Background Information

- Can't talk about violence without discussing Ben "Benji" Wilson's story
- There is a need for Trauma Centers especially in the South side
- The Homicides in Chicago increased from 2015-2016

Case Study

- In 1991, many trauma centers closed. There was no trauma centers for about 27 years
- ¹/₃ of the homocides/violent crimes occur within a 5 mile radius of UChicago Medicine
- Communities & organizations pushed for there to be trauma centers
- Before the University of Chicago trauma center, there was a long distance/time traveled in the Southside compared to the Northside. Longer distance equals longer travel time which plays a role in someone's survival chances.
- After the University of Chicago Trauma Center was established (On May 1st, 2018) the travel time/distance decreased on the Southside. The total population within a 10 mile radius decreased from 85,257

Commission Staff Present

• In the South Side, about 34-44% of the individuals are shot/firearm victims which is one of the highest in the USA, while in other countries, their #1 trauma activity consists of falls. If any firearm/shot victims the percentage of that is between 5-8%.

Social Determinants of Violence

- Within an 8 mile radius in Chicago, there is a significant change in life expectancy, from 85 years of age to 69.
- Social Determinants are the conditions in the environment where people are born, live, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality of life outcomes and risks.
- There is an overlap between economic exclusion and firearm injury. On the Southside there is more economic hardships as well as a low life expectancy area.
- Those who were victims of gun violence became victims again.
- Hospital-based violence recovery programs are designed to take advantage of the window of opportunity that often occurs in a clients' lives immediately after a violent trauma as well as during when they are more willing to accept interventions to address factors that put them at risk for violent recidivism.
- This program can help individuals reduce barriers to care in receiving community-based services.

Policy Reccommendations

- Expanding the Stroger Hospital's Community Violence Intervention Program
- Transform Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) form "Reimburstment" to "Compensation" fund
- Expand County's Pilot Emergency Supplemental Victim Services Fund
 - Funeral services or any services victims need
- Impove the South/West sides and Primary Education for All
- Promote Early Childhood Education and Access to Mental Health Services
- Enforce CPD Consent Decree and investing in Trauma-informed policing
- Commit to Long-term Outcomes and aling vectors
