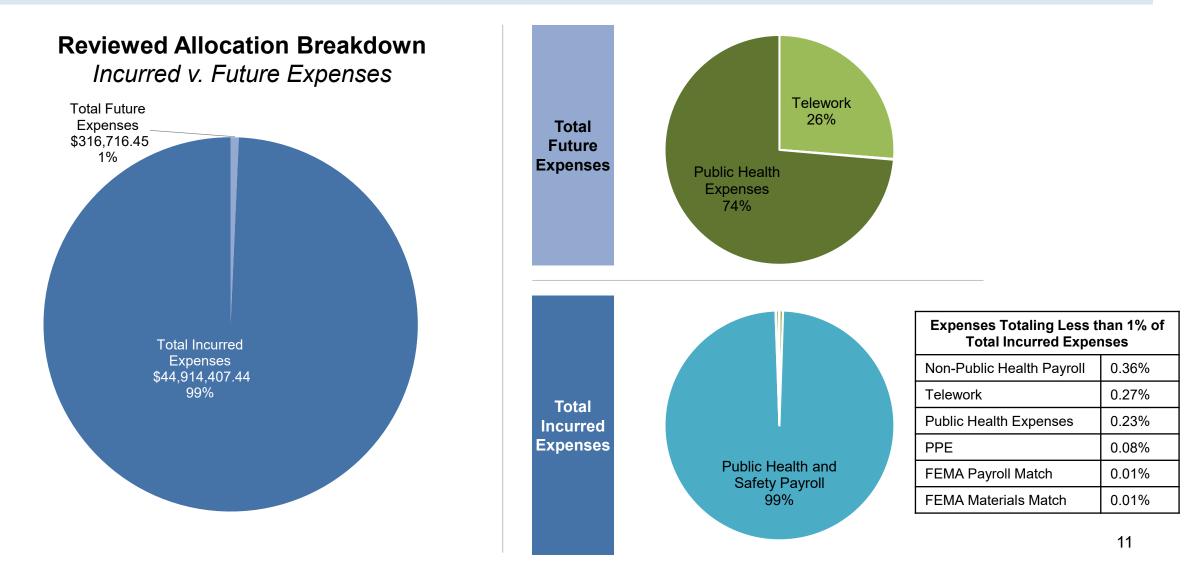

* Note project worksheets (PW) listed are for reimbursement of non-personnel expenditures incurred in fiscal year 2020. PW value may vary from month-to-month as transactions are added or removed from a PW.

** For these PWs, to avoid duplication of benefits, as applicable, deductions were applied based on reimbursement ratios from Medicare, Medicaid, insurance programs; or from the US HHS Provider Relief Fund (PRF). For applicable PWs, based on current assessment of charge ratios from the applicable hospitals, it is estimated that approximately 62% of the expense value may be reimbursed by Medicare, Medicaid, or insurance programs and would thus not be covered by FEMA and CRF. PRF information and guidance is in flux and is being closely monitored for possible impact to CCH PWs.

*** Not all purchases on MS-01, MS-03, MS-05, & MS-07 are CRF-eligible. 25% of MS-01 is \$150,526 with \$149,708 being CRF-eligible (\$818 CRF-ineligible); 25% of MS-03 is \$304,430 with \$285,874 being CRF-eligible (\$18,556 CRF-ineligible); 25% of MS-05 is \$22,108 with \$20,554 being CRF-eligible (\$1,554 CRF-ineligible); 25% of MS-07 is \$58,950 with \$58,784 being CRF-eligible)

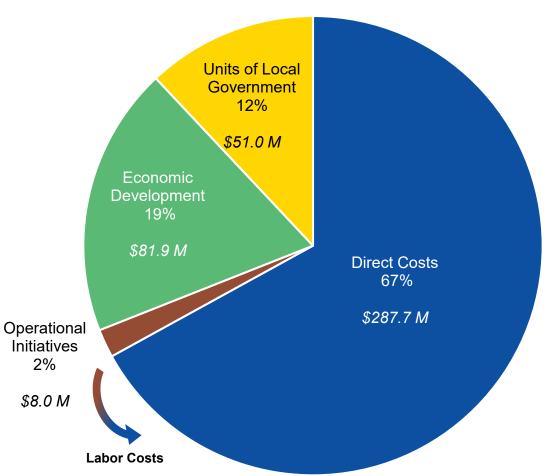
