WHEREAS, William R. Quinlan was a leading citizen of Cook County who raised a marvelous family here; and

WHEREAS, William R. Quinlan enjoyed a lengthy and stellar legal career of over 45 years, was a dedicated community leader and was loved by family, friends and coworkers, he passed away on Tuesday October 1, 2013; and

WHEREAS, William R. Quinlan served as Chicago's youngest corporation counsel, a Cook County circuit and state appellate judge, was a parliamentarian for the Cook County Board, Chair of the Cook County Judicial Advisory Council and a lawyer in private practice specializing in commercial litigation; and

WHEREAS, William R. Quinlan a proud Chicago South-sider graduated from Mount Carmel High School and received an accounting degree and a law degree from Loyola University Chicago. He graduated first in his law school class in 1963. After military service he served as a law clerk for a year for Illinois Supreme Court Justice Daniel P. Ward; and

WHEREAS, after his clerkship, Quinlan worked for the city of Chicago's Law Department where he handled many

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cases and was head of its appeals division. He later served as first assistant corporation counsel and was tapped for the top job and served as corporation counsel from 1974 through 1980. He worked under Mayors Richard J. Daley, Michael A. Bilandic and Jane M. Byrne; and

WHEREAS, Quinlan later received a Master of Law degree from the University of Virginia School of Law; and

WHEREAS, Judge Quinlan was first elected a Cook County Circuit Court judge in 1980; was appointed a state appellate justice in 1985 and later won election to the bench in 1986; and

WHEREAS, as a judge, Mr. Quinlan oversaw trials involving the 1979 roof collapse of what was then the Rosemont Horizon and also presided over the first asbestos trial in Cook County; and

WHEREAS, in 1989, Mr. Quinlan resigned from the Illinois Appellate Court to go into private practice with his brother-in-law Richard Phelan at Phelan, Pope & John; and

WHEREAS, when Richard Phelan won election as Cook County Board President in 1990, Mr. Quinlan represented him as special counsel and legal adviser, as well as the County Board's parliamentarian. He held both roles and continued to serve through the terms of Cook County Board Presidents Richard J. Phelan, John H. Stroger, Jr. and Bobbie L. Steele; and

WHEREAS, William R. Quinlan as Cook County Special Counsel handled many high profile and sensitive matters including the first consent decree in the "Shakman Case"; and

WHEREAS, William R. Quinlan was a trusted lawyer and advisor to not only Cook County Board Presidents but to all the members of the Cook County Board of Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Quinlan also formed two (2) law firms, Quinlan & Crisham and Quinlan & Carroll. Mr. Quinlan practiced law with his son William J. Quinlan at the Quinlan Law Firm until 2011; and

WHEREAS, William R. Quinlan taught extensively, including trial practice courses at John Marshall Law School, Loyola University School of Law and Northwestern University School of Law; and

WHEREAS, as dedicated community leader, Mr. Quinlan was on the board of several nonprofit groups, including Mundelein Seminary at the University of St. Mary of the Lake, the Loyola University School of Law Board of Governors, After School Matters and the Rotary Club of Chicago; and

WHEREAS, industrial real estate is normally assessed at 25% of its market value, qualifying industrial real estate eligible for the Class 6b can receive a significant reduction in the level of assessment from the date that new construction or rehabilitation has been completed, or in the case of abandoned property from the date of substantial re-occupancy. Properties receiving Class 6b will be assessed at 10% of the market value for 10 years, 15% for the 11th year and 20% in the 12th year; and

WHEREAS, in the instance where the property does not meet the definition of abandoned property, the municipality or the Board of Commissioners, may determine that special circumstances justify finding that the property is abandoned for purpose of Class 6b; and

GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS OPEN DATA AMENDMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2 Administration, Section 2-5(b) of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

(b) *Website.* In not less than 90 days, the Cook County shall establish www.OpenCC.info, a common website that shall serve as the source for countywide and departmental activities related to this Open Cook County Initiative (the Website). County Officials shall use their best efforts to publish information to the Website, including, but not limited to: revenue, spending and procurement information; crime and health statistics; contracts with private firms; policies or procedures; and other data or information commonly requested pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) in a format consistent with the standards set forth herein.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2 Administration, Article IV Officers and Employees, Division 3 Recorder of Deeds, Subdivision II Fees, Section 2-220 of the Cook County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 2-220. GIS data and map production fee.

(a) *Definitions:* The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Commercial User means any person seeking County GIS Data for the purpose of furthering a commercial enterprise.

County means Cook County.

Geographic Information System means the organized collection of computer hardware, software, and geographic data designed to efficiently capture, store, update, manipulate, analyze and display all forms of geographically referenced information operated and maintained by the County.

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GIS Data means all forms of digital geographically referenced digital information or data, legally disclosable and generated by the County's Geographic Information System, including, but not limited to, the types of data set forth in Section 32-1 of the Cook County Code of Ordinances.

Map means a product that is a visual depiction, image, or picture of data, whether digital or hardcopy.

Noncommercial User means any of the following: a not-for-profit organization established under the laws of Illinois or another state; an organization exempt under Section 501(c) 3 of the Internal Revenue Code; a municipality, county or unit of local government of the State of Illinois, the State of Illinois and its departments or agencies; or an educational institution such as a college, university, or public or private secondary or college preparatory school.

<u>Open GIS Data means all legally distributable orthoimagery, oblique imagery, planimetry datasets,</u> hyperspectral imagery, contours and soil data, reference guides for orthoimagery and oblique imagery and any other GIS Data that the Primary Custodian determines appropriate for publishing and is available for downloading from the Open Government Website.

Open Government Website means that Website that is described in Section 2-5 of this Code.

Primary Custodian means a County agency or department that creates, develops or owns GIS Data.

(b) *Internet Access.* All standard hardcopy countywide Maps <u>produced by the County's GIS Department</u> will be placed on the County's website in a .PDF format and available for download free of charge.

(c) *Fees.* GIS Data shall be provided at no charge to Noncommercial Users. <u>To the extent permitted by</u> <u>law, t</u>The Bureau of Technology shall charge fees to any Commercial User for GIS Data as set forth in Section 32-1 of this Code. This subsection (c) shall not apply to Open GIS Data that is downloaded from the Open Government Website.

(d) Annual Increases in Fees. The charges set forth in the GIS fee schedule shall be increased on an annual basis for any GIS Data provided after January 1, 2011. The amount of such increase shall be the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (utilizing the index which includes Cook County) from January 1, 2011, to January 1 of the calendar year in which such GIS Data is being provided. The amount of such increase will be calculated by the Department of Finance.

(e) *Deposit of Fees.* All fees from sales of GIS Data shall be deposited in the GIS special use fund described in Section 2-214 of the Cook County Code of Ordinances.

(f) *Authorized Uses of GIS Data*. Commercial Users are authorized to utilize the GIS Data in furtherance of its commercial enterprise by incorporating the GIS Data with other data compiled or provided by the Commercial User in programs, packages or data created by the Commercial User and providing access to and use of such programs, packages or data to others (including Internet access) in the conduct of the Commercial User's business. All other uses of GIS Data are prohibited.

Noncommercial Users may use GIS Data only for charitable, educational or research purposes and not for the purpose of furthering a commercial enterprise. Noncommercial Users may permit access to and use of the data only by individuals employed or otherwise authorized by the Noncommercial User to perform such research or accomplish such purpose on behalf of the Noncommercial User. All uses of the data not specifically permitted by this subsection are prohibited to Noncommercial Users.

Except for the authorized uses of GIS Data set forth above in this subsection, commercial and Noncommercial Users are prohibited from duplicating, copying or publishing (including publishing on the internet)

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all or a substantial portion of any GIS Data, or transferring, distributing or providing all or a substantial portion of any GIS Data to any other person or entity; provided that this restriction does not apply to Open GIS Data.

(g) *No Representations or Warranties.* The provision of GIS Data by the County shall not constitute a representation or warranty by the County, its commissioners, employees, independently elected officials and any officer or agent affiliated with the County (collectively, "County and Agents") that any GIS Data is accurate, complete or suitable for the purposes of the user and the County and Agents expressly disclaims any and all liability arising from the inaccuracy, incompleteness or unsuitability of any GIS Data, which is provided on an "as is" basis.

(h) *Transaction Database*. The Bureau of Technology shall develop an online interactive database through which all requests and payments for GIS Data disseminated by the Bureau of Technology may be accomplished. The Bureau of Technology is authorized to develop appropriate forms and promulgate reasonable rules, regulations and policies to effectuate the provisions of this ordinance.

(i) *Primary Custodians not Restricted*. This Ordinance shall not be construed to restrict or abridge the rights of any Primary Custodian to sell, lease, or otherwise disseminate data such Primary Custodian produces regardless of whether such data is ultimately synthesized to form a part of GIS Data.

(j) Open GIS Data to Be Available. The County's Chief Information Officer shall publish all Open GIS Data to the Open Government Website.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 32 Fees, Section 32-1 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Summary: Under this intergovernmental agreement, the Illinois Housing Development Authority (IHDA) will operate a toll-free housing counseling helpline service and manage and administer housing counseling services as a part of the Circuit Court's Mortgage Foreclosure Mediation Program. IHDA's helpline provides critical information to families facing foreclosure, assigns families to a HUD-certified housing counseling agency, and schedules housing counseling workshops and appointments for families. counseling services Housing are provided county-wide by IHDA's 12 HUD-certified subcontractors which were selected after a rigorous application process. Services provided by the subcontractors include: housing counseling workshops; one-on-one housing counseling with families; assistance with applying for loan modifications; and identifying other options to avoid foreclosure whenever possible. As of 9/30/2013, IHDA's subcontractors assisted more than 130,000 families through the helpline, provided over 30,000 families with free one-on-one initial housing counseling sessions, conducted and more than 200 housing counseling workshops throughout Cook County at which almost 6,000 families received assistance. Each family receives an average of four, one-on-one counseling sessions.

The Illinois Housing Development Authority was originally selected to manage the program's hotline and counseling services with the initiation of the Mortgage Foreclosure Mediation Program in March 2010. A request for proposal (RFP) was completed for these services earlier this year; IHDA provided the only proposal to the programs' hotline and counseling services components.

WHEREAS, despite the Prisoner Release Order, the CCDOC has been at or near capacity for most of 2013, its highest level in eight years, at an average cost of \$143 a day per pre-trial detainee; and

WHEREAS, the current Prisoner Release Order has had limited impact on reducing the jail population; and

WHEREAS, the parties to the litigation, intend to present a "Parties' Joint Motion for Modification of the Prisoner Release Order" requesting that the Prisoner Release Order be administered by the Offices of the President of the Cook County Board rather than the Sheriff; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County Board President and the Cook County Commissioners are primarily responsible for the fiscal stability of the County and are willing to devote appropriate resources to modify the Prisoner Release Order to reduce the population of the Cook County Jail.

AMENDMENT TO JUVENILE TEMPORARY DETENTION CENTER ADVISORY BOARD

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2 Administration, Article VI Boards, Commissions and Committees, Division 2 Juvenile Temporary Detention Center Advisory Board, Section 2-511 through 2-520 of the Cook County Code are hereby amended as follows:

ARTICLE VI. BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES

DIVISION 2 JUVENILE TEMPORARY DETENTION CENTER ADVISORY BOARD

Sec. 2-511. Short title.

This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "Ordinance Establishing the Cook County Juvenile Temporary Detention Center Advisory Board."

Sec. 2-512. Purpose of the Juvenile Temporary Detention Center Advisory Board.

The purpose of the Advisory Board is to establish an advocacy and resource group to provide public recommendations to the Executive Director of the Juvenile Temporary Detention Center ("JTDC"), the Chief Judge, the County Board and the President on matters relating to the policies and operations of the JTDC.

Sec. 2-513. Declaration.

(a) The County Board hereby establishes the Cook County Juvenile Temporary Detention Center Advisory Board ("Advisory Board"). The County Board hereby finds and declares that the Advisory Board shall provide, but not limited to, the following:

- (1) Make public recommendations to the, Executive Director of the JTDC, the Chief Judge, the County Board and the President regarding administrative policies and procedures for operating the JTDC. The JTDC Advisory Board shall provide the Chief Judge and President all documented recommendations prior to their public release, thirty days thereafter, the public recommendations shall be sent to the Executive Director of the JTDC and the Cook County Board.
- (2) Provide a public recommendations to maximize the use of existing resources at the JTDC. The JTDC Advisory Board shall provide the Chief Judge and President all documented recommendations prior to their public release, thirty days thereafter, the public recommendations shall be sent to the Executive Director of the JTDC and the Cook County Board.

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- (3) Provide public recommendations regarding the educational, physical, social, and psychological needs of the population. The JTDC Advisory Board shall provide the Chief Judge and President all documented recommendations prior to their public release, thirty days thereafter, the public recommendations shall be sent to the Executive Director of the JTDC and the Cook County Board.
- (4) Establish public performance measures to track and measure the achievement of the JTDC's mission. The JTDC Advisory Board shall provide the Chief Judge and President all documented recommendations prior to their public release, thirty days thereafter, the public recommendations shall be sent to the Executive Director of the JTDC and the Cook County Board.
- (5) Provide public recommendations as needed to ensure the general health, mental health, educational, physical, social and psychological needs of the population at the JTDC are being recognized and addressed. The JTDC Advisory Board shall provide the Chief Judge and President all documented recommendations prior to their public release, thirty days thereafter, the public recommendations shall be sent to the Executive Director of the JTDC and the Cook County Board.

Sec. 2-514. Definitions.

For purposes of this article, the following words or terms shall have the meaning or construction ascribed to them in this section:

Advisory Board means the <u>nine (9)</u> <u>eleven (11)</u> member board charged with providing public recommendations to the Executive Director of the JTDC, the Chief Judge, the County Board and the President on all matters relating to the policies and operations of the JTDC.

Chairperson means the chairperson of the Juvenile Temporary Detention Center Advisory Board.

County Board means the Board of Commissioners of Cook County, Illinois.

Member means a member of the Advisory Board.

Ordinance means the Ordinance Establishing the Cook County Juvenile Temporary Detention Center Advisory Board Ordinance, as amended.

President means the President of the Board of Commissioners of Cook County, Illinois.

Sec. 2-515. Establishment of the Cook County Juvenile Temporary Detention Center Advisory Board ("Advisory Board").

(a) The Advisory Board is hereby created and established. The Advisory Board shall consist of $\frac{1}{1}$ eleven (11) members called "Members." The purpose of the Advisory Board is to establish an advocacy and resource group to provide public recommendations to the Executive Director of the JTDC, the Chief Judge, the County Board and the President on matters relating to the policies and operations of the Juvenile Temporary Detention Center.

Sec. 2-516. Members of the JTDC Advisory Board.

(a) *General.* The appointed Members shall receive no compensation for their service, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses while serving on the JTDC Advisory Board. Pursuant to the relevant legal requirements regarding juvenile records, medical records, mental health records or any other law regulating sensitive and/or personal information, Members shall keep any and all such information confidential.

(b) *Number of Members.* There shall be nine (9) eleven (11) Members of the JTDC Advisory Board.

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(c) Appointment of Members. One of the Nine eleven Members shall be an Ex-Officio Member; the ex-officio Member shall be a Cook County Board Commissioner, the ex-officio Member shall be a joint appointment of the President and Chief Judge. The ex-officio Member shall be a voting Member of the JTDC Advisory Board. The ex-officio Member shall serve as a liaison between the County Board and the JTDC Advisory Board. The eight (8) ten (10) remaining Members may be appointed by the President and the Chief Judge as follows;

- (1) Ex Officio Member. The ex officio Member shall be a voting Member of the JTDC Advisory Board. The Cook County Board Commissioner ex-officio Member shall serve as a liaison between the County Board and the JTDC Advisory Board.
- (12) Five Members are to be appointed by the President and five Members may be appointed by the Chief Judge, Members may include youth community advocates, youth development experts, educators, mental health specialists, physicians, and attorneys to ensure that the various needs of this population are recognized and served. One of the Members appointed by the President shall be a young adult. The Members appointed by the President and the Chief Judge, may include youth community advocates, youth development experts, educators, mental health specialists, physicians, and attorneys to ensure that the various needs of this population are recognized and served.
- (23) The Cook County Justice Advisory Council shall solicit and accept written nominations of interested and qualified persons to sit on the JTDC Advisory Board within 60 days of approval and adoption of this ordinance. Within 45 days thereafter, the Chair of the Cook County Justice Advisory Council shall submit all applicants to the President and the Chief Judge in writing for consideration. Nominated candidates shall at a minimum satisfy the qualifications listed in Section 2-517. The President shall then appoint five (5) individuals from the list of nominees to serve on the JTDC Advisory Board, and the Chief Judge may appoint five (5) from the list of nominees to serve on the JTDC Advisory Board. For appointments to the JTDC Advisory that would occur post December 3, 2013, the President and Chief Judge may accept nominations or solicit and accept written applications from interested and qualified persons to sit on the JTDC Advisory Board directly; however, said applicants or nominees shall at a minimum satisfy the qualifications listed in Section 2-517; Advisory Board Appointments occurring post December 3, 2013 shall be subject to confirmation by the County Board.
- (34) Should a nominee recommended for appointment by the President or Chief Judge withdraw prior to being confirmed, be rescinded by the appointing authority prior to confirmation or should the nominee recommended for appointment be rejected by the County Board, the President and/or the Chief Judge depending on the appointing authority may submit additional nominations to the County Board for consideration within 60 (sixty) days following withdrawal, rescission or rejection by the County Board. Should a nominee withdraw, the President and the Chief Judge may request the Cook County Justice Advisory Council submit additional nominations to the President and Chief Judge in writing for consideration.

(d) Any unfilled initial Member positions as of December 3, 2013 that are subject to appointment by the President or Chief Judge (including the ex-officio Member) must be nominated for appointment to the County Board by the appropriate appointing authority by February 19, 2014. If by February 20, 2014 nominees for any unfilled initial Member terms have not been submitted to the County Board for consideration, the County Board shall appoint any remaining initial Members, including the ex-officio Member, for the JTDC Advisory Board as follows:

(1) The Chair of the Cook County Criminal Justice Committee will immediately begin to solicit and accept written nominations of interested and qualified persons to sit on the Advisory Board.

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(2)Within 45 days thereafter, the Cook County Criminal Justice Committee will review and approve nominees and submit them for consideration at the next immediately scheduled Cook County Board Meeting.

- (<u>e</u>d) Terms of Members.
- (1) *Ex-Officio Member.*
 - a. The President's and Chief Judge's Cook County Board Commissioner ex-officio Member shall serve as their County Board appointment for the length of the Commissioner's term. Upon an appointment or election change for the representative from the County Board, the President and Chief Judge may provide notice to the County Board and the JTDC Advisory Board of any such change in ex-officio member appointment.
- (2) *The remaining Members.* The remaining ten (10) eight (8) Members of the JTDC Advisory Board shall serve terms as follows
 - a. For the initial Members,
 - 1. One (1) of the Members appointed by the President, other than the ex-officio Member, shall serve a term that expires on June 30, 2013.
 - 2. <u>Two (2)</u> One (1) of the Members appointed by the Chief Judge, other than the ex-officio Member, shall serve a term that expires on <u>December 30, 2014</u>. June 30, 2013.
 - 3. <u>Two (2)</u> One (1) of the Members appointed by the President other than the ex-officio Member, shall serve a term that expires on June 30, 2014.
 - 4. One (1) of the Members appointed by the Chief Judge, other than the ex-officio Member, shall serve a term that expires on <u>December 30, 2015</u>. June 30, 2014.
 - 5. Two (2) of the Members appointed by the President other than the ex-officio Member, shall serve terms that expire on June 30, 2015.
 - 6. Two (2) of the Members appointed by the Chief Judge, other than the ex-officio Member, shall serve terms that expire on <u>December 30, 2016</u>. June 30, 2015
 - b. Thereafter, all Members other than the ex-officio member appointed shall serve a term of three (3) years.
 - 1. Each appointed Member, whether Initial or subsequent, shall hold office until a successor is appointed.
 - 2. Any appointed Member who is appointed to fill a vacancy, other than a vacancy caused by the expiration of the predecessor's term, shall serve until the expiration of his or her predecessor's term.
- (<u>fe</u>) *Vacancy*. A vacancy shall occur upon the:
- (1) Expiration of Member's term,

- (2) Resignation,
- (3) Death,
- (4) Conviction of a felony, or
- (5) Removal from the office of an appointed Member as set forth in paragraph (\underline{g}) of this section.

(gf) Removal of Members. A JTDC Advisory Board Member may be removed for good cause by the President or Chief Judge. Good cause includes inefficiency, neglect of duty, malfeasance, or any cause which renders the Member unfit for the position or unable to perform the duties of the position. The President or Chief Judge shall provide written notice to that Member, the Executive Director of the JTDC, and the County Board of the proposed removal of that Member from the <u>Advisory Board</u> office; such notice shall state the specific grounds which constitute cause for removal. The Member, in receipt of such notice, may request to appear before the County Board and present reasons in support of his or her retention. Thereafter, the County Board shall vote upon whether there are sufficient grounds to remove that Member from office. The President or Chief Judge shall notify the subject Member of the final action of the County Board.

Sec. 2-517. Qualifications of Members.

(a) The ten (10) eight (8) Members nominated, by the Cook County Justice Advisory Council and appointed by the President and the Chief Judge, may be comprised of persons with expertise in youth development, education, law enforcement, juvenile probation, juvenile corrections, mental health, substance abuse, including, but not limited to, physicians and attorneys.

- (ab) Criteria to be considered in nominating or appointing individuals to serve as Members shall include:
- (1) Background and skills needed on the JTDC Advisory Board;
- (2) Resident of Cook County, Illinois;
- (3) Availability and willingness to attend a minimum of <u>four (4)</u> nine JTDC Advisory Board meetings annually; and
- (4) Willingness to acquire the knowledge and skills required to advise on complex juvenile detention center issues.

(<u>be</u>) <u>Ability and willingness to:</u><u>Duties of individual Members include, but are not necessarily limited to,</u> the following:

- (1) Promptly relate community input to the JTDC Advisory Board;
- (2) Learn sufficient details about JTDC management and operations in order to effectively evaluate proposed actions and reports; and
- (3) Accept and fulfill reasonable assignments from the Chairperson of the JTDC Advisory Board.

Sec. 2-518. Chairperson/officers of the Advisory Board.

(a) The Members shall select the initial Chairperson of the JTDC Advisory Board from among the initial Members. The Chairperson shall serve a one-year term and, thereafter, the JTDC Advisory Board shall annually elect a chairperson from among the Members.

- (1) The Chairperson shall preside at meetings of the JTDC Advisory Board, and is entitled to vote on all matters before the JTDC Advisory Board.
- (2) A Member may be elected to serve successive terms as Chairperson.

Sec. 2-519. Meetings of the JTDC Advisory Board.

(a) The President shall call the first meeting of the JTDC Advisory Board, after consultation with the Chief Judge. Thereafter, the Members shall prescribe the times and places for their meetings and the manner in which regular and special meetings may be called.

(b) Meetings shall be held at the call of the Chairperson, however, no less than \underline{six} (6) $\underline{12}$ meetings shall be held annually.

(c) A majority of the voting Members shall constitute a quorum. Recommendations of the JTDC Advisory Board shall require the affirmative vote of a majority of the voting members of the JTDC Advisory Board present and voting at the meeting at which the action is taken.

(d) To the extent feasible, the JTDC Advisory Board shall provide for and encourage participation by the public in the development and review of recommendations for JTDC. The JTDC Advisory Board may hold public hearings as it deems appropriate to the performance of any of its responsibilities.

(e) The JTDC Advisory Board shall comply in all respects with the Open Meetings Act, as now or hereafter amended, and found at 5 ILCS 120/1, et seq.

(f) The JTDC Advisory Board shall be subject to the Local Records Act, as now or hereafter amended, and found at 50 ILCS 205/1, et seq.

.Sec. 2-520. Annual report of the JTDC Advisory Board.

(a) The JTDC Advisory Board shall submit to the Executive Director of the JTDC, the Chief Judge, the Board of Commissioners and the President an annual report prior to the end of the Cook County fiscal year. The JTDC Advisory Board shall provide the Chief Judge the annual report prior to its public release, thirty days thereafter, the public recommendations shall be sent to the Executive Director of the JTDC, the Cook County Board and the President.

(b) Included in the report shall be any recommendations for additional legislation or other action which may be necessary to carry out the mission, purpose and intent of the JTDC.

Effective date: This Ordinance Amendment shall be effective immediately upon approval and adoption. This ordinance shall take effect 90 days after approval and adoption.
