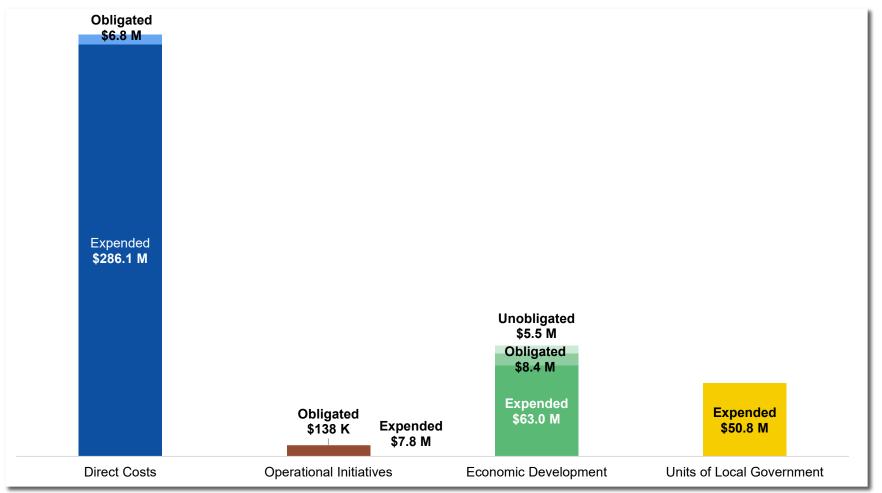

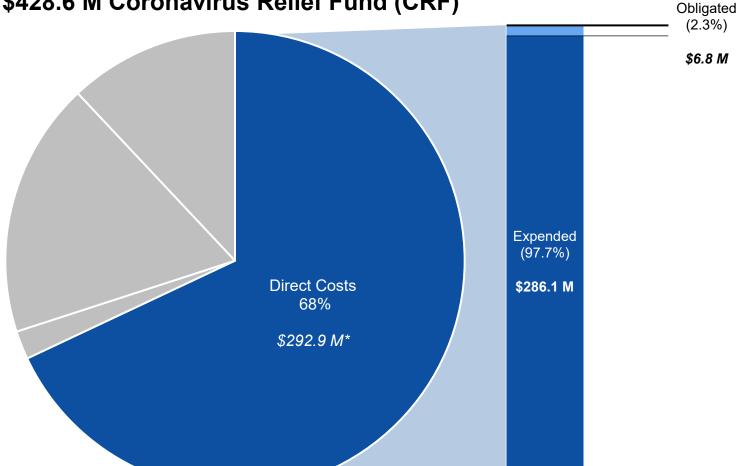

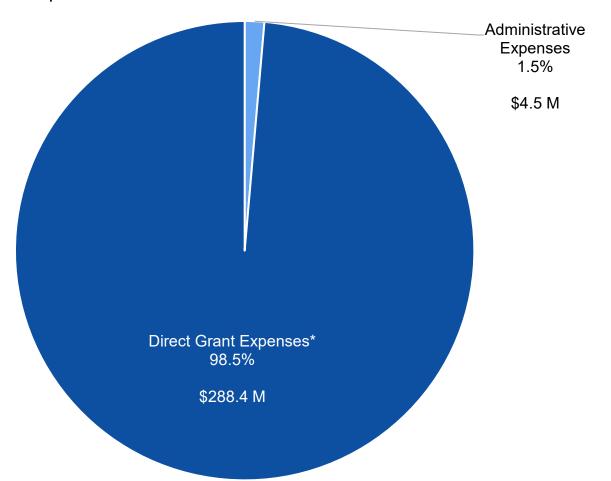

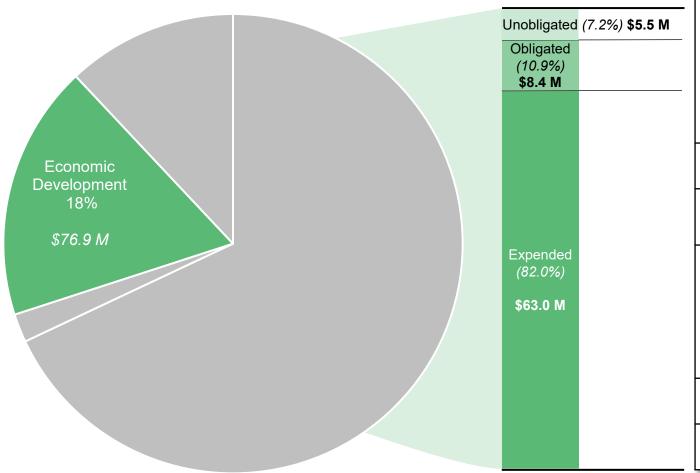

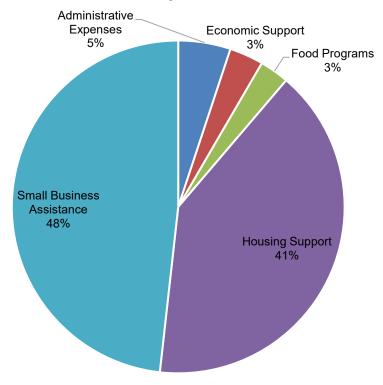

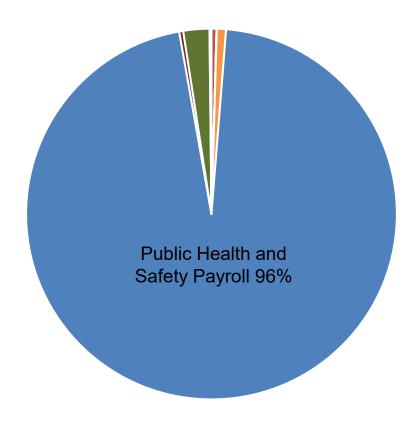

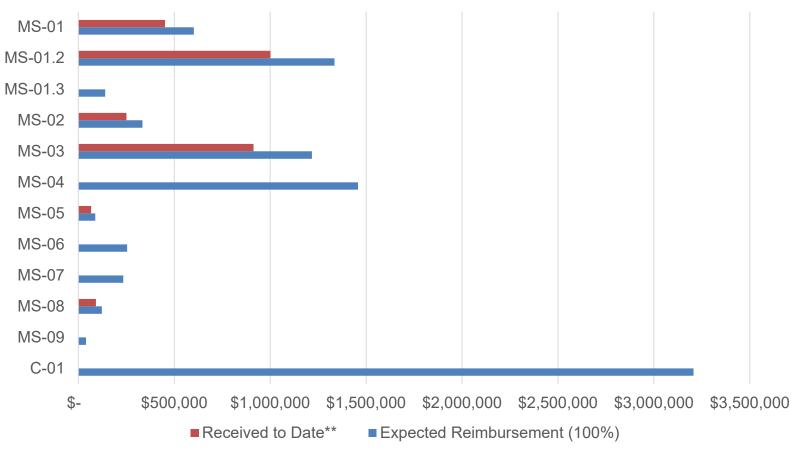

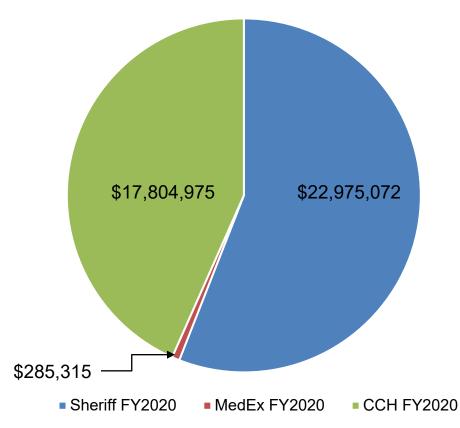

Expected FEMA reimbursements for Cook County Labor in FY2020 total \$41,065,362



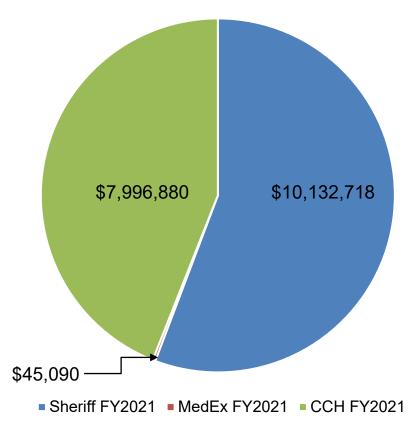

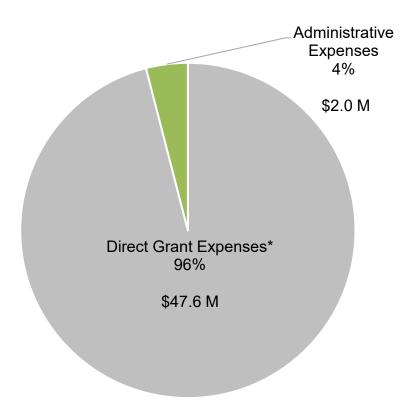

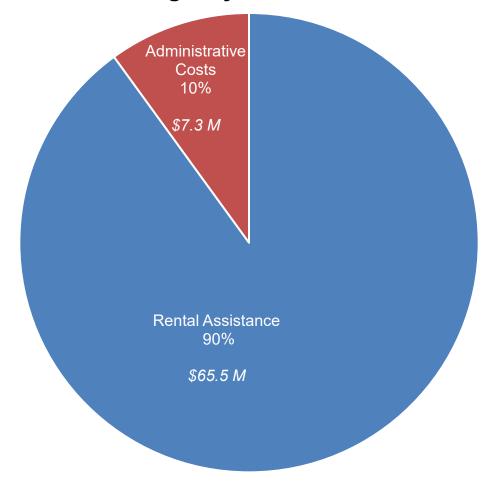

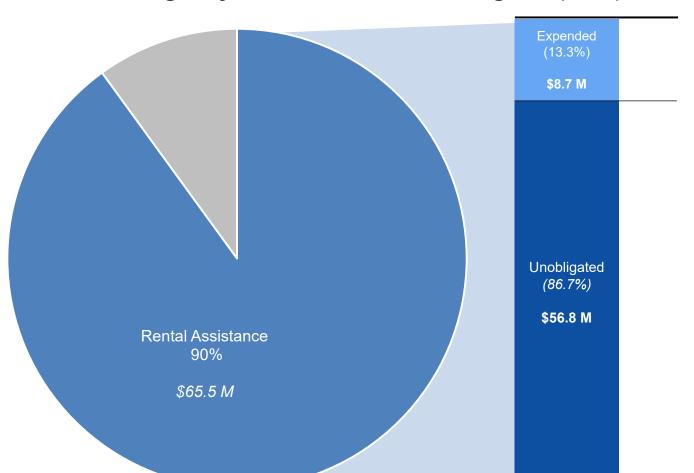

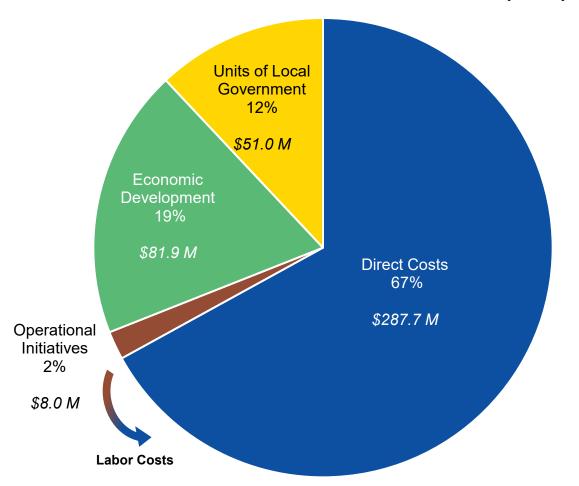

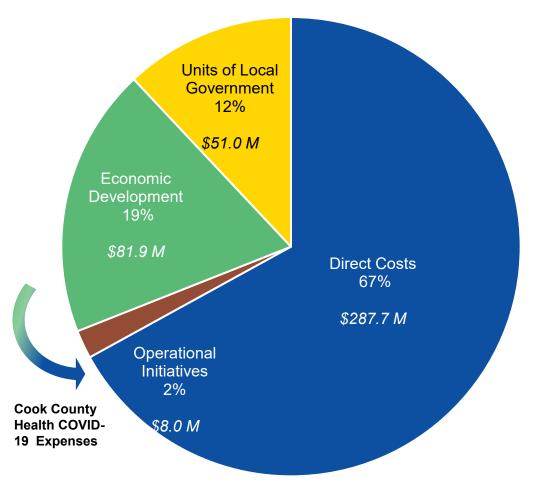

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Cook County updated its funding allocations to address internal and external funding needs

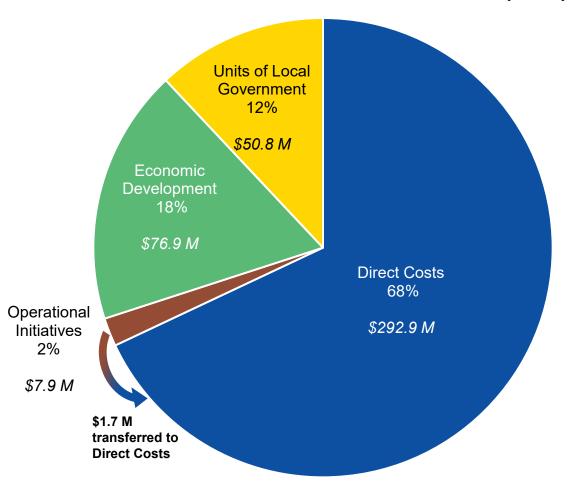
