**RESOLUTION HONORING
CHICAGO METROPOLITAN AGENCY FOR PLANNING (CMAP)**

WHEREAS, the Chicago Metropolitan Planning Agency (CMAP) was created in 2005 and serves as the official regional planning organization for northeastern Illinois including Cook County; and

WHEREAS, CMAP developed and now guides implementation of the GO TO 2040 comprehensive regional plan that establishes coordinated strategies to help the region's 284 communities address transportation, housing, economic development, open space, the environment, and other quality-of-life issues; and

WHEREAS, CMAP's Local Technical Assistance (LTA) program, initiated with funding from a HUD Sustainable Communities Regional Planning Grant in 2010, provides assistance to communities across the region to undertake planning projects that advance the principles of GO TO 2040; and

WHEREAS, to date, the CMAP LTA program has supported the initiation of 160+ projects with local governments, non-profits, and intergovernmental organizations to address local issues at the intersection of transportation, land use, and housing, including the natural environment, economic growth, and community development; and

WHEREAS, Cook County's Department of Planning and Development submitted a successful application for technical assistance for the development of a new Consolidated Plan and Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy to the CMAP LTA program; and

WHEREAS, CMAP provided related technical assistance between October 2013 and January 2015 valued at \$150,000 and assisted the County in combining both Federally-required strategic plans into a single planning process and action-oriented document known as *Planning for Progress* for the first time in its history and with the encouragement of related Federal funders HUD and EDA; and

WHEREAS, CMAP involvement in *Planning for Progress* helped ensure that the resulting plan was consistent with GO TO 2040, inclusive of extensive data compilation/analysis, facilitated robust stakeholder/public engagement; effectively incorporated related input, and effectively summarized relevant needs, resources, goals, priorities, and strategies; and

WHEREAS, the technical assistance the County received from CMAP related to *Planning for Progress* with full support from and engagement with the Department of Planning and Development within the Bureau of Economic Development, significantly enhanced internal capacity to effectively plan for and conduct outreach related to economic development, affordable housing, and community development; and

WHEREAS, CMAP remains a strong partner for Cook County based on additional technical assistance in support of regional initiatives including efforts to streamline truck permitting as well as support for the Chicago Metro Metals Consortium.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the President and the Cook County Board of Commissioners, on behalf of the Department of Planning and Development and the Bureau of Economic Development as well as the more than five million residents of Cook County, do hereby honor CMAP, celebrate their legacy of comprehensive, targeted, and innovative planning and technical assistance, and hereby express gratitude for their work in service of Cook County; and

THE HONORABLE LUIS ARROYO JR, COUNTY COMMISSIONER

INFANT WELFARE SOCIETY

WHEREAS, in 1900, it was recorded that one out of every ten children died before their first birthday. Following the establishment of the Chicago Milk Commission in 1908, concerned by the alarming infant mortality rate, compassionate nurses, physicians and women throughout Chicago came together in 1911 to voluntarily educate mothers about infant care and to examine vulnerable infants via home visits; thus beginning the creation of the Infant Welfare Society of Chicago (IWS); and

WHEREAS, by 1912, IWS performed 40,000 home visits on an annual basis which directly impacted the reduction of infant mortality rates. In 1913, the Infant Welfare Society Auxiliary was formed to support the work of the organization and its mission. The Auxiliary began their work making home visits, raising funds, and sewing clothes. This work is carried on by the Auxiliary's 750 member body to this day with pledges of further fundraising to offset the maintenance of their environment-friendly facility; and

WHEREAS, IWS was one of the first public health organizations in Chicago to institute mental health services in the 1920s and in 1950, was nationally recognized for implementing a preschool program for emotionally disturbed children; and

WHEREAS, throughout the years, IWS has expanded its services to include: dental care, gynecological, prenatal, speech pathology, general health, STD education and screening and mental health to name a few, a testament to their commitment to family and community health; and

WHEREAS, on April 21, 2015, IWS celebrated its 10th Anniversary of its current location: the Angel Harvey Infant Welfare Society of Chicago Community Health Center. Located at 3600 W. Fullerton, IWS continues to provide free services to over 12,000 mothers, infants and families, annually, driven by the same mission and commitment for which they were founded over a hundred years ago; and

WHEREAS, following in the footsteps of the visionaries before her, Executive Director Robin McGinnis, pushes forward with the leadership, foresight and creative programming that has made IWS an invaluable resource for the community for years to come.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cook County Board of Commissioners does hereby congratulate and recognize the Infant Welfare Society of Chicago for its legacy of over 100 years of serving Chicago's under-resourced communities and Ms. Robin McGinnis and staff for their continuous vision of an organization that serves all walks of life; and

AMENDING THE COOK COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE OFFICIAL SEAL OF COOK COUNTY TO PROHIBIT FRAUDULENT AND DECEPTIVE USE BY PRIVATE PERSONS AND ENTITIES

WHEREAS, the County of Cook is a Home Rule Unit of Government pursuant to the 1970 Illinois Constitution, Article VII, Section 6; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to its home rule power, the County of Cook may exercise any power and perform any function relating to its government and affairs, including the power to regulate for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare; and,

WHEREAS, the official seal of Cook County (“County Seal”) is an important symbol of the government of Cook County which is used by Cook County government officials, departments and agencies to convey, and does convey, the official imprimatur of the Cook County government; and

WHEREAS, when members of the public see the County Seal on any communication or object, they are likely to believe, and do reasonably believe, that the person or entity displaying the County Seal is a Cook County government official, department or agency, and that the communication or object has been approved by a Cook County government official, department or agency; and thus the display of the County Seal communicates official approval by Cook County government and an association with official Cook County government business; and

WHEREAS, from time to time, private persons or entities have displayed the County Seal on various communications and objects with the intent and/or the effect of misleading and confusing members of the public into believing that the private person or entity is acting as a representative of the Cook County government and/or acting on official Cook County business; and

WHEREAS, examples of potential fraudulent misuse of the County Seal include, but are not limited to, the use of the County Seal on letters from non-government entities offering property tax appeal assistance under the ruse of gathering sensitive personal financial information and the use of the County Seal by private persons to gain entry to the residences and workplaces of people living and doing business in Cook County under the false pretense of being Cook County government officials or employees; and

WHEREAS, such fraudulent use of the County Seal puts the most vulnerable members of the public at financial and physical risk and creates a public safety danger;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Part I General Ordinances, Chapter 2 - Administration, Article I - In General, Section 2-1 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 2 1. Official Seal.

(a) Establishment and use. The seal hereinafter described, and used with or without colors, shall be and is hereby established, created and declared to be the official seal of the County. For general use, the plain impression on white containing the figures and symbols hereinafter described shall be sufficient.

(b) Description. The seal shall be circular having within its center an outline of the map of the County across which is a scroll bearing the legend "January, 1831" marking the time the County was created by the State legislature; in the lower left portion of the design there appears an illustration of a ship sailing on Lake Michigan, symbolic of the County's geographical location, shipping port and, in a broad sense, all forms of transportation; in the upper right portion there appears a group of diversified buildings, symbolical of government, schools, churches, fine arts, dwellings, business and industry; with the entire design being encircled by a border upon which appears the printed words "Seal of Cook County, Illinois."

(c) Coloration. The colors of the official seal shall be as follows:

- (1) The outline map of the County, occupying the central portion of the design, shall be in gold, with its border a thin black line;
- (2) The scroll across the face of the map shall be white, bordered by a thin black line, the date within the scroll - "January, 1831" - shall be lettered in maroon;
- (3) The sky shall be a light blue, the lake a turquoise green;
- (4) The ship shall be in maroon, except for the superstructure, which is white;
- (5) The group of diversified buildings shall be maroon;
- (6) The broad circular border, encompassing the group of symbols shall be in cobalt (blue), edged on both the inner and outer sides with a fine line of gold;
- (7) The lettering - "Seal of Cook County, Illinois" - which appears on the cobalt border, shall be in gold.

(d) No person, as defined by §1-3 of this Chapter of the Cook County Code of Ordinances, shall use or display any image or likeness of the seal described in this section for the purpose of conveying, or in a manner that is reasonably likely to convey, the false impression of endorsement, sponsorship or approval by the government of Cook County or by any official, department, agency or instrumentality thereof. Any person violating this provision shall be ordered to cease and desist in such use and shall be subject to a fine as set forth by the Cook County Board of Commissioners in Chapter 32, section 32-1 of this Code. The determination as to the imposition of penalties under this Section shall be determined in the Cook County Department of Administrative Hearings pursuant to Chapter 2, Article IX, of the Cook County Code of Ordinances. Nothing herein prohibits a duly authorized Cook County official, or a person acting under his or her direction, from using or displaying any image or likeness of the seal described in this section.

~~(d)~~(e) Custody. The official seal shall be kept in the custody of the County Clerk to be used by the County Clerk when required.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Part I General Ordinances, Chapter 32 - Fees, Sec. 32-1-Fee Schedule, Chapter 2-Administration, 2.1, of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

If any person violates this provision, in addition to such other equitable remedies, the penalties shall be:

1. For a first violation, such person shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$250;
2. For any subsequent violation, such person shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$250 or nor more than \$500.00.

Effective date: This ordinance shall be in effect immediately upon adoption.

RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING CALLING UPON THE CHICAGO POLICE DEPARTMENT TO COMMUNICATE AND COORDINATE WITH THE COOK COUNTY SHERIFF'S POLICE TO ADDRESS ISSUES RELATED TO THE PRACTICE OF "STOP AND FRISK," BY REVIEWING THE POLICIES OF THE SHERIFF RELATED TO MOTOR VEHICLE STOPS, SEARCHES AND SEIZURES, SUPERVISORY RANK AND RESPONSIBILITY, AND DETENTIONS

WHEREAS, despite the fact that the nation's attention has turned to police practices because of high profile killings, concerns about policing extend beyond the use of force and into the everyday interactions of police with community members; and,

WHEREAS, in black and Latino communities, these everyday interactions are often a "Stop and Frisk"; and,

WHEREAS, under the U.S. Supreme Court decision in Terry v. Ohio, 392 U.S. 1 (1968), officers are allowed to stop you if the officer has reasonable suspicion that you have been, are, or are about to be engaged in criminal activity. Once you are stopped, if an officer has reasonable suspicion that you are dangerous and have a weapon, the officer can frisk you, including ordering you to put your hands on a wall or car, and running his or her hands over your body; and,

WHEREAS, a report on "Stop and Frisk" police practices by the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) of Illinois, published this past Spring, contains troubling signs that the Chicago Police Department has a current practice of unlawfully using stop and frisk; and,

WHEREAS, “Stop and Frisk” is disproportionately concentrated in the black community. Last month’s ACLU Report found that black Chicagoans were subjected to 72% of all stops, though they constitute just 32% of the city’s population; and,

WHEREAS, the ACLU of Illinois, comparing stops to population, found that Chicagoans were stopped more than four times as often as New Yorkers at the height of New York City’s stop and frisk practice; and,

WHEREAS, the abuse of stop and frisk is a violation of individual rights, but it also poisons police and community relations and directly impacts the bottom line for Cook County taxpayers by leading to arrests that would not have otherwise occurred, thereby burdening Cook County Courts and the Cook County Jail; and,

WHEREAS, the Cook County Sheriff operates pursuant to four specific policies that govern the procedures of the Cook County Sheriff’s Police related to “stop and frisk,” namely the following: Section 500 of the Cook County Sheriff’s Police Supplemental Manual dealing with Motor Vehicle Stops; Section 312 of the Cook County Sheriff’s Police Policy Manual dealing with Searches and Seizures; Section 201 of the Cook County Sheriff’s Police Policy Manual on Supervisory Rank and Responsibilities; and Section 421 of the Cook County Sheriff’s Police Policy Manual on Detentions; and,

WHEREAS, all units of county and local government stand to benefit by exchanging information regarding best practices;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Cook County President and the Board of Commissioners that the Chicago Police Department be urged to review the above-referenced policies of the Cook County Sheriff’s Police, and meet with the Chief of the Cook County Sheriff’s Police to discuss the manner in which these policies are implemented and whether these policies might be directly transferable to the work of the Chicago Police Department, particularly regarding “Stop and Frisk.”

RESOLUTION TO ADD MEMBERS TO THE COOK COUNTY HOME CONSORTIUM

WHEREAS, the County of Cook (the County) is an entitlement community pursuant to the regulations of the HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) at 24 CFR Part 92 and the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) at 24 CFR Part 570, which entitles the County to receive an annual allocation of CDBG and HOME grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD); and

WHEREAS, the amount of HOME funds that the County receives pursuant to entitlement status is determined by a HUD formula that takes into consideration the populations of the municipalities within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the City of Des Plaines and the Village of Arlington Heights (the Electing Municipalities) within the County that receive Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds directly from HUD can elect to join the County's HOME Consortium (the Consortium), which would allow HUD to take into account the populations of these municipalities when calculating the County's annual HOME funds entitlement grant, thus increasing the County's annual allocation; and

WHEREAS, the Electing Municipalities are choosing to join the Consortium, as signified by resolution of their municipal boards; and

WHEREAS, each Electing Municipality must conform to the Consortium Program Year, which runs October 1 through September 30 in accordance with HUD rules; and

WHEREAS, as the Electing Municipalities move to the Consortium Program Year they may experience a gap in their administrative funding for the few months after their old program year expires and before the Consortium Program Year begins. (i.e., if their current program year ends on June 30 there is a three month gap before the new program year starts on October 1); and

WHEREAS, the County wants to maximize its federal allocation of HOME Funds by including the Electing Municipalities in the Consortium. The County's HOME Investment Partnerships Program could see up to a \$163,000 increase over two years by adding the populations of the Electing Municipalities into the formula for calculating the grant amount.; and

WHEREAS, to facilitate the addition of the Electing Municipalities to the Consortium, the County will provide the financing for the loss in administrative funding and program funding that is needed to align the program years in each Electing Municipality; and

WHEREAS, HUD requires that the Cook County Board of Commissioners act by resolution to add the new entitlement communities into the HOME Consortium; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the President and the Board of Commissioners of the County of Cook, Illinois:

Section 1: That the County will set aside a fund of no more than \$56,610 in non-federal dollars to be used to fund the administrative costs incurred by the Electing Municipalities for periods not funded, within a three year period, due to the alignment of the program years of the Electing Municipalities with the Consortium Program Year in accordance with HUD requirements.

Section 2: That the County be and is hereby authorized to enter into an Addendum to the HOME Investment Partnerships Program Consortium Agreement for Federal Fiscal Years 2016, and 2017 to add the Electing Municipalities and that the President, Bureau Chief of Economic Development or the County Clerk are hereby authorized to execute said HOME Investment Partnerships Program Consortium Agreement Addendums, Memorandums of Understanding, and any additional documents necessary to further the aforementioned initiative, and any modifications thereto.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 66, Roads and Bridges, Article III, Public Way Regulatory Ordinance, Division 1, Sections 66-52 and 66-54 be amended as follows:

DIVISION 1. - GENERALLY

Sec. 66-50. - Short title.

This article shall be known as the "Cook County Public Way Regulatory Ordinance."

Sec. 66-51. - Purposes.

The purposes of this article are to: provide policies and procedures for the regulation of the use of County public ways for the construction, reconstruction, ownership, replacement, relocation, modification, maintenance, upgrading, operation and removal of facilities, including but not limited to public utility, pipeline, telecommunication, cable television, electric, gas, water, wastewater, petroleum product facilities, driveways, curb cuts, and other facilities; and provide for recovery of costs incurred by the County for licensing, permitting, inspecting, monitoring and regulating such uses of the public ways in order to provide for the public safety and interest.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the use of public ways under the jurisdiction or control of the County and located within the City of Chicago shall be licensed, permitted and regulated by the City of Chicago and governed by the fee structure of the City of Chicago. However, the provisions in Section 66-127, relating to overweight and oversized vehicles, shall apply to public ways under the jurisdiction or control

of the County and located within the City of Chicago where the City of Chicago has not issued a permit authorizing excess vehicle weight or excess vehicle size.

This article regulates the use of the public ways only and does not supersede or waive any right of the County to enter into a franchise agreement with a grantee for the provision of services to residents of unincorporated Cook County, nor does this article take the place of any tax now or hereafter applicable to grantees and relating to the provision of services or use of the public ways.

A portion of the fines collected pursuant to this Chapter shall be deposited into an account, which the Department of Revenue administers, for the purpose of defraying additional costs which the Department of Revenue will incur in the enforcement of this Chapter; such additional costs may include, but are not limited to, collection and audits.

Sec. 66-52. - Definitions.

The following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meaning given herein. Capitalization or lack of capitalization shall not affect the meaning of a term defined below. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words in the plural number include the singular number, and words in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

Applicant means the person that is required to apply for any license or permit, which shall be the person that will own the facility or facilities or, in the case of work in the public way which will not result in a facility being constructed, the person on whose behalf such work is performed.

Board means the Cook County Board of Commissioners.

Construction permit means a type of permit described in Section 66-66.

County means the County of Cook and, in appropriate circumstances, its commissioners, officers, employees and agents.

Director means the Director of the Real Estate Management ~~Division~~ Department of the County of Cook.

Effective date means the date which is 30 days after adoption of this article.

Emergency means any event which poses immediate danger to persons or property, or which causes interruption of utilities and similar public services, such as, but not limited to, cable television.

Excavation means any operation in which earth, rock, or other material in or under the ground is moved, removed, or otherwise displaced by means of any tools, power equipment or explosives, and includes, without limitation, grading, trenching, digging, ditching, drilling, angoring, boring, tunneling, scraping, exploratory probing, cable or pipe plowing, and driving.

Facility or facilities means all structures, devices, objects, and materials, including track and rails, pavement, curbs, sidewalks, wires, ducts, fiber optic cable, communications and video cables and wires, poles, conduits, foundations, grates, covers, mains, hydrants, manholes, meters, valves, pumps, lift stations, pipes, cables, and appurtenances thereto or any portion thereof, located on, in, over, above, along, upon, under, across, or within public ways under this article, except those owned by the County.

Grantee means the person granted a license or a permit under this article and its lawful successor, transferee or assignee.

Hazardous materials means any substance or material which, due to its quantity, form, concentration, location, or other characteristics, poses an unreasonable and imminent risk to the life, health or safety of persons or property or to the ecological balance of the environment, including, but not limited to explosives,

radioactive materials, petroleum or petroleum products or gases, poisons, etiology (biological) agents, flammables, corrosives or any substance determined to be hazardous or toxic under any Federal or State law, statute or regulation.

Highway Department means the Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways ~~Highway Department~~.

Law means any and all laws, statutes, ordinances, codes, rules and regulations promulgated or enacted by any Federal, State or local governmental entity or agency, and specifically include this article.

License means the nonexclusive privileges granted under a license agreement pursuant to this article to construct, own, replace, relocate, modify, maintain, operate and remove facilities on, in, under, over, above, along, upon, under, across, or within specified public ways or other property under the jurisdiction or control of the County.

License agreement means a written agreement between the County and a grantee pursuant to this article, as further described in Division 2.

Maintenance and repair permit means a permit of the type described in Section 66-67.

Permit means a written permission from the County to do work in the public way issued pursuant to Division 3.

Person means an individual, firm, corporation, cooperative, association, partnership, joint venture, limited liability company, governmental unit, or other legally recognized entity.

Proprietary information has the meaning set forth in Section 66-55.

Public way means the surface, the air space above the surface and the area below the surface of any public right-of-way, including any public street, highway, lane, path, alley, sidewalk, boulevard, drive, bridge, park, parkways, and other public rights-of-way under the jurisdiction or control of the County, which entitle the County and a grantee to the use thereof for the purpose of installing and maintaining public streets and other facilities. No reference herein, or in any license agreement or previously issued franchise, or in any permit, to the "public way" shall be deemed to be a representation or guarantee by the County that its title to any property or jurisdiction or control is sufficient to permit use of such property for such purpose and the grantee shall, by its use of such terms, be deemed to gain only such rights to use property as the County may have the undisputed right and power to give. Notwithstanding the foregoing, for purposes of this article, the term "public way" shall not include any public ways owned or controlled by the County and located within the City of Chicago.

Superintendent means the Superintendent of the Cook County ~~Highway~~ Department of Transportation and Highways.

Tree trimming permit means a permit of the type described in Section 66-68.

Sec. 66-52. - Definitions.

When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words in the plural number include the singular number, and words in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

Applicant means the person that is required to apply for any license or permit, which shall be the person that will own the facility or facilities or, in the case of work in the public way which will not result in a facility being constructed, the person on whose behalf such work is performed.

Board means the Cook County Board of Commissioners.

Construction permit means a type of permit described in Section 66-66.

County means the County of Cook and, in appropriate circumstances, its commissioners, officers, employees and agents.

Director means the Director of the Real Estate Management ~~Division~~ Department of the County of Cook.

Effective date means the date which is 30 days after adoption of this article.

Emergency means any event which poses immediate danger to persons or property, or which causes interruption of utilities and similar public services, such as, but not limited to, cable television.

Excavation means any operation in which earth, rock, or other material in or under the ground is moved, removed, or otherwise displaced by means of any tools, power equipment or explosives, and includes, without limitation, grading, trenching, digging, ditching, drilling, angoring, boring, tunneling, scraping, exploratory probing, cable or pipe plowing, and driving.

Facility or facilities means all structures, devices, objects, and materials, including track and rails, pavement, curbs, sidewalks, wires, ducts, fiber optic cable, communications and video cables and wires, poles, conduits, foundations, grates, covers, mains, hydrants, manholes, meters, valves, pumps, lift stations, pipes, cables, and appurtenances thereto or any portion thereof, located on, in, over, above, along, upon, under, across, or within public ways under this article, except those owned by the County.

Grantee means the person granted a license or a permit under this article and its lawful successor, transferee or assignee.

Hazardous materials means any substance or material which, due to its quantity, form, concentration, location, or other characteristics, poses an unreasonable and imminent risk to the life, health or safety of persons or property or to the ecological balance of the environment, including, but not limited to explosives, radioactive materials, petroleum or petroleum products or gases, poisons, etiology (biological) agents, flammables, corrosives or any substance determined to be hazardous or toxic under any Federal or State law, statute or regulation.

Highway Department means the Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways ~~Highway Department~~.

Law means any and all laws, statutes, ordinances, codes, rules and regulations promulgated or enacted by any Federal, State or local governmental entity or agency, and specifically include this article.

License means the nonexclusive privileges granted under a license agreement pursuant to this article to construct, own, replace, relocate, modify, maintain, operate and remove facilities on, in, under, over,

above, along, upon, under, across, or within specified public ways or other property under the jurisdiction or control of the County.

License agreement means a written agreement between the County and a grantee pursuant to this article, as further described in Division 2.

Maintenance and repair permit means a permit of the type described in Section 66-67.

Permit means a written permission from the County to do work in the public way issued pursuant to Division 3.

Person means an individual, firm, corporation, cooperative, association, partnership, joint venture, limited liability company, governmental unit, or other legally recognized entity.

Proprietary information has the meaning set forth in Section 66-55.

Public way means the surface, the air space above the surface and the area below the surface of any public right-of-way, including any public street, highway, lane, path, alley, sidewalk, boulevard, drive, bridge, park, parkways, and other public rights-of-way under the jurisdiction or control of the County, which entitle the County and a grantee to the use thereof for the purpose of installing and maintaining public streets and other facilities. No reference herein, or in any license agreement or previously issued franchise, or in any permit, to the "public way" shall be deemed to be a representation or guarantee by the County that its title to any property or jurisdiction or control is sufficient to permit use of such property for such purpose and the grantee shall, by its use of such terms, be deemed to gain only such rights to use property as the County may have the undisputed right and power to give. Notwithstanding the foregoing, for purposes of this article, the term "public way" shall not include any public ways owned or controlled by the County and located within the City of Chicago.

Superintendent means the Superintendent of the Cook County ~~Highway~~ Department of Transportation and Highways.

Tree trimming permit means a permit of the type described in Section 66-68.

Sec. 66-53. - Conflicts with State and Federal laws.

In the event that applicable laws conflict with the requirements of this article, a grantee shall comply with the requirements of this article to the maximum extent possible without violating laws.

Sec. 66-54. - General provisions regarding fees and payments.

All fees, interest and other sums payable by a grantee under this article shall be paid to the County Revenue Department, which shall advise the Director of Real Estate Management and the Superintendent of Transportation and Highways of any untimely or deficient payments. In the event that any payment is not made on or before the applicable dates herein specified, interest shall be charged from such due date at the rate stated in the Cook County Uniform Penalty, Interest and Procedure Ordinance; provided, however, that no interest shall be charged on penalties assessed pursuant to Section 66-91. The payments shall be in addition to any other money that may be owed by the grantee to the County and shall not be construed as a

payment in lieu of any such money. The types of fees and charges and the initial amounts of such fees and charges are set forth in Section 66-103. Such fees and charges may be amended from time to time, and shall be imposed in the amounts in effect at the time of such imposition.

Sec. 66-55. - General provisions regarding submission or certain information.

When information is required to be provided to the County, the following general provisions shall apply:

- (a) *Drawings, plans and specifications.* In any instance where drawings, plans or specifications are required to be provided by an applicant or grantee, such information should, if feasible, be provided in an electronic format compatible with the County's geographical information system in use at the time such information is required to be provided or compatible with the County's CADD system in use at such time. In addition, such information shall also be provided in hard copy, if requested by the County.
- (b) *Description of facilities and locations.* In all instances where a description of any facility is required under this article or a license, such description shall include (i) all dimensional details such as diameter, thickness or pipe walls, materials used, and all other details necessary to fully describe the facility and (ii) three-dimensional coordinates and all information necessary to describe both the horizontal and vertical location of the facility.
- (c) *Proprietary information.* Information provided to the County is subject to disclosure as a public record pursuant to the Illinois Freedom of Information Act (5 ILCS 140/1 et seq.) If any information required to be provided to the County under this article is reasonably considered by grantee to include trade secrets, commercial or financial information where the trade secrets or information are proprietary, privileged or confidential, or where disclosure of the trade secrets or information may cause competitive harm, or which information would otherwise be exempt from disclosure pursuant to Section 7 of the Illinois Freedom of Information Act (5 ILCS 140/7, 2006) or if the disclosure of such information could, in the reasonable judgment of a grantee, impair security of facilities operated by such grantee in providing utilities or other services essential to public health or public safety (such information being referred to as "proprietary information"), then grantee may delete such proprietary information from the information to be provided, so long as the information provided is adequate, in the reasonable judgment of the Superintendent to inform the County of the nature and location of the facilities for its regulatory purposes, and so long as the grantee provides a written certification, signed by an officer of grantee, identifying the type of information deleted and the reason for such deletion. Grantee shall cooperate with the Highway Department to assure that the information provided is adequate to meet the County's requirements.

Sec. 66-56. - Reserved.

DIVISION 2. - LICENSING REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURE

Sec. 66-57. - License requirements.

In situations where the applicant (i) has or proposes to have facilities in a significant portion of the public ways as determined by the Highway Department (for example, a utility company) (such license applicant being sometimes referred to as a "major user"), or (ii) has or proposes to have facilities that require continued regulation (for example, a pipeline operator), as determined by the Highway Department, but do not occupy a significant portion of the public ways (such license applicant being sometimes referred to as an "other user"), then the applicant shall be required to obtain a license from the County. The license

agreement shall be in a form provided by the County and will include payment of a license fee, obligations of the grantee to indemnify the County, furnish insurance, and such other terms and provisions as are determined by the Director to be appropriate in any instance.

Sec. 66-58. - General requirements and provisions.

Any license granted pursuant to this article creates a license only and does not create an interest or estate of any kind whatsoever in the public way by virtue of this article, a license agreement, or grantee's use of the public way.

- (a) *Existing facilities.* In the event that any person is operating facilities in the public way under a license, easement or similar agreement with the County, this article shall apply only to the extent it is not inconsistent with such license, easement or similar agreement during the term of such license, easement or similar agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this article, including but not limited to permitting requirements of this article, shall govern any maintenance, repair, replacement, removal, relocation, reconstruction, upgrading, modification or extension of any existing facilities, and all the provisions of this article shall apply to installation of any new facilities in the public ways not covered by such agreement. Persons having facilities located in the public ways as of the effective date for which a license is required under Section 66-57, and as to which no license, easement or similar written agreement is currently in effect, shall comply with the licensing requirements set forth herein by filing an application for a license for such existing facilities within 60 days after the effective date. The effective date of such license agreement shall be July 1, 2007. If a person having existing facilities with no such agreement in place fails to timely apply for or diligently pursue a license agreement, then the County may exercise the rights and remedies described in this article, including assessment of penalties and requiring removal of such person's facilities. In addition, the County may refuse to process any applications or grant any permits until such license agreement is executed.
- (b) *Ordinance 85-O-18.* On February 4, 1985, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 85-0-18, which granted to Illinois Bell Telephone Company, and its successors, the non-exclusive right to use certain public ways in Cook County in exchange for certain benefits granted to the County, under the terms set forth in such Ordinance. For so long as such Ordinance is in full force and effect, the grantee or its successors under Ordinance 85-O-18, as amended, including as amended by Ordinance 07-O-27, shall be required to apply for a license within 60 days after the effective date of this article as to public ways and shall be required to comply with all permit requirements set forth in Division 3, except that license fees and permit fees shall be waived to the extent provided in Ordinance 85-O-18, as amended by Ordinance 07-O-27 and as further amended.
- (c) *License nonexclusive.* No license shall be exclusive. Every license shall be deemed to reserve to the County the right to grant other licenses to use and occupy the public ways or other property of the County for any other purpose on such terms as the County may deem appropriate.
- (d) *License subject to County use.* All licenses shall be subject to the County's use of its public ways, including the widening of County highways, roads, streets and bridges. Any removal, relocation or modification of a grantee's facilities necessitated by the County's use of its public ways shall be at the grantee's cost, and shall be governed by Section 66-81

Sec. 66-59. - License application.

Applications for a license shall be submitted to the Director on application forms promulgated by the Director. The application form shall request facts and information the County deems appropriate, including the specific location of the Facilities as provided in Section 66-55. Applicants applying for a license for

facilities existing prior to the effective date, shall include drawings, plans and specifications fully describing such existing facilities and the location of such facilities as required by Section 66-55. The Director may agree to accept the foregoing information after issuance of a license for good cause shown. In determining whether to issue the license prior to receiving all such information, the Director shall take into consideration the extent of the grantee's facilities in the public way and the burden on the grantee of providing the information within the required time. If a license as to all the public ways is requested, the information as to the current locations of facilities shall nevertheless be required. The Director may request additional information from the applicant at any time during the application process.

- (a) *Review process.* The Director shall coordinate any necessary review of the application by all interested County Departments, which may include Highway, Building and Zoning and Risk Management. If the foregoing review indicates that the license may be issued, then based upon the application and such information as may be obtained during the review process, the Director shall prepare a license agreement for execution by the applicant, setting forth the terms and conditions upon which the Director is prepared to recommend issuance of a license.
- (b) *Execution by applicant.* Upon execution of the license agreement, applicant shall submit the annual license fee for the first year of the term. Such annual license fee shall be refunded if the license agreement is not approved and executed by the Board. No provision of this article shall be deemed or construed as to require the Board to grant a license. The Board may consider any relevant facts and circumstances, including the qualifications of the applicant, in determining whether to grant a license.
- (c) *Term of license agreement.* The term of a license agreement shall commence on the date the license agreement is executed by the County ("effective date"), and shall expire on June 30 of the calendar year in which the tenth anniversary of the effective date occurs, such that all licenses shall expire on June 30, unless sooner terminated in accordance with the terms of the license agreement; provided, however, that a license agreement issued to a person having existing facilities as described in Section 66-58(a) shall be effective as of July 1, 2007, regardless of the date executed.

Sec. 66-60. - Annual requirements.

- (a) A grantee is required to provide the following documentation to the Director prior to each July 1 falling within the term, or as set forth below:
 - (1) A current certificate of insurance, or other evidence acceptable to the Director of Risk Management, evidencing all insurance required to be maintained by grantee under Section 66-62, must be on file with the Director at all times; therefore, an updated certificate of insurance must be provided to the Director upon expiration and renewal of any policies required under the license agreement.
 - (2) The annual license fee in effect from time to time.
 - (3) A certified report of current facilities and their locations, including plans, drawings or such other material as is necessary to fully describe the facilities and their locations, as provided in Section 66-55, or a statement certified by an authorized representative of the grantee stating that there has been no change to the facilities since the prior annual report or the issuance of the license, in the case of the first such certified report.
 - (4) Such other documentation and information reasonably requested by the Director.
- (b) *Failure to fulfill annual requirements.* If grantee fails to fulfill the annual requirements by July 1, grantee shall be subject to penalties as set forth in Section 66-91 and, in addition, the Director may

revoke the license at any time thereafter by terminating the license agreement as set forth below; provided, however, that if grantee provides the certificate or other acceptable evidence of insurance and pays the annual fee within 15 days after receipt of notice from the County of failure to comply with the annual requirements (which shall constitute a violation notice under Section 66-87), grantee may request an extension as to Section 66-60(a)(3) and the Director may grant such extension as the Director deems appropriate (which shall constitute additional time to cure pursuant to Section 66-88(c)). If such extension is granted, no penalties will accrue and the County will not be entitled to revoke the license if the requirement is fulfilled prior to the expiration of the extension period. If grantee fails to provide the annual report within the extension period, then penalties shall be assessed retroactively to the date which is five days after receipt of the County's notice, and the Director may, in his or her discretion, revoke the license. If the Director deems it advisable to revoke the license as allowed under this Section 66-60(b), the Director shall notify the grantee in writing not less than 30 days prior to the effective date of such revocation, which notice shall be ineffective if the grantee fulfills all requirements prior to the effective date set forth in the notice. If a grantee fails to fulfill the annual requirements as provided herein, then the County may exercise the rights and remedies described in this article, including assessment of penalties and requiring removal or deactivation of such person's facilities. In addition, the County may refuse to process any applications or grant any permits until such license agreement is executed.

Sec. 66-61. - Annual license fee.

A grantee shall pay to the County an annual license fee at the rate in effect from time to time, prorated on a daily basis if the license commences on a date other than July 1 or terminates on a date other than June 30 (other than a termination due to breach by grantee). The annual license fee for the first year of the term shall be paid upon presentation of the license agreement to the Director of Real Estate Management, executed by the applicant, and shall be refunded if the license is not issued. All succeeding annual license fee payments shall be made on or before July 1 of every year during the term of the license agreement.

Sec. 66-62. - Insurance requirements.

At all times during the term of a license, and at all times until the removal of facilities is completed, as provided for herein, a grantee shall maintain insurance as provided in the license agreement. Failure to comply with insurance requirements shall be a violation of this article and subject grantee to the penalties provided in Section 66-91.

Sec. 66-63. - License renewal.

A grantee shall be solely responsible for requesting the County, in writing, to renew a license for any subsequent ten-year term. Such a request shall be made to the Director not less than six months prior to the then current license expiration date, unless a later date is agreed to in writing by the Director.

- (a) Request for license renewal shall be made in accordance with the requirements set forth in Section 66-59 of this article for a new license; however, Board authorization shall not be required for license renewals, which may be approved by the Director. If a grantee having existing facilities fails to timely apply for or diligently pursue a renewal of a license, then the County through the Director may exercise the rights and remedies described in this article, including assessment of penalties and requiring removal of such person's facilities.

- (b) Notwithstanding the fact that the County Director may determine that a grantee has been in reasonable compliance with the terms and conditions imposed by this article and the license agreement, the County Director shall have no obligation to renew the license. If the County Director does not renew the license, the County Director shall have the option to require the removal of all grantee's facilities and other property located within the licensed area, at the grantee's expense, in accordance with Section 66-80. Should the Director not renew a license following an application to renew, the annual license fee accompanied with accompanying the renewal application shall be refunded. No provision of this article shall be deemed or construed as to require the Board or Director to grant a license. The Director may consider any relevant facts and circumstances, including the qualifications of the applicant and compliance with the license agreement in the past, in determining whether to grant or renew a license. The Director shall inform the Board within 30 days of any renewal license applications denied by the Director. The Director shall provide a report to the Board during the first quarter of any year in which license renewals will occur listing all licenses expiring in that year. The Director shall in addition provide a report by the end of each such year setting forth all licenses renewed by the Director, any licenses which the Director declined to renew, and any which the licensee declined to renew.

Sec. 66-64. - Transfer of license.

Neither a license nor a license agreement shall be assigned, transferred, sold or disposed of, in whole or in part, by voluntary sale, sale and leaseback, merger, including merger by operation of law, consolidation or otherwise or by forced or involuntary sale (any of the foregoing being hereinafter referred to as a "transfer"), without written notice to the Director which shall be signed by both the original grantee and the party accepting the transfer (the "transferee"). Such notice shall be given no later than ten days after the transfer occurs, and shall include an assumption by the transferee of all the grantee's obligations under the license agreement, together with evidence of transferee's insurance and a replacement bond or letter of credit provided by transferee as required under the license agreement.

- (a) *Transfer in violation.* Any sale, transfer or assignment not made according to the procedures set forth in this article shall render the license and the license agreement voidable at the option of the County. In addition, such sale shall subject grantee to the penalties set forth in Section 66-91. The sale, transfer or assignment in bulk of the major part of the tangible assets of the grantee shall be considered an assignment and shall be subject to the provisions of this section.

Effective date: This ordinance shall be in effect immediately upon adoption.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Constitution, Article 1, Section 2, requires an enumeration of the population every ten years to apportion congressional representation among the states, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 141 of Title 13 of the United States Code, the next federal decennial census of the population will be taken on the first day of April, 2020, and

WHEREAS, a complete and accurate count of Cook County and Illinois population is essential to the County and the State, because the census count determines congressional representation, state redistricting, federal formula grant allocations and the distribution of state subvention funds for an entire decade until the next decennial census is taken, and

WHEREAS, the number of Illinois representatives serving in the House of Representatives, and locally elected officials serving in the State General Assembly, county and local elective positions, are determined by the complete enumeration of the state population, and

WHEREAS, since the 1960 Census, the State of Illinois has lost a total of 6 seats in the House of Representatives, losing seats in each of the past 5 decades, and

WHEREAS, a complete and accurate census count ensures that the particular priorities of Cook County and Illinois are properly represented at all federal, state, and local levels, and

WHEREAS, the census count of Illinois resident population and detailed household information from the American Community Survey (ACS) determines the state's portion of more than 400 billion dollars of Federal funds to the 50 states each year on more than 140 Federal programs, and

WHEREAS, there are several federal programs benefiting Cook County, and Illinois that use census enumerations and population numbers as part of their funding formulas, including formulas for education, health, transportation, and human services programs, and

WHEREAS, while the U.S. Census Bureau will endeavor to count every person in the nation, many states, as they have done in the past, will allocate state funds to carry out a multi-cultural, multi-lingual, multi-media outreach campaign to increase individual state mail-back response rates, and encourage the involvement of every resident, and

WHEREAS, in the 2000 and 2010 Censuses, Cook County organized a strong and effective Census Complete Count Committee to focus the County's elected officials, faith organizations, and a wide range of business and community leadership in promotion and support of an accurate and complete count of its population, and

WHEREAS, over the next three years the Census Bureau will conduct local tests, including potential operations tests in Cook County in 2016, of new concepts, methods, and procedures for improving public cooperation for possible use in the next census in 2020, and

WHEREAS, it is vitally important for Cook County, and Illinois to do everything it can to ensure that every Illinois resident is counted in the upcoming census;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cook County Board of Commissioners does hereby urge the Illinois General Assembly to pass legislation to become effective immediately:

1. Authorizing the appropriate funds necessary to carry out a broad, state-wide multi-cultural, multi-lingual, multi-media outreach campaign to educate, inform, and encourage the cooperation of every Illinois resident with the 2020 Census, including the authorization of immediate funding to support Census Bureau conduct of potential testing activities in Cook County during 2016, 2017, and 2018;

2. To authorize the Governor to establish a statewide Complete Count Committee, appointing members, as he deems necessary who shall serve without compensation and at the pleasure of the Governor;

3. To ensure that the Committee begin its work immediately, to develop, recommend, and assist in the administration of a census outreach strategy, to participate fully with all preliminary testing conducted within the state in 2016, 2017, and 2018, of new and different methods and procedures for encouraging public cooperation for use in the 2020 federal decennial census of population required by Section 141 of Title 13 of the United States Code.

4. The census outreach strategy shall include, but not be limited to, State agency initiatives to encourage participation in the 2020 Census, the establishment and support of school-based outreach programs, partnerships with non-profit community-based organizations, and a multi-lingual, multi-media campaign designed to ensure an accurate and complete count of Illinois population.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a suitable copy of the Resolution be tendered to the Speaker of the Illinois House of Representatives and the President of the Illinois Senate.
