Cook County was allocated \$1,000,372,385.00 under SLFRF and has received 50% of the award allocation to-date, or \$500,186,192.50.



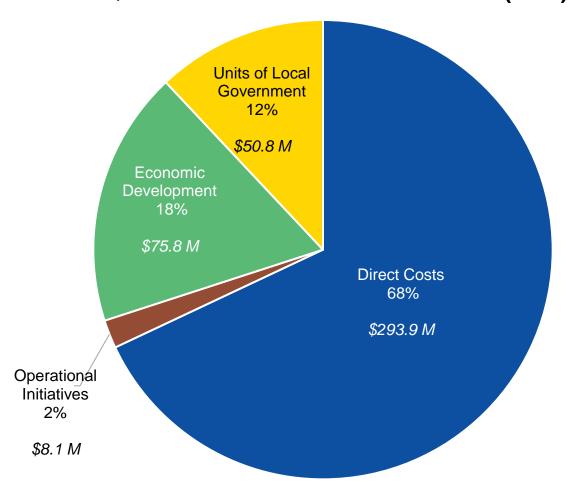

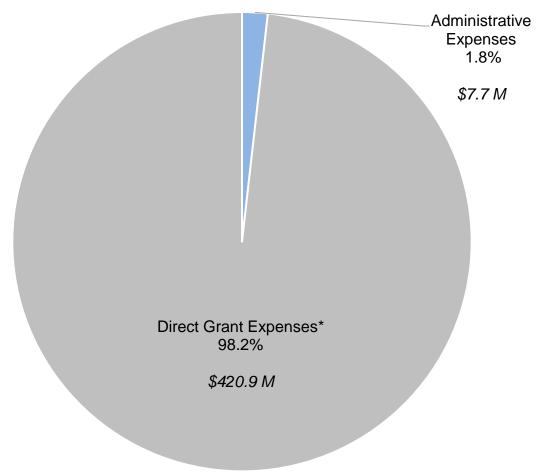

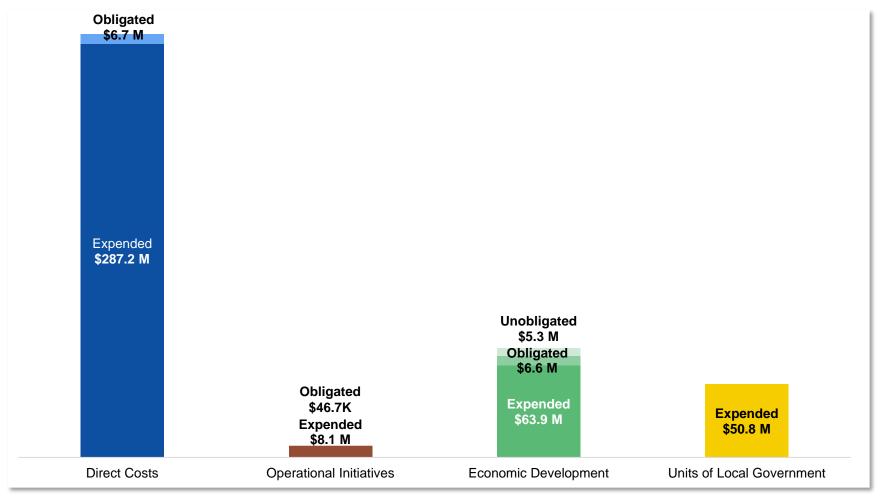

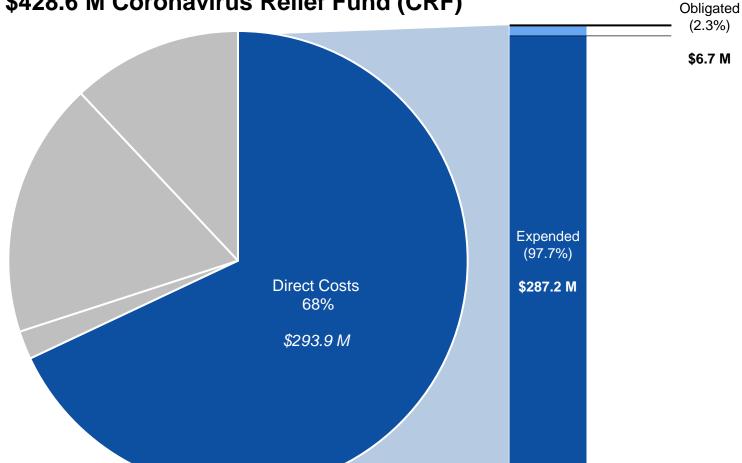

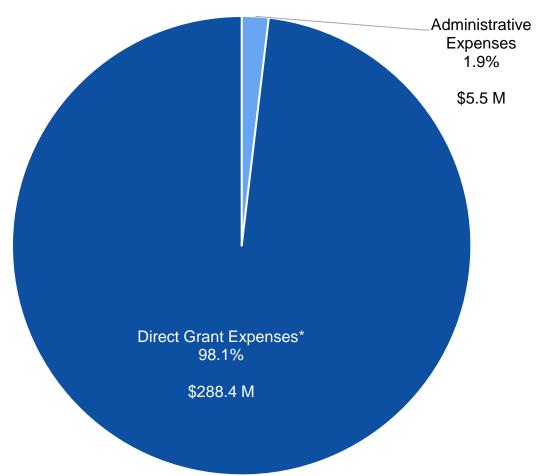

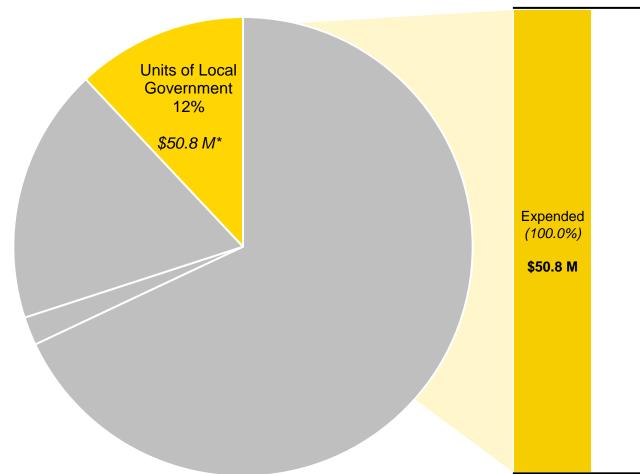

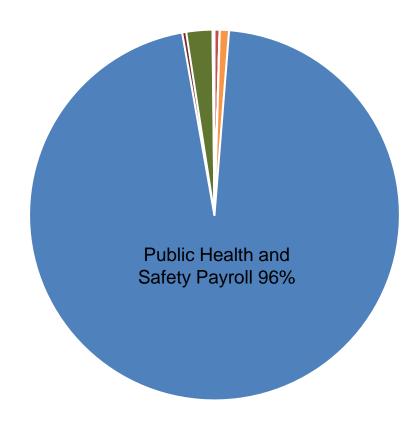

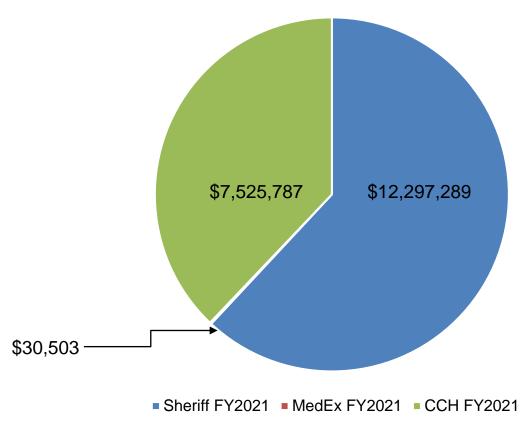

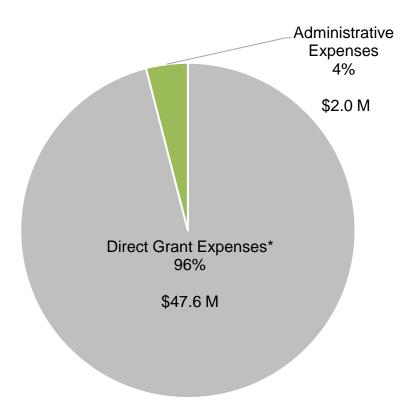

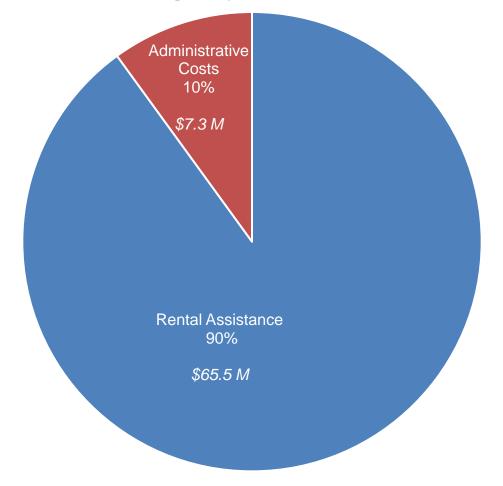

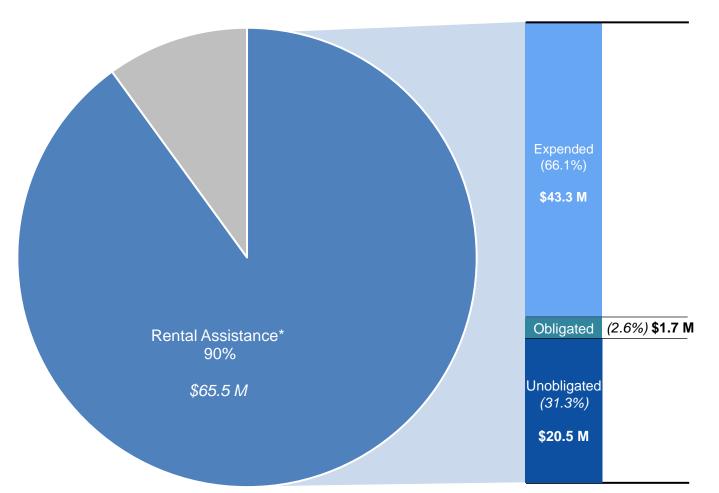

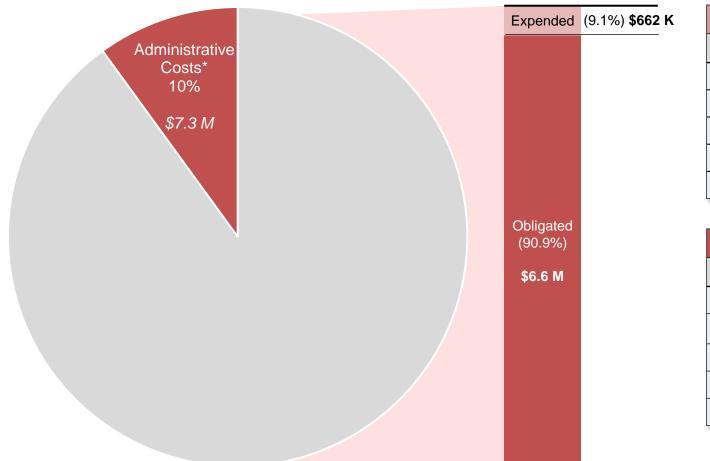

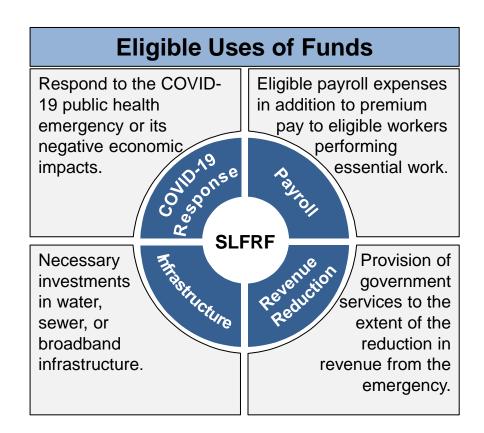

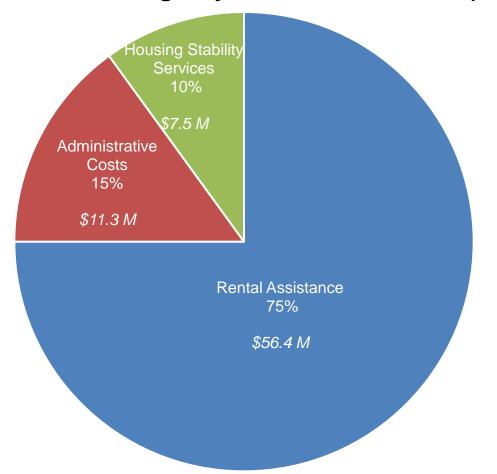
