THE HONORABLE LARRY SUFFREDIN, COUNTY COMMISSIONER

COMMEMORATING THE LIFE, MANY ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND MEMORY OF THE HONORABLE WILLIAM "NED" LAUTERBACH

WHEREAS, William "Ned" Lauterbach, an extraordinary man and visionary leader who was dedicated to social justice, family and community died at the age of 92. He has left behind a devoted family, countless friends and a community profoundly enriched for having known him; and

WHEREAS, William "Ned" Lauterbach was born to American parents in Warsaw, Poland, where his father was on assignment for the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) helping resettle World War I refugees. When William "Ned" Lauterbach was two (2), the family moved to Kewanee, Illinois, where William "Ned" Lauterbach grew up and graduated from high school; and

WHEREAS, William "Ned" Lauterbach grew up during the Depression, for recreation the family spent their spare time camping and traveling to National Parks all over the country. The experience left him with a life-long love of the outdoors and a reverence for America's system of public lands, a love he eagerly shared and passed on to his children; and

WHEREAS, William "Ned" Lauterbach attended Antioch College where he met his wife of sixty-seven (67) years, Alberta. William "Ned" Lauterbach and Alberta spent a lifetime being devoted to one another. She was every bit his equal in her accomplishments and contributions; her death in 2012 devastated him; and

WHEREAS, his years spent at Antioch College framed William "Ned" Lauterbach's world view. He noted on more than one (1) occasion that his time there had a major influence on the direction that he took in life. He credited Antioch College's externship program for "opening his eyes" to the shocking realities of segregation; and

WHEREAS, William "Ned" Lauterbach and his wife Alberta raised five (5) children, first in the Chicago neighborhood of Rogers Park and later in the City of Evanston where they became treasured community leaders and neighbors; and

WHEREAS, William "Ned" Lauterbach's first job was with Armour Research Foundation. He worked there while completing his graduate studies in engineering at the Illinois Institute of Technology. Later, he worked as a sales manager and engineer for Dole Refrigerating Company, where he earned several patents for designs of truck refrigeration units. Later when Dole left the region, he worked for Douglas & Lomason. He belonged to the American Society of Heating, Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Engineers; and

WHEREAS, William "Ned" Lauterbach was a tireless community volunteer and leader. He was President of the Y's Men's Club at the High Ridge Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) in Rogers Park. He ran the organization's annual Christmas tree sale, and got the entire family involved in Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) activities, earning them "Family of the Year" in 1960; and

WHEREAS, William "Ned" Lauterbach was first elected Alderman to represent the Third Ward in the Evanston City Council in 1975. As Alderman, William "Ned" Lauterbach helped create the City's first Department of Human Services. During his years in the Evanston City Council, he and his fellow Aldermen guided the community through difficult and weighty issues - race relations, development, zoning, budgeting, condo conversion, social services and rent control; and

WHEREAS, William "Ned" Lauterbach served in the Evanston City Council from 1975 to 1983. It was his role as Alderman of the Third Ward that gave him the opportunity for what he would later call the proudest achievement of his life. The City was about to sell off Noyes Elementary School to private developers; enrollment in the City had declined and the building was deemed beyond repair. He proposed renovating the historic building and turning it into a community arts center. Ned worked tirelessly to bring in the money necessary to make this vision a reality. Now, forty-five (45) years later, the Noyes Cultural Arts Center remains a vibrant hub of the arts in Evanston; and

WHEREAS, Alderman William "Ned" Lauterbach used his engineering and analytic skills to help the City tackle another of its enduring problems, flooding. William "Ned" Lauterbach was appointed the First Chairman of Evanston's Flood and Pollution Control Commission which oversaw a \$200 million public works project that completely overhauled the City sewer system. He headed the Commission for all eight (8) years of his two (2) terms as Alderman and continued to serve for seventeen (17) more years as a citizen member. After almost thirty (30) years, when the commission was dissolved, the City of Evanston honored him with a commemorative plaque; and

WHEREAS, after opting against a third term, William "Ned" Lauterbach continued to serve his community working with numerous community organizations. He served on the Board of Youth Organizations Umbrella (Y.O.U) and Housing Options for the Mentally III in Evanston; and

WHEREAS, William "Ned" Lauterbach forged strong bonds with his fellow Aldermen that outlasted their terms of office and spanned decades. They gathered once a month until William "Ned" Lauterbach was well into his 90s, meeting socially to talk about everything from Evanston politics to their grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, William "Ned" Lauterbach and his wife were ardent Democrats and are widely credited with founding the Democratic Party of Evanston, one (1) of the foremost Democratic organizations in the State; and

WHEREAS, William "Ned" Lauterbach was a legendary outdoorsman who had a daily three (3) mile walk regimen that he maintained well into his 80s. He was a backpacking enthusiast who took dozens of trips with family and friends over the years, exploring every major mountain range in the country; and

WHEREAS, because of their lifetime of commitment to the community, William "Ned" Lauterbach and his wife were recognized in 2010 with an Evanston City Council Resolution designating the 700 block of Forest Avenue as "Lauterbach Way"; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the community he loved and served William "Ned" Lauterbach will be sorely missed by his five (5) children, Steve (Cathy Hobson), Stew (Barb Swary), Chris, Katherine "Kacki" (Rick Grant), Amy (James Yurchenco) and his four (4) grandchildren, Claire Grant, Eric Lauterbach, Jack Grant of Boulder and Nathan Lauterbach.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of Cook County that the Board on behalf of the nearly the 5.2 million residents of Cook County commemorates the life of William "Ned" Lauterbach, and herewith expresses its sincere gratitude for the invaluable contributions he has made to the Citizens of Cook County, Illinois; and does hereby offer its deepest condolences and most heartfelt sympathy to the family, and many friends of William "Ned" Lauterbach and joins them in sorrow at the loss of this remarkable and accomplished civil servant and community leader; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this text be spread upon the official proceedings of this Honorable Body and a suitable copy of same be tendered to the family of William "Ned" Lauterbach that his memory may be so honored.

HONORING LA CASA NORTE & SOL FLORES

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Cook County Board of Commissioners that La Casa Norte was cofounded by Keith Decker and Peter McQueen in 2002 as a non-profit organization, and under the leadership of founding executive director Sol Flores, a Chicago native and with a long history of community engagement who's served on the boards to the Latino Policy Forum, Bickerdike Redevelopment Corporation, Heartland Housing Corporation, the Chicago Low Income Housing Trust Fund and Alliance to End Homelessness in Suburban Cook County, Protestants for the Common Good and Kuumba Lynx; and

WHEREAS, in 2003, La Casa Norte began a capital campaign to make Solid Ground Supportive Housing Program, one (1) of Chicago's first housing projects serving homeless males ages 16-21, a reality. Shortly after, La Casa Norte also received an award of \$400,000 for capital and operating expenses from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. This seed money paved the way for other funding opportunities to develop and La Casa Norte began to see an influx of support from various foundations, churches, and individuals who believed in the mission of serving youth and families confronting homelessness; and

WHEREAS, in 2005, La Casa Norte continued to grow and began construction of Solid Ground and La Casa Norte's third program, Esperanza Trabajando, providing free career and educational assistance to ex-offenders, limited English speakers and those without a high school diploma or General Education Development (GED); and

WHEREAS, in 2006, La Casa Norte opened Solid Ground and continued to gain recognition and support for its leadership and work within the community, Sol Flores, Executive Director, received the inaugural Ruby Slipper Award for leadership and advocacy from Mayor Richard M. Daley on behalf of the City of Chicago's Plan to End Homelessness; and

WHEREAS, in 2012, as it celebrated its ten (10) year anniversary, La Casa Norte was honored by the White House and continued to receive countless of other awards and accolades as it worked towards building a new 55,000 square feet facility with twenty-five (25) units of housing, a wellness center, a training center, tutoring services, a conference space and an arts center, all housed at 3533 West North Avenue in the Humboldt Park community; and

WHEREAS, since opening its Crisis Center Program with two (2) employees, a bold mission, and hope for the future, today boasts over eighty (80) staff members, an annual budget of \$4.5M while serving 2,600 households with multiple services including housing programs, such as: emergency, transitional and permanent housing for youth and families and service programs, such as: homelessness prevention, education and employment counseling, drop in centers, food, clothing and toiletries.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cook County Board of Commissioners does, hereby congratulate and recognize La Casa Norte and Sol Flores for their work and service of homeless youth and their families, and honors them for their dedication to and service of Cook County's homeless community; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this text be spread upon the official proceedings of this Honorable Body, and an official copy of same be presented to La Casa Norte.

CONGRATULATING THE OAK PARK RIVER FOREST HIGH SCHOOL WRESTLING TEAM ON WINNING THEIR SECOND CONSECUTIVE CLASS 3A STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

WHEREAS, on February 28, 2015 the wrestling team of Oak Park and River Forest (OPRF) High School, the Huskies, repeated as Class 3A State Champions, defeating Sandburg High School 39-16 in the final of the Illinois High School Association (IHSA) Dual Team Tournament at U.S. Cellular Coliseum in Bloomington; and

WHEREAS, in 2014 the Huskies edged Marist 31-22 to claim the 3A dual-team tourney title and also produced four (4) individual State Champions in Davonte Mahomes, Isaiah White, Larry Early and Kamal Bey and ten (10) All-State student wrestlers overall; and

WHEREAS, the Huskies have won three (3) State Championships over the last seven (7) years, including two (2) undefeated teams (28-0 this season; 24-0 in 2009); and

WHEREAS, season, Oak Park and River Forest (OPRF) High School went 29-1 in dual matches en route to a State Championship in 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Huskies also own a forty-two (42) dual-match winning streak; and

WHEREAS, nationally, Oak Park and River Forest (OPRF) High School finished as the top-ranked team in the country per several high school wrestling websites, such as InterMat, Flo Wrestling and Open Mat; and

WHEREAS, Huskie student wrestlers Larry Early and Isaiah White individually closed the season at 30-2 and 42-0, respectively; and

WHEREAS, Huskie student wrestler Isaiah White produced an undefeated season as the nation's top-ranked wrestler at 152 pounds, highlighted by his title in mid-December at the prestigious Walsh Ironman tournament hosted by Walsh Jesuit High School in Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, Oak Park and River Forest (OPRF) High School junior and Huskie student wrestler Jason Renteria captured perfectly the essence of the success of the Huskie wrestling program when he said, "We don't wrestle for ourselves, we wrestle for each other. Our team is so close. A lot of us wrestled together when we were younger and we do a lot of things together like team dinners. We dominated at State and I can't wait to come back next season and try to make more history".

HONORING THE MEMORY OF PETER J. TRACZYK, FORMER SCHOOL BOARD PRESIDENT AND BOARD MEMBER, DISTRICT 97, OAK PARK, JUNE 29, 1966 - FEBRUARY 7, 2015

WHEREAS, the President and Commissioners of the Cook County Board are saddened to learn of the death of Peter J. Traczyk of Oak Park, who passed away unexpectedly on February 7, 2015; and

PROTECTING ACCESS TO COMPREHENSIVE REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH CARD AND SUPPORTING INCREASED FUNDING LEVELS

WHEREAS, women need access to safe, affordable, and comprehensive reproductive health care throughout their lives, including screening for cancer and sexually transmitted infections, contraceptive services, abortion care, prenatal care and labor and delivery services; and

WHEREAS, reproductive health is a vital component of a woman's overall health, and reproductive freedom is vital to a woman's safety, well-being and ability to participate equally in society; and

WHEREAS, on January 22, 1973, the U.S. Supreme Court, in a historic and landmark decision, ruled in *Roe v*. *Wade* that the U.S. Constitution safeguards a woman's ability to make her own personal medical decisions about when or whether to have children; and

WHEREAS, that decision has allowed women to participate more fully in society, saved lives, and strengthened families and we must always guard against efforts to deliberately erode the availability and affordability of abortion and undermine the protections provided by *Roe v. Wade*; and

WHEREAS, the majority of Americans continue to support safe legal abortion; and

WHEREAS, Federal and State laws that place obstacles in the paths of women seeking abortion care take away the ability of those women to make decisions and threaten the health of families; and

WHEREAS, one (1) such restriction is the Hyde Amendment, passed by Congress on September 30, 1976, which for nearly thirty-nine (39) years has impeded access to abortion care for low-income women enrolled in Medicaid; and

WHEREAS, Medicaid coverage for abortion care has a significant effect on low-income women's ability to decide to end an unwanted pregnancy, and in the absence of such coverage many women are unable to obtain an abortion; and

RESOLUTION URGING COOK COUNTY FIRST RESPONDERS, LAW ENFORCEMENT AND HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS TO TRAIN AND EQUIP THEIR PERSONNEL WITH NALOXONE

WHEREAS, the use of heroin and the abuse of prescription opioids has been detrimental to the public health of Cook County. In 2013, opioid abuse has led to 383 deaths in Cook County. Of these deaths, 234 were related to heroin overdoses; and

WHEREAS, heroin is a highly addictive and deadly drug and is the most abused opiate in the Chicago area. In 2010, Chicago metropolitan hospitals recorded 24,360 admissions where heroin use was mentioned as a contributing factor. New York ranked second with 12,226 heroin mentions in a five (5) borough analysis during the same period; and

WHEREAS, according to U.S. Senator Mark Kirk's, October 6, 2014 press release, "Kirk Launches Suburban Anti-Heroin Task Force," 390 people have died as a result of heroin overdoses in Lake, McHenry, Kane, DuPage, Kendall and Will County since 2012; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that in Chicago in 2009, opioid misuse and abuse resulted in 1,080 emergency room visits; and

WHEREAS, it is reported that 2.4 million people nationwide are addicted to opiates. The 2012 National Survey

on Drug Use and Health, conducted by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, found that heroin use increased by 67.3% from 2002 to 2012 among persons aged twelve (12) years and older; and

WHEREAS, the administration of the life saving drug naloxone can successfully reverse the effects of opioid overdose and save lives; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Attorney General Eric Holder has urged federal law enforcement agencies to train and equip personnel who might interact with heroin overdose victims with naloxone; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Senator Mark Kirk has launched an Anti-Heroin Taskforce, comprised of State's Attorneys and Coroners from Cook, Lake, DuPage, Will, McHenry, Kendall and Kane counties, to raise awareness of the risk of heroin and prescription drug abuse; and

WHEREAS, first responders, law enforcement, and healthcare members have been trained and equipped with naloxone in the surrounding counties of DuPage, Kane, Lake and Will. Many responders having successfully administered the drug, saving numerous lives.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cook County Board of Commissioners support Senator Kirk's efforts and encourage first responders, law enforcement, and healthcare professionals in the County of Cook to train and equip their members with naloxone, as soon as possible, in order for them to save individuals at risk of opioid overdose.

For items approved pursuant to a voice vote, a Member may record a vote of "present" or "no" for a particular Resolution by filing a notice with the Clerk to be included in the Journal of Proceedings within twenty-four (24) hours of the end of the meeting.

- (2) Draft copies of the Journal of Proceedings shall be circulated to the President and the Board within twenty-one (21) days of the meeting for review and correction.
- (3) All corrections shall be made to the Clerk in writing within forty-eight (48) hours of receiving the Draft Copy of the Journal of Proceedings.
- (4) A standing meeting of the Committee on Rules and Administration at 9:45 a.m. on the days of regularly scheduled Board Meetings shall be convened to approve the Journal with all corrections.
- (5) The Board shall approve the Report of the Committee on Rules and Administration at the subsequent Board Meeting.

Effective date: This Ordinance Amendment shall be in effect immediately upon adoption.

WHEREAS, the opiate/heroin crisis in Illinois calls for practical public health and public safety solutions, including broad-based and coordinated prevention, intervention and treatment strategies; and

WHEREAS, Cook County, as with the whole region, has a growing opiate/heroin addiction problem; and

WHEREAS, opiate/heroin addiction costs Cook County millions of dollars in healthcare and public safety spending yearly; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County Department of Corrections processes 200-300 individuals per day, houses over 8,000 detainees at any given time and sees more than 100,000 admissions per year; and

WHEREAS, seventy-four percent (74%) of these detainees screen positive for various types of drug use; and

WHEREAS, the Cermak Health Services manages over 500 opiate/heroin detoxes a month; and

WHEREAS, many detainees have multiple opiate/heroin detoxes in a year after multiple admissions; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County Health and Hospital System treats opiate/heroin addiction cases on a daily bases; and

WHEREAS, Cook County as a leader in healthcare and public safety can establish cost effective treatments for opiate addiction; and

WHEREAS, House Bill 1, which was recently introduced in the Illinois General Assembly, is the result of a statewide legislative task force that has studied opiate/heroin addiction and treatment options; and

WHEREAS, House Bill 1 would require increased resources and training for responding to opiate/heroin overdoses and addiction; and

WHEREAS, there are a number of methods to treat opiate/heroin addiction including Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved medications to those with opiate/heroin addiction; and

WHEREAS, a variety of behavioral therapies can be effective at treating opiate/heroin addiction when combined with appropriate medications; and

WHEREAS, it is critical to understand that opiate/heroin addiction is a treatable disease.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cook County Board of Commissioners does hereby request that a meeting of the Legislation and Intergovernmental Relations Committee be convened to discuss the cost of opiate/heroin abuse on the health and well-being of Cook County Citizens and the impact on the Cook County Criminal Justice System and Cook County Health and Hospital System; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Cook County Board of Commissioners does hereby request that a representative of the Cook County Sheriff and the Cook County Health and Hospital System present testimony on the cost and treatment options for opiate/heroin addiction at the Cook County Jail and the John H. Stroger, Jr. Hospital Emergency Room; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that testimony should be presented at the Committee hearing in regard to the manner in which opiate/heroin affects the brain and the resultant behavior and the role that pharmacological interventions play in the treatment of opiate/heroin addiction and cost effective treatment.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 46 OF THE COOK COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES CONCERNING "LAW ENFORCEMENT" BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 46-38 PROHIBITING THE USE OF CHOKE HOLDS BY COOK COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

WHEREAS, the County of Cook is a Home Rule Unit of Government pursuant to the 1970 Illinois Constitution, Article VII, Section 6; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to its home rule power the County of Cook may exercise any power and perform any function relating to its government and affairs, including the power to regulate for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare; and

WHEREAS, Cook County Police Officers and those public servants under the direction of the Cook County Sheriff strive to maintain a courteous and professional demeanor when dealing with the public, in addition to and including individuals detained in Cook County Jail and the Juvenile Temporary Detention Center; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County Sheriff trains his officers to select the appropriate level of force based on a subject's actions, and to modify their selection of options as the subject offers less or greater resistance; and

WHEREAS, choke holds are largely ineffective and create the potential for a subject to panic and react with greater resistance than he or she otherwise might deploy during an officer restraint; and

WHEREAS, the children in the Juvenile Temporary Detention Center, due to their ages, are not as likely to appreciate the consequences of impulsively resistant behavior in the same manner as an adult inmate; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Commissioners of Cook County intend to codify the Cook County Sheriff's commitment to a progressive and reasonable escalation and de-escalation of officer-applied force into the County Codes and Ordinances, and further intend to expressly prohibit the use of choke holds by Cook County police officers as well as any private security personnel employed by Cook County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF COOK COUNTY:

Section 1. The above recitals are expressly incorporated herein and made part hereof as though fully set forth herein.

Section 2. Chapter 46-38 of the Cook County Code of Ordinances concerning "Law Enforcement" is hereby enacted as follows:

Sec. 46-38 Policy on Use of Force- choke holds prohibited

(a) Members of the Cook County Sheriff's Department and Cook County police officers as well as any private security personnel employed by Cook County shall use an amount of force reasonably necessary based on the totality of the circumstances to perform a lawful task, effect an arrest, overcome resistance, control a subject or protect themselves or others from injury. Circumstances that may govern the reasonableness of using a particular force option include but are not limited to: (1) whether the subject poses an immediate threat to the safety of officers or others; and (2) whether the subject is actively resisting arrest or attempting to evade arrest by flight.

(b) After gaining control of a subject, members of the Cook County Sheriff's Department and Cook County police officers as well as any private security personnel employed by Cook County shall:

- (1) Avoid sitting, kneeling or standing on a subject's chest which may result in chest compression, thereby reducing the subject's ability to breathe;
- (2) Position the subject in a manner to allow free breathing and whenever feasible, avoid placing the subject on his or her stomach;
- (3) Monitor an arrestee until transported to a secure location; and
- (4) Seek medical attention for an arrestee who has injuries or illnesses consistent with Sheriff's Department Policy Directives.

(c) No Cook County Sheriff's Department, Cook County police officer or private security personnel employed by Cook County shall apply a choke hold in the performance of his or her duties unless faced with a situation in which the use of deadly force is justified under applicable law. A choke hold shall include but is not limited to, any pressure to the throat or windpipe, which may prevent or hinder breathing or reduce intake of air.

(d) For purposes of this Section the following terms shall have the following meaning:

"*Police Officer*" means any person who by virtue of his or her public employment is vested by law with a duty to maintain public order or make arrests for offenses, whether that duty extends to all offenses or is limited to specific offenses.

"Private Security Personnel" means a person or persons acting in the capacity of his or her employment by a private contractor who engages in the business of providing a private security officer, watchman, patrol, guard dog, canine odor detection or a similar service by any other title or name on a contractual basis for another person, firm, corporation, or other entity for a fee or other consideration and performing one (1) or more of the following functions:

- (1) The prevention or detection of intrusion, entry, theft, vandalism, abuse, fire or trespass on Cook County governmental property or private property within jurisdiction of Cook County law enforcement;
- (2) The prevention, observation or detection of any unauthorized activity on Cook County governmental property or private property within jurisdiction of Cook County law enforcement;
- (3) The protection of persons authorized to be on the premises of the person, firm, or other entity for which the security contractor contractually provides security services;
- (4) The prevention of the misappropriation of the concealment of goods, money, stocks, bonds, notes, documents or papers;
- (5) The control, regulation, or direction of the movement of the public for the time specifically required for the protection of the property owned or controlled by the client; and
- (6) The protection of individuals from bodily harm or death (body guard functions).

Effective date: This Ordinance shall be in effect immediately upon adoption.
