PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

ORDINANCE MODIFICATION

WHEREAS, Cook County is a "Fair and Equal County for Immigrants;" and

WHEREAS, the provision of Cook County benefits, opportunities, or services is not conditioned on matters related to citizenship or immigration status; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County Code currently contains multiple references to "citizen" instead of "resident."

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2, Administration, Article IV, Officers and Employees, Division 5, Inspector General, Section 2-284(10) of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as Follows:

Sec. 2-284. - Functions, authority and powers

In addition to other powers conferred herein, the OIIG shall have the following functions, authority and powers:

(10)To create and maintain a toll-free "Office of the Independent Inspector General Hotline" for the purpose of receiving citizen and employee reports of corruption, fraud, waste, mismanagement, unlawful political discrimination and misconduct. The identity of any individual placing a call to the Office of the Inspector General Hotline shall be kept confidential during and after the investigation of any complaint made by the caller, unless the caller consents to disclosure of his or her name or disclosure of the caller's identity is otherwise required by law. Alternatively, reports may be made anonymously.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2, Administration, Article V, Departments and Similar Agencies, Division 3, Bureau of Finance, Subdivision III, Department of Revenue, Section 2-434(5) of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 2-434. - Power and duties of Director of Revenue

The Department of Revenue shall have the following powers and duties:

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(5) To investigate, analyze and propose new revenue programs for the County toward the end that the financial burdens of revenue, tax, license and permit fees may be equitably distributed among the citizens of within the County.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2, Administration, Article VII, Ethics, Division 3, Lobbyists, Subdivision II, Registration, Section 2-638 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 2-638. - Right to petition County Officials

Nothing in this Division shall be construed to infringe in any way the right-of a citizen to lawfully petition a Commissioner or any other County Official as guaranteed by the constitutions of the United States and the State.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 10, Animals, Article I, In General, Sections 10-1(1), and 10-3(b) of the Cook County Code are hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 10-1. - Purpose

The purpose of this chapter is to provide harmonious relationships in the interaction between <u>hu</u>man and animal by:

(1) Protecting the citizens of the County from rabies by specifying such preventive and control measures as may be necessary;

Sec. 10-3. - Violations

(b) The Administrator or State's Attorney or any citizen of the County may maintain a<u>A</u> complaint <u>may</u> <u>be brought</u> in the Circuit Court of Cook County to enjoin all persons in the control of a dangerous animal from allowing or permitting such animal to leave their premises when not under the control of a leash and muzzle or other recognized methods of physical restraint.

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BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 10, Animals, Article III, Vicious and Dangerous Dogs, Section 10-78(d) of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 10-78. - Declaration of a "vicious" dog

(d) In order to have a dog deemed "vicious" a complaint must be filed by the County Department of Animal Control, the Office of the State's Attorney, any citizen of the County, or any victim of a dog attack if such attack occurred within the County, in the Circuit Court of the County to deem a dog a "vicious" dog.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 14, Community Development, Article IX, Commission on Social Innovation, Section 14-92(f) of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 14-92. - Purpose

The purpose of this article is to create the Cook County Commission on Social Innovation, which shall engage in the following activities:

(f) The commission shall identify useful strategies to educate and trainprovide education and training concerning citizens, nonprofit organizations, governments, students, and businesses on entrepreneurial concepts specifically as applied in the social sector.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 26, Emergency Management and Services, Article III, 9-1-1 Surcharge, Section 26-80 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 26-80. - Limitation on use of County funds

The County shall not expend any County funds for the implementation, installation and maintenance or other related costs attributable to providing a 9-1-1 emergency system for the eitizens of the County. However, the County may pay for the personnel necessary to operate the 9-1-1 system.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 34, Finance, Article IV, Procurement Code, Division 8, Minority and Woman Owned Business Enterprises, Subdivision I, General Provisions, Section 34-263 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 34-263. - Definitions

Socially Disadvantaged means having been subjected to racial, ethnic or gender prejudice or cultural bias within American society because of identity as a member of a group, and without regard to individual qualities, stemming from circumstances beyond the relevant person's control. A Socially Disadvantaged natural person must be a citizen or lawfully admitted permanent resident of the United States.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 34, Finance, Article IV, Procurement Code, Division 8, Minority and Woman Owned Business Enterprises, Subdivision II, Participation in Cook County Public Works Contracts, Section 34-290 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 34-290. - Definitions

Socially Disadvantaged means having been subjected to racial, ethnic or gender prejudice or cultural bias within American society because of identity as a member of a group, and without regard to individual qualities, stemming from circumstances beyond the relevant person's control. <u>A Socially Disadvantaged</u> natural person must be a citizen or lawfully admitted permanent resident of the United States.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 42, Human Relations, Article II, Human Rights, Section 42-34(e)(2) of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 42-34. - Commission on Human Rights

The organization and administration of the Cook County Commission on Human Rights shall be sufficiently independent to assure that no interference or influence external to the office adversely affects the independence and objectivity of the Commission on Human Rights.

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- (e) *Additional powers and duties*. The Commission shall have such additional powers and duties as reasonably flow from its responsibilities, including but not limited to:

(2) Advising and consulting with the President, the Cook County Board of Commissioners, and officials, departments, and agencies of the County government on assuring and improving the equality of services to all citizens.

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BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 46, Law Enforcement, Article IV, Jail Diversion Program, Division 2, Program Established, Section 46-201(7) of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 46-201. - Purpose

The purposes of the County Jail Diversion Program are to:

(7) Improve positive relationships between target population-citizens and law enforcement officers.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 54, Licenses, Permits and Miscellaneous Business Regulations, Article II, Dance Halls and Roadhouses, Division 2, License, Section 54-61 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 54-61. - License required

No <u>citizen, firm or corporationperson</u> of this State shall operate a public dance hall or roadhouse used for public dances in the County, and outside the limits of any city, town or village, without first having obtained a County roadhouse license for each location of any roadhouse or dance hall.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 54, Licenses, Permits and Miscellaneous Business Regulations, Article IV, Outdoor Movie Theaters, Division 2, License, Section 54-271 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 54-271. - Required

No <u>citizen, firm or corporationperson</u> of this State shall operate a public outdoor movie theater used for public viewing of motion pictures or city, town, or village, without first having obtained an outdoor movie theater license for each location.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 54, Licenses, Permits and Miscellaneous Business Regulations, Article X, General Business Licenses, Section 54-381 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 54-381. - Purpose

The Cook County Board of Commissioners determines that in order to effectively protect the public health, general welfare, and safety of its citizens it has deemed it necessary to establish a General Business License for Unincorporated Cook County for the protection of the public health, safety, and welfare.

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BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 78, Telecommunications, Article II, Cable Television Ordinance, Section 78-41(4) of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 78-41. - Purpose

The purpose of this article is to:

(3) Provide for the development of cable television as a means to improve communication between and among the <u>citizenspersons</u> and public institutions of the County; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 82, Traffic and Vehicles, Article I, County Vehicle Code, Section 82-2 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 82-2. - Purpose

In order to better promote the public safety, health, and welfare of its citizens this <u>This</u> Vehicle Code was established <u>for the protection of the public health, safety, and welfare</u>. This Vehicle Code will apply to:

- (1) Properties owned and managed by Cook County;
- (2) Private properties and roads within Cook County whereby the County has entered into an agreement to enforce parking and/or traffic regulations; and
- (3) Public Properties and public ways, streets and highways located in incorporated areas of Cook County, whereby the County has entered into an intergovernmental agreement to enforce parking and/or traffic regulations.
- (4) Public ways, streets and highways under the jurisdiction of the County located in unincorporated areas of the County.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Part II, Land Development Ordinances, Appendix A, Zoning, Article 5, Commercial Districts, Section 5.0 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

5.0. - Purpose

The commercial district regulations are intended to govern the location, intensity and method of development for business and commercial uses serving the citizens of within Cook County. Regulations provide for groupings of business and commercial uses that are compatible with the type of commodity sold, the scope of services provided and the method of operations. All business and commercial uses are contained in the following eight commercial districts:

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C-1 Restricted Business District
C-2 Restricted Office District
C-3 General Service District
C-4 General Commercial District
C-5 Commercial Transition District
C-6 Automotive Service District
C-7 Office/Research Park District
C-8 Intensive Commercial District

For purposes of determining the restrictiveness of the eight commercial zoning districts, each of the districts shall be deemed independently and equally restrictive.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Part II, Land Development Ordinances, Appendix A, Zoning, Article 11, Off-Street Parking and Loading Space, Section 11.2.6(A)(7) of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

11.2. - Off-Street Parking Space

11.2.6. Space requirements. All off-street parking space shall meet the following minimum requirements:

A. Residential uses.

7. Senior citizen-housing. One off-street parking space shall be provided for every three dwelling units.

Effective date: This ordinance shall be in effect immediately upon adoption.

A motion was made by Commissioner Gainer, seconded by Commissioner García, that the Proposed Ordinance Amendment be referred to the Workforce, Housing and Community Development Committee. The motion carried.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

COUNTY VEHICLE POLICY

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BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2, Article VIII, County Vehicle Policy, Section 2-672. - Responsibilities of elected officials, departments, and employees and assignment of Vehicle Coordinator, Section 2-673. - Authorized use of County vehicles, and Sec. 2-673. - Authorized use of County vehicles are hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 2-672. - Responsibilities of elected officials, departments, and employees and assignment of Vehicle Coordinator.

(a) Bureau chiefs, department heads, and elected officials are responsible for ensuring shall ensure that Vehicle Steering Committee policies and procedures are administered and adhered to by employees within their offices. Failure of Bureau Chiefs, Department Heads, and Elected Officials to provide information in accordance with this article shall result in the Department's inability to acquire County vehicles, and other actions deemed necessary by the Vehicle Steering Committee, until this information is received.

- (b) Vehicle Coordinator.
- (1) Each Elected Official or Department Head will designate one employee to be the Vehicle Coordinator for the office. On January 1 of each year, the name, title, email address, and telephone number of the Vehicle Coordinator shall be filed with the Chairman of the Vehicle Steering Committee. The Coordinator may be asked to attend meetings of the Vehicle Steering Committee as required to review purchase requests, department inventories, review vehicle use issues, maintenance records and other matters pertaining to this article.
- (2) Department Vehicle Coordinators are to ensure the following procedures are in place within the Department and shall be responsible for keeping all records and preparing all reports required under this article. All forms and database formats required under these guidelines will be provided by the Vehicle Steering Committee. Vehicle Coordinators shall:
 - a. Retain on file a copy of the valid license of each employee authorized to drive a County vehicle or a personal vehicle for which the employee receives mileage reimbursement. The employee must at all times hold a valid proper class license for the vehicle operated that is not revoked or under suspension.
 - b. Ensure all employees authorized take home vehicle privileges comply with IRS Rules on tax treatment of employee vehicle fringe benefits associated with take-home privileges.
 - c. Maintain an updated vehicle inventory, accident logs, vehicle use logs and insurance cards in the form and format established by the Vehicle Steering Committee.
 - d. Follow procedures established by the Sheriff's Vehicle Services Division and approved by the Vehicle Steering Committee to ensure vehicles follow proper preventative and other maintenance schedules. Failure to follow established procedures may result in suspension or elimination of vehicle privileges.

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e. Coordinate with internal agency/department staff and track resolution of emission testing notifications, vehicle registrations, vehicle recalls, moving violations, administrative violations, driver complaints, maintenance complaints and other critical safety issues.

(c) The Bureau of Human Resources shall <u>consult correspond</u> on a monthly basis with the Illinois Secretary of State to check the license status of all employees required to operate vehicles as part of their job duties except for employees of the Sheriff's Office and State's Attorney. The Sheriff's Office and State's Attorney shall consult on a monthly basis with the Illinois Secretary of State to check on the license status of its employees, including undercover officers, and shall maintain such files internally. The Bureau of Human Resources file is to be reviewed and updated on no less than a monthly basis and forwarded to the respective agencies for review and any subsequent action.

All prospective employees who are professional drivers or whose primary duty is the operation of a vehicle shall be required to submit a valid driver's license prior to the time of hire. Each agency's Human Resources, as part of a pre-employment background investigation, shall coordinate driver checks. Failure to have a valid driver's license of the proper type, or the existence of a disqualifying driver's record will be grounds to withdraw the conditional offer of employment.

- (d) The Sheriff's Vehicle Services Division shall:
- (1) Establish and communicate vehicle maintenance procedures and routine maintenance schedules.
- (2) Record and track all vehicle related data including odometer reading, dates and costs of all maintenance services, vehicle utilization data, fuel management, accident history as reported by the using agency/investigating agency, etc.
- (3) Salvage vehicles as needed.

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- (e) The Office of the Chief Procurement Officer shall:
- (1) Obtain and maintain all vehicle titles for all County owned vehicles; and
- (2) Maintain a copy of all vehicle leasing agreements.
- (3) Promulgate and distribute procedures regarding (a) obtaining and verifying receipt of vehicle titles; and (b) providing copies of vehicle titles to third parties for vehicles which have been declared surplus.

Sec. 2-673. - Authorized use of County vehicles.

(a) County owned or leased vehicles shall be used only for conducting official County business.

(b) County owned vehicles shall not be authorized for use until they are in compliance with all onboarding requirements including proper licensing, municipal sticker, valid insurance card, proper decals and markings as established by the Sheriff's Vehicle Services Division and approved by the Vehicle Steering Committee. Only vehicles that have been authorized by an elected official or department head,

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have VIN numbers registered in the County Office of the Chief Procurement Officer, carry a valid insurance card issued to the Department by the Department of Risk Management, and meet all other requirements of this section shall be considered County vehicles for use in the course of conducting official County business.

(c) Unless expressly exempted by the Department Head, and approved by the Vehicle Steering Committee, all County vehicles must carry a municipal license plate.

(d) All County owned vehicles shall be equipped with Global Positioning System (GPS) technology. The Vehicle Steering Committee shall develop policy related to vehicle GPS.

(e) There shall be a telephone hotline which members of the public may call to report incidents involving County vehicles.

(f) The Inspector General shall have the responsibility of investigating any reports of misuse of County vehicles and shall submit an annual report to the Vehicle Steering Committee and County Board.

(g) With the exception of law enforcement vehicles equipped for undercover, special crimes units and surveillance purposes, all County vehicles shall be emblazoned on both sides with the County name, corporate seal, name of the Department to which the vehicle is assigned, vehicle hotline telephone number, and a short statement identifying the hotline to the general public (e.g., "To report incidents involving this vehicle, call (telephone number)"). Except as otherwise provided, exemptions must be requested by the Department Head and approved by the Vehicle Steering Committee and may only be granted where the anonymity of the vehicle is required.

(h) Vehicle usage logs must be maintained for each pooled County vehicle and include the following information: name of driver; date used; beginning and ending odometer reading; destination; purpose of use. Where the anonymity of the vehicle and the driver is required, law enforcement vehicles shall be exempt from disclosure of destination information.

(i) Only authorized passengers are permitted to ride in County vehicles. Non-County individuals such as volunteers, spouses, and children should not be passengers in a County vehicle unless they are involved in the conduct of business.

(j) County vehicles are to be assigned to individuals who, in the required course of their employment, need vehicles to complete their required duties on behalf of the County government.

- (k) Eligibility for County vehicle assignment.
- (1) Take-home assignment. A County vehicle <u>other than a passenger vehicle</u> may be assigned to employees in a service, management or supervisory position on call 24 hours a day, responsible for providing or supporting emergency services. <u>A county passenger vehicle may be assigned to an employee as a take-home vehicle only where the employee travels frequently after-hours on behalf of the County, and it is less expensive to assign a take-home vehicle rather than reimburse the employee for use of a personal vehicle. There is a strong presumption against any take-home passenger vehicle assignments. A vehicle disclosure form shall be used and remain on file in the Department for all "take-home" vehicles.</u>

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- (2) <u>Approval of take-home passenger vehicle assignments</u>. All current passenger vehicle assignments are subject to the review and approval of the Vehicle Steering Committee. All future take home vehicle assignments require the prior approval of the Vehicle Steering Committee.
- (23) Pool assignment. Pool vehicles are to be assigned on a periodic basis to individuals when the County work assignment requires a vehicle in order to properly conduct County business. A vehicle disclosure form and daily log shall be used and remain on file in the Department for all pool vehicles which are taken home overnight. Those employees authorized for overnight use of County vehicles shall, when away from work for an extended period of time, for vacation, sick leave, compensatory time off, travel, etc., return the assigned County vehicle to the custody of his/her department head during the period of absence.
 - a. No person shall be authorized to drive a County vehicle unless he/she:
 - 1. Possesses a current, valid driver's license with the correct class for the vehicle driven.
 - 2. Is the age of 18 or older.
 - 3. Meets rental requirements as specified by rental/leasing agencies.
 - 4. Is free of any prior convictions for driving while under the influence of alcohol or drugs, or of reckless driving within the previous year. Employees operating a commercial vehicle must comply with all of the requirements of the Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1986.
 - 5. Any employee performing work which requires the operation of a County-owned vehicle or a private vehicle at County expense shall notify his/her immediate supervisor immediately of any current restrictions or changes in driving privileges, including, but not limited to, revocation, suspension, cancellation, denial, Restricted Driving Permit, Judicial Driving Permit, Probationary License, Family Financial Responsibility Driving Permit, leaving the scene of an accident, refusal or neglect to report a traffic accident, traffic violations, unpaid traffic citations, failure of vehicle titled in the employee's name to pass the vehicle emissions testing, or unpaid parking citations for a vehicle titled in the employee's name. Any restrictions or changes to driving privileges shall be reported by the employee to the employee's Bureau Chief or Elected Official immediately and a record maintained in the department. Any employee who fails to report, and/or continues to operate a vehicle in the performance of County duties, is subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination from County employment.
 - b. Use of private vehicles for County business:
 - 1. County employees, with the prior permission of their Department Head, may use their private vehicle to conduct official County business. Department Heads shall only approve the use of private vehicles for County business when it is in the best interest of the County to do so.

- 2. A valid proof of insurance is required to operate a private vehicle, which includes coverage of passengers and a copy must be kept in the vehicle and must be filed with the Department's Vehicle Coordinator.
- 3. Employees authorized to use their personal vehicles for County business shall comply with the following insurance requirements:
 - (i) County employees who drive a private vehicle for official County business shall have at least the minimum auto insurance for private vehicles as required by the State of Illinois.
 - (ii) The employee's vehicle insurance policy must be issued by a company that is licensed by the department of insurance for the issuing state.
 - (iii) In the event a County employee is involved in an accident while driving his/her own vehicle, the employee's personal insurance provides the primary coverage.
 - (iv) Mileage reimbursement rates will be based on the Cook County Travel and Expense Reimbursement Policy.

Sec. 2-674. - Miscellaneous rules.

(a) *Traffic laws and regulations*. Drivers of County vehicles shall observe all traffic laws and regulations. Drivers and passengers in County vehicles shall wear seat belts at all times and shall observe safe driving practices. All drivers of a County vehicle involved in accidents and those who have been fined for or charged with a traffic violation may be required to attend a driving safety training class.

(b) *Use of tobacco products.* Use of tobacco products and electronic vapor cigarettes is prohibited in County vehicles.

(c) *Engine idling*. Except for purposes of law enforcement including, but not limited to, surveillance and radar gun use activities, the driver of a County vehicle must turn off the engine upon stopping at a destination and must not cause or allow an engine to idle at any location for more than five consecutive minutes or a period or periods aggregating more than five minutes in any one-hour period, except when idling is absolutely necessary for the conduct of County business, for personal safety, or to comply with traffic laws and law enforcement personnel.

(d) *Liability for damages.* The County shall not be liable for injuries or damages arising from activities outside the scope of employment including, but not limited to, personal use of rented vehicles by employees during a County-authorized business trip. Any damages arising from these circumstances are the responsibility of the employee. To the extent that the County incurs financial liability for the acts of employees which occur outside the scope of employment, Cook County reserves the right to seek reimbursement from the responsible person.

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(e) *Insurance*. The State of Illinois requires that all vehicles have an Illinois Insurance Card at all times. The County Self-Insurance Program is administered by the Department of Risk Management General Liability Division, which will issue a proof of insurance card for each County-owned vehicle. Only vehicles which are included in the County (owned) vehicle inventory shall be registered with the Department of Risk Management for insurance purposes.

(f) *Traffic violations*. Employees shall be held personally responsible for all parking and/or traffic violations incurred while operating a county owned or leased vehicle. <u>The applicable employing</u> Department shall seek reimbursement on behalf of Cook County for County paid parking or traffic violations from the employee responsible for the County paid parking or traffic violation. Failure of an employee to reimburse the County for such offense shall be deemed a major cause infraction and result in discipline up to and including termination. At no time will County funds be used directly or indirectly to pay or reimburse an employee for parking or traffic violations.

(g) Article not intended to enlarge current County liability, etc., to employees. Nothing in this article is intended or shall be construed to extend or enlarge the obligations, liability, or responsibilities that the County currently has to employees, or third parties, by law or contract, if any, in regard to the operation of motor vehicles.

AN AMENDMENT TO THE COOK COUNTY ETHICS ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2 Administration, Article XII Cook County Information Security is hereby amended as follows:

ARTICLE XII. - COOK COUNTY INFORMATION SECURITY

Sec. 2-960. - Short title.

This Article shall be known and may be cited as the "Cook County Information Ordinance".

Sec. 2-961. - Purpose and policy.

All separately elected County and State Officials, Departments, Office Institutions or Agencies funded by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, including, but not limited to, the offices and departments under the control of the County Board President, the Board of Commissioners, Cook County Health and Hospitals System, State's Attorney of Cook County, Cook County Sheriff, Cook County Public Defender, Illinois Clerk of the Circuit Court of Cook County, Cook County Treasurer, Cook County Clerk, Cook County Recorder of Deeds, Cook County Assessor, Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of Cook County,

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Board of Review, Cook County Public Defender, Cook County Independent Inspector General, Cook County Veteran's Assistance Commission and the Public Administrator (collectively, "Agency") shall take all appropriate precautions to protect the confidentiality, integrity, and availability of information. Such precautions shall be in accordance with applicable Federal and State laws and regulations and take into consideration industry standards and best practices.

Sec. 2-962. - Countywide information security working group.

(a) An Information Security Working Group shall be composed of the directors of the information systems for all Agencies set forth in Section 2-961 or the directors' designees.

(b) The Bureau of Technology's Chief Information Security Officer ("CISO") shall be the chair of the Information Security Working Group.

Sec. 2-963. - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this Article shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Guideline means a recommendation to assist an Agency employee or contractor in making appropriate decisions or performing a particular task, which allows for latitude in interpretation and implementation.

Plan means a comprehensive document that details strategic direction, which may also provide additional details, such as Standards used and so forth.

Policy means a document that communicates leadership expectations to a business unit or department of an Agency, which may also be considered as mandatory business rules or organization specific directives and which are communication of management intent.

Procedure means a document stating the manner in which a Policy shall be functionally implemented in an Agency's environment, which may define specific operation steps, manual methods, or instructions for compliance with a Policy.

Standard means a document that contains a specification or describes minimum implementation that satisfies a Policy.

Sec. 2-964. - Information security framework.

(a) The Information Security Working Group shall assist the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) in creating, and updating as necessary, comprehensive and written information security Plans, Policies, Procedures, Standards, and Guidelines for the Agencies (collectively, the "Information Security Framework") to reasonably protect the confidentiality, integrity, and availability of Agency information.

(b) In creating and updating the Information Security Framework, the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) shall seek the advice and recommendations of each Agency in order to ensure that the

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Information Security Framework addresses unique considerations of said Agency; all Agencies shall advise and collaborate with the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) in the creation of the Information Security Framework.

- (c) The Information Security Framework shall:
 - (1) Be in accordance with applicable Federal and State laws and regulations;
 - (2) State all Agencies' minimum requirements and precautions to protect the confidentiality, integrity, and availability of Agencies' information;
 - (3) Address the unique considerations of each Agency in a manner that does not unduly interfere with the operations of such Agency or any confidentiality or privilege required for such operations; and
 - (4) Take into consideration industry standards and best practices by including critical and necessary components of any such similar framework, for example, risk management processes, information security incident response plans, and data breach notification plans.
 - (5) Include an Acceptable Use Policy compliant with Section 2-965 of this Article.

Sec. 2-965. – Acceptable Use Policy for Information Technology Resources.

(a) On or before April 17, 2017, the Information Security Working Group shall create, circulate and update as necessary, an Acceptable Use Policy for Information Technology Resources, addressing issues including but not limited to: the use of County-owned or County-leased computers, telephones, software, social media and electronic communication accounts; and, the use of devices, email accounts, and other electronic communications media that are not County-owned or are not official government email accounts but are used partially or entirely for County business (i.e., formalizing or perpetuating knowledge, setting policy, establishing guidelines or procedures, certifying a transaction or issuing a receipt).

(b) Notwithstanding the above, separately elected officials and their designated senior staff as well as designated Cook County Health and Hospitals System senior staff and physicians may use non-County or non official government email accounts to conduct County business provided such users (1) cooperate with the County to ensure compliance with applicable law including, but not limited to, the Illinois Freedom of Information Act (5 ILCS 140) and the Illinois Local Records Act (50 ILCS 205); (2) notify the CISO on an annual basis whether non-County or non-official government email accounts are being used for official government business and; (3) notify the Information Security Working Group immediately in the event that a non-County or non-official government email account used to conduct County business or a device used to access such account is lost, stolen, or breached.

(c) Separately elected officials and their designated senior staff as well as designated Cook County Health and Hospitals System senior staff and physicians utilizing non-County or non-official government email accounts partially or entirely for County business shall agree to provide the applicable County Freedom of Information Act Officer any records that may be responsive to Freedom of Information Act

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requests, including any records and communications pertaining to County business conducted on non-County email accounts promptly upon request by the applicable County Freedom of Information Act Officer for review and/or disclosure to ensure compliance with applicable law.

Sec. 2-9656. – Adoption and compliance.

(a) The Bureau of Technology's Chief Information Officer ("CIO") and Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) shall publish and make available the Information Security Framework to all Agencies; said Agencies shall adopt and comply with the Information Security Framework in a reasonable time, except as set forth in subsections (b) and (c) of this Section. The Chief Information Officer (CIO), Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) and Agencies shall not otherwise disclose the Information Security Framework except as required to further the security of the various information systems or as required by law.

(b) After publication of the Information Security Framework, Agencies may deviate from the Information Security Framework based on their unique requirements, but only upon the approval of the Information Security Working Group and signing of a mutual agreement that would be executed by the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) and the Agency following the Information Security Working Group approval.

(c) After publication of the Information Security Framework, any Agency not under the control of the County Board President may elect to not adopt and comply with the Information Security Framework by sending written notice to the Chief Information Officer (CIO), the Chair of the Information Security Working Group, and the Technology Committee of the Board of Commissioners within 90 calendar days after such publication; provided that to the extent that such Agency continues to use or access information officer (CIO) may only allow such Agency to use and access such information systems in a manner consistent with the use and access conditions of the Information Security Framework.

- (1) Any Agency not under the control of the County Board President that elects to not adopt and comply with the Information Security Framework under this subsection may, subsequently and at any time, elect to adopt and comply with the Information Security Framework by giving written notice 90 calendar days' in advance to the Chief Information Officer (CIO), the Chair of the Information Security Working Group and the Technology Committee of the Board of Commissioners.
- (2) The adoption and compliance with the Information Security Framework, or the lack thereof, shall not affect any rights and responsibilities arising under any law, including the Illinois Constitution, the Illinois Counties Code or the Code of Ordinance of Cook County, Illinois.

(d) Agencies adopting the Information Security Framework shall take all appropriate actions, including completing assigned training and if warranted, initiating disciplinary action, to ensure their employees and contractors adopt and comply with the Information Security Framework.

Sec. 2-9667. - Review, remediation and enforcement.

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(a) No less than annually, the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) shall review and determine the status of Agency adoption and compliance with the Information Security Framework and whether an Agency's use and access of County information systems adheres to the use and access conditions of the Information Security Framework.

(b) Where the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) has determined that an Agency has not fully adopted or complied with, or uses or access County information systems contrary to, the Information Security Framework, the Chief Information Officer (CIO) and Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) shall notify the Information Security Working Group and that Agency to remediate such deficiencies in adoption, compliance, use or access in a reasonable time; and the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) shall assist such Agency with its remediation effort if requested.

(c) The Chief Information Officer (CIO) and Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) shall be authorized to take all other appropriate actions to protect the County's network that are consistent with the requirements of the Information Security Framework.

(d) Where an Agency disagrees with the Chief Information Security Officer's (CISO's) determination that such Agency has not fully adopted or complied with, or uses or access County information systems contrary to, the Information Security Framework, then such Agency may request that the Information Security Working Group review and determine the status of such Agency's adoption and compliance with the Information Security Framework. The Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) shall follow the Information Security Working Group's determinations.

Sec. 2-9678. - Reporting.

(a) At least once each calendar year, the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) shall report to the Information Security Working Group on the Information Security Framework.

(b) At a minimum, the Chief Information Security Officer's (CISO's) annual report shall detail:

- (1) The status of all Agencies' adoption and compliance with the Information Security Framework; and
- (2) A summary of all advice and recommendations of each Agency regarding their unique considerations.

Based on information provided by the Information Security Working Group, the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) may modify his or her annual report.

(c) The Chief Information Officer (CIO) shall present the Chief Information Security Officer's (CISO's) annual report to the Cook County Board of Commissioners following the presentation of that report to the Information Security Working Group.

RESOLUTION OF THE COOK COUNTY COMMISSION ON SOCIAL INNOVATION CALLING ON A FEASIBILITY STUDY OF CROSS-RAIL CHICAGO

WHEREAS, the Cook County Commission on Social Innovation was established via ordinance, April of 2016, and codified as Chapter 14, Article IX Sections 14-89 to 14-97 to develop policy recommendations for the Cook County Board of Commissioners on matters related to economic development that address divestment and or disinvestment in areas within the Cook County region; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has found through the Cook County Long Range Transportation Plan that improved and expanded passenger train service is essential to maintain Cook County's economic vitality and allow for increased growth and prosperity; and

WHEREAS, finding major transportation projects that can unite the county's economy, by linking business centers to housing centers, convention centers and tourism destinations in order to connect disconnected populations should take precedence; and

WHEREAS, Cook County has ceased the diversion of Motor Fuel Tax funds; and

WHEREAS, the Commission on Social Innovation's committee on Public Capital learned of the Metropolitan High Speed Rail Association's Cross-Rail Chicago proposal, and collectively introduced it to the overall Commission on Social Innovation on October 20th of 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Cross-Rail Chicago plan seeks to connect the tens of thousands of unemployed and underemployed residents living in the south and west sides to jobs available in and around O'Hare Airport on the northwest side and the northwest suburbs; and

WHEREAS, the Cross-Rail Chicago plan seeks to affirm the county's place as financial, business and cultural capital of the Midwest by attracting ridership from millions of tourists and visitors every year; and

WHEREAS, Cross-Rail Chicago proposes coordination between the Chicago Transit Authority, Pace and Metra to create a unified, county-wide transportation network that may be piloted through the expansion of the Metra Electric line, the Metra North Central service to O'hare via existing connections through Union Station, and the 16th Street tracks that would allow for direct rides from South Cook County to Northwest Cook County; and

WHEREAS, increasing the number of Metra trains, and connecting Metra lines together to Pace and Chicago Transit Authority bus lines would significantly improve service for Cook County; and

WHEREAS, such coordination could also provide access to and through Cook County for Amtrak and other trains transporting visitors to the region resulting in broader positive impact for the nation; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County Commission on Social Innovation unanimously voted in favor of encouraging the County of Cook to conduct such feasibility study of Metra Electric on December 18th, 2016.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Cook County Commission on Social Innovation urges the Cook County Board of Commissioners to commission a feasibility study of the Metra Electric to be conducted by the Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that passage of this Resolution constitutes commissioning of the Department of Transportation and Highways by the Cook County Board of Commissioners for a feasibility study of Metra Electric; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department of Transportation and Highways share the results of the study with the Cook County Board of Commissioners, the Cook County Commission on Social Innovation, the City of Chicago, Chicago Transit Authority, Chicago Department of Transportation, Pace, Metra Rail and the Regional Transportation Authority to commence discussions on coordination,

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integration of services, and the possibility of expansion of services to the West Side of Chicago and Western suburbs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Commission on Social Innovation will host two (2) community meetings to discuss the findings.

Effective Date: This Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon adoption.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING TIME LIMITS FOR DISTRIBUTION OF DEPARTMENTAL DOCUMENTS TO THE BOARD

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Article III - County Board, Division 2. - Rules of Organization and Procedure, Section 2-105 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as Follows:

- (j) Agendas.
- (1) Board meeting agenda. The agenda shall briefly describe all items that will be considered at the

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meeting, except for items to be included in the consent calendar as set forth in subsection (3) of this Section. Material pertinent to an item on a Board agenda shall be supplied, along with the agenda, to the President and to each of the Commissioners. With the exception of materials that are confidential as provided by law, such material shall also be available to the public in the office of the Secretary.

- a. Items may be placed on an agenda not later than noon of the day previous to the day on which an agenda is required to be distributed. This subsection shall not apply to items reported to the Board by any of its committees of the whole.
- b. Items may be placed on the agenda of a Board meeting by the President or any Commissioner. Where the President or a Commissioner(s) introduces an ordinance or resolution, he or she shall be listed as sponsor(s) of such ordinance or resolution. Committee reports shall be placed on the agenda of a Board meeting by the Chair of the committee. Items may be placed on the agenda of a committee meeting by a Commissioner who is a member of the committee or the President, in his ex officio capacity, provided that such item has been referred to the committee by the Board pursuant to Section 2-106(o).
- c. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to prepare, post and distribute all agendas for meetings of the Board, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to prepare, post and distribute agendas for committee meetings.
- d. No issuance of any debt instrument which pledges the full faith and credit of the County shall be the subject of final action by the Board of Commissioners unless it has been preceded by at least one public hearing on the prospective matter by the Finance Committee. Notification of such hearing shall be the responsibility of the Finance Committee, which notice shall be as set forth in Section 2-105(i).
- e. Amendments or substitutes to any item placed on an agenda of any meeting of the Board shall be submitted to the Secretary no later than 24 hours in advance of the meeting at which the item will be considered. Upon receipt of the amendment or substitute, the Secretary shall immediately provide the amendment or substitute to the President, all

Commissioners and all news media that have requested notice of meetings and it shall be posted in the Office of the County Clerk and at the location where the meeting is to be held, and shall be made available to the public in the office of the Secretary. This rule may be waived for technical amendments or emergencies.

f. Departmental reports, including but not limited to, reports required by ordinance or resolution, submitted by a department head with any item on an agenda of a Board or committee meeting shall be distributed or made available to all Commissioners no later than 72 hours in advance of said meeting at which the item will be considered, unless said items are solely referred to a committee for later action. Failure to adhere to this subsection shall defer the item to the following scheduled Board or Committee meeting, unless the committee or board votes by a two-thirds majority to allow such reports on the agenda. (2) New items agenda. The Secretary shall prepare a new items agenda to be issued subsequent to the issuance of the Board agenda for a regular meeting. Items may be placed on the agenda by the President or by Commissioners. Where the President or a Commissioner(s) introduces an ordinance or resolution, he or she shall be listed as sponsor(s) of such ordinance or resolution. Each communication, motion, resolution, or ordinance, after being read by the Clerk, may be acted upon immediately by the Board, or referred to committee, as ordered by the Board subject to the "Prior notice to public" provisions of this division.

Effective date: This ordinance shall be in effect Immediately upon adoption.

PROPOSED RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION CALLING ON PRESIDENT-ELECT DONALD J. TRUMP TO SEND FEDERAL RESOURCES TO FIGHT VIOLENCE IN CHICAGO

Board of Commissioners

WHEREAS, at least 762 people were murdered in Chicago in 2016, which is nearly 300 more people than were killed in all of 2015; and

WHEREAS, more than 4,300 people were shot in Chicago in 2016, which is about 1,400 more shooting victims than in all of 2015; and

WHEREAS, Chicago had more people killed by gun violence in 2016 than New York and Los Angeles combined; and

WHEREAS, minorities are most often the victims of the rising violence in Chicago; and

WHEREAS, the incoming presidential administration has indicated that it will send additional federal resources to combat violence if leaders here request them; and

WHEREAS, Cook County government must be proactive in its anti-violence efforts by initiating the dialogue with the incoming presidential administration to develop strategies and request the needed resources to help tackle the epidemic of violence; and

WHEREAS, those resources should come in the form of economic investment in endangered communities; and

WHEREAS, the federal government can assist Chicago police by utilizing federal law enforcement officers to help local officers in curbing the violence and solving more homicides; and

WHEREAS, it is vital that elected officials in their leadership capacities provide the crucial moral and public support to law enforcement officials as they undertake the difficult and dangerous task of combating the epidemic of violence; and

WHEREAS, these measures will have an immediate and significant impact on reducing the violence in Chicago without utilizing the National Guard; and

WHEREAS, the issue of violence is not a political one, and every citizen of Chicago and Cook County should have a right to be safe in their neighborhoods and live without fear of being shot and killed; and

WHEREAS, elected officials must make every effort to fight the violence in Chicago to prevent 2017 from seeing even more people killed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners and President of the Board that this Resolution serve as a formal request to President-elect Donald Trump to provide additional resources to fight the violence plaguing Chicago and that the Cook County Administration, under the leadership of President Toni Preckwinkle, take the necessary steps of communication to initiate this most critical appeal for assistance.

COOK COUNTY WORKFORCE RESOURCE ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2 Administration, Article XIV Cook County Workforce Resource, Section 2-1030 through Section 2-1039 of the Cook County Code is hereby created as follows:

Sec. 2-1030. Short Title.

This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the Cook County Workforce Resource Ordinance.

Sec. 2-1031. Purpose.

The Cook County Real Property Assessment Classification Ordinance provides property tax incentives to encourage industrial and commercial development of new facilities, the rehabilitation of existing structures and the reutilization of abandoned buildings. The goal is to attract new industry, stimulate expansion and retention of existing industry and increase employment opportunities. This Cook County Workforce Resource Ordinance is intended to facilitate the recruitment, training and placement of Cook County residents to fill position vacancies that are created as a result of such industrial and commercial development, rehabilitation or expansion.

The Chicago Cook Workforce Partnership ("The Partnership") is a non-profit administrative agency which administers the County's Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act programs as well as federal subsidies that benefit employers and enable successful recruitment, training, placement and retention of current and prospective employees. Under this Workforce Resource Ordinance, recipients of County Tax Incentives,

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as defined below, shall use The Partnership as a resource to identify, recruit, train and/or hire Cook County residents to fill position vacancies.

Sec. 2-1032. Definitions.

For the purposes of this Article the term:

Beneficiary means the applicant for any County Tax Incentives, the recipient of any County Tax Incentives or a tenant or lessee of a recipient of any County Tax Incentives that employs twenty (20) or more total individuals at the site at which the County Tax Incentives will be received.

County Tax Incentives means any Cook County property tax incentives reviewed by the Cook County Bureau of Economic Development for Classes 6b, 6b TEERM, 6b SER, and 7a that are defined as special circumstances in Chapter 74 Taxation, Article II Real Property Taxation, Division 2 Classification System For Assessment and all applications for property tax incentives for Classes 7b and 7c.

Employer means a Beneficiary with position vacancies or job openings at the site at which property tax incentives will be received.

Government-assisted project means any project funded in whole or in part with County Tax Incentives.

Long Term jobs means those positions expected to last 180 days or more.

Temporary jobs means those positions expected to last less than 180 days.

Sufficient lead time means at least seven (7) business days from the opening of the job application, except in emergency situations.

Workforce Resource Agreement means an agreement executed by The Partnership and the Employer in the form and manner as attached to this Ordinance as Exhibit A. Any modifications to the terms and conditions of such agreement are subject to the approval of the Cook County Bureau of Economic Development.

Workforce Resource Database means a database maintained by The Partnership consisting of unemployed or underemployed Cook County residents that have relevant skills, knowledge, abilities or qualifications to merit consideration for Long Term Job vacancies.

Youth means "in school youth" and "out of school youth" as defined in the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act ("WIOA"), Pub.L. 113-128,

Sec. 2-1033. Limitations.

This Workforce Resource Ordinance shall not apply to positions filled by internal transfers, promotions or recall of laid off employees on recall status from the Employer.

Sec. 2-1034. Workforce Resource Agreement with The Partnership:

Board of Commissioners

(a) Except for the limitations set forth in Section 2-1033 above, The Partnership shall serve as the first resource for finding employees to fill position vacancies created by the government-assisted project. The Partnership's candidate pool will be comprised of County residents sourced from The Partnership's network of workforce development agencies, individuals identified through employer-specific hiring events, and existing and/or future databases of prospective employees (whether said databases be maintained locally or by the State of Illinois); provided however that The Partnership shall give priority to candidates that reside within the District in which the County Tax Incentives will be received.

(b) The Partnership will leverage its County-wide network of workforce development agencies for the purpose of sourcing unemployed or underemployed County residents who meet the desired qualifications identified by the Employer as set forth in the Workforce Resource Agreement.

(c) In accordance with federal law, and state and local policy, The Partnership may also offer the Employer additional resources for the recruitment, training and retention of new hires, including access to federal subsidies where appropriate.

(d) After sufficient lead time, as defined herein, or as mutually agreed upon by the Employer and The Partnership, as specified in the Workforce Resource Agreement, the Employer shall be free to seek other sources to fill position vacancies.

Section 2-1035. Data Collection and Reporting

(a) The Partnership shall compile and maintain a Workforce Resource Database of available candidates for employment from the County's public workforce system that includes Youth participants in WIOA or other Youth programs as permitted by law.

(b) The Partnership will leverage its delegate agencies located throughout Cook County for the purpose of sourcing unemployed or underemployed County residents who have the skills qualifications to merit consideration by Employer.

(c) The Partnership will offer additional employment resources to the Employer for the recruitment and training of new hires and incumbent employees.

Sec. 2-1036. Workforce Resource Agreement.

(a) Every Employer awarded a County Tax Incentive on or after April 16, 2017 shall be required to enter into a Workforce Resource Agreement with The Partnership as a condition of its receipt of County Tax Incentives.

(b) After sufficient lead time, as defined herein, or as mutually agreed upon by an Employer and The Partnership, as specified in the Workforce Resource Agreement, the Employer shall be free to fill remaining Long Term job vacancies by hiring individuals without The Partnership's assistance.

(c) Notwithstanding the above, an Employer may utilize The Partnership's services to fill Temporary job vacancies.

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Sec. 2-1037. Reports.

The Partnership shall submit a bi-annual report to the Cook County Board of Commissioners and the Bureau of Economic Development detailing the employment outcomes attained on behalf of the Employer; however, if no Workforce Resource Agreements have been executed, no report shall be submitted. The report shall include the name of the Employer, including but not limited to:

(a) The number of government-assisted projects for which Workforce Resource Agreements were executed;

(b) The number and nature of Long Term Job vacancies covered by the Workforce Resource Agreement, including, but not limited to, total full time, part time, seasonal, and/or temporary positions.

(c) Average wages of new hires;

(d) Total new hires and wages earned;

(e) The number of youth hired and/or trained in connection with Workforce Resource Agreements; and

(f) The nature and amount of any federal resource utilized to support the hiring, training and/or retention of individuals in accordance with the Workforce Resource Agreement.

Sec. 2-1038. Transfers and Assignments.

In the event of a transfer or assignment by an Employer of all or a portion of its business to a third party in connection with a sale, assignment, lease or otherwise, during the term of the Agreement, such Employer shall notify The Partnership of the effective date of the transfer of its business and the identity of the transferee. This Ordinance and any executed Workforce Resource Agreements are fully binding upon any transferee or successor to such Employer's business.

Sec. 2-1039. Enforceability and Penalties.

In those instances of an Employer's failure to comply with the terms of the Workforce Resource Agreement, The Partnership will notify such Employer specifying areas of noncompliance and provide a period of sixty (60) days in which the Employer may refute or remedy such noncompliance. Failure to refute or remedy said noncompliance may result in a recommendation to the appropriate municipality or, if the property is located in unincorporated Cook County, the Bureau of Economic Development, for withdrawal of County Tax Incentives and denial of future opportunities for said Employer to obtain and utilize County Tax Incentives unless and until such noncompliance has been remedied or successfully refuted.

Effective Date: This Ordinance shall be in effect as of May 1, 2017.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

REAL PROPERTY TAX

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that that Chapter 74 Taxation, Article II Real Property Taxation, Division 2 Classification System for Assessment, Section 74-62 and Section 74-75 of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as Follows:

Sec. 74-62. System Established; terms defined.

(b) Definitions. The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this division, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Youth means a person of age 16 to 24 of low- or moderate-income or belonging to a household of low- or moderate-income and as provided by Section 74-75.

Low income means at least income up to 130% of the federal poverty guideline

Moderate income means from 131% up to 185% of the federal poverty guideline

Abandoned property means, except as otherwise specified in Section 74-63, buildings and other structures that, after having been vacant and unused for at least 24 continuous months, have been purchased for value by a purchaser in whom the seller has no direct financial interest.

Abandoned property shall mean property where the applicant for the incentive program agrees to the CCNRA program. Subsection (b)(i) shall sunset pursuant to Section 74-75.

Sec. 74-75. CCNRA Incentive Class.

(a) Real estate property used for industrial or commercial purposes may receive a CCNRA Incentive Class for the following incentive classifications Class 6b, Class 7a, Class 7b and Class 8 where the incentive is

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in a CCNRA designated area, where the applicant receives a supporting resolution and the property provides for the following:

(1) To be eligible for an applicant must prove agree to the following agreement: The applicant pays an amount of money equal to 7% of the level of assessment savings for each tax year of the term of the incentive to fund the CCNRA Authority.

Formula:

Industrial and Commercial Level of Assessment =	= 25%
Incentive Level of Assessment =	10%
Difference =	15% of Level of Assessment Savings
CCNRA Authority Fund Pay In =	7% of Level of Assessment Savings
Effective Savings for Incentive Applicant =	8% of Level of Assessment Savings

- (2) The CCNRA Authority shall designate the CCNRA designated area in which a CCNRA Incentive applicant may be eligible to apply.
- (3) To qualify for the CCNRA Incentive Class classification, an application for the CCNRA Incentive Class classification must be filed with the CCNRA Authority. The CCNRA Authority shall notify the Assessor's Office to apply the CCNRA Incentive to the applicant's property, subject to state law.
- (4) The initial CCNRA Incentive Class classification shall continue for a period of the underlying incentive classification for both industrial and commercial property complying with employment of youth as stated in this Section. This incentive may be renewed during the last year if the following requirements are met:
 - a. The taxpayer notifies the CCNRA Authority and the Assessor's Office of the taxpayer's intent to request renewal of the CCNRA Incentive Class from the municipality, or the County Board if the real estate is located in an unincorporated area;
 - b. A completed renewal application are filed with the Office of the Assessor before the expiration of the period.

The number of renewal periods is not limited as long as the property continues to apply, qualifies for CCNRA Incentive Class classification. The notice of intent to request renewal which is filed with the Assessor's Office.

(5) The Assessor may adopt rules and regulations to ensure proper review of all factors relevant to determine initial and continued eligibility for the benefits provided under the CCNRA Class classification.

- (6) CCNRA Incentive Classes shall not be subject any requirements imposed on other incentives, notwithstanding the obligation to pay an amount under subsection (a).
- (7) CCNRA Incentive Class applications must be received by the CCNRA Authority and the Assessor's Office on or before November 30, 2027 to receive consideration.

Board of Commissioners

(8) The Assessor shall liberally construe the requirements creating the CCNRA Incentive Classification of this Section.

Effective date: This ordinance shall be in effect immediately.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

HEALTHY WORKFORCE AND HEALTH CARE ACCESS AMENDMENT

WHEREAS, in addition to the various protections offered under the Cook County Human Rights Ordinance ("CCHRO"), the CCHRO also prohibits persons from engaging in unlawful discrimination in the provision or distribution of any Cook County ("County") facilities, services or programs; and

WHEREAS, the CCHRO defines unlawful discrimination as "discrimination against a person because of the actual or perceived status, practice, or expression of that person's race, color, sex, age, religion, disability, national origin, ancestry, sexual orientation, marital status, parental status, military discharge status, source of income, gender identity or house stats; or the actual or perceived association with such a person;" and

WHEREAS, while the CCHRO currently prohibits discrimination in the provision or distribution of any County facilities, services or programs based upon national origin and other protected classes, the provisions of the CCHRO do not specifically cover immigration status or documentation of immigration status; and

WHEREAS, expansion of the definition of unlawful discrimination in the CCHRO to prohibit discrimination of persons based upon immigrant status or documentation of immigrant status in the application of County services or programs ensures the equal provision of County services; and

WHEREAS, expansion of the definition of unlawful discrimination in the CCHRO to prohibit discrimination of persons based upon immigrant status provides further confidence in the County's provision of health services and is also beneficial to the protection of the public health of all County residents.

Board of Commissioners

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Commissioners of Cook County that Chapter 42 Human Relations, Section 42-39, of the Cook County Code shall be amended as follows:

Sec. 42-39. - County facilities, services and programs.

(a) *Prohibition*. No person shall engage in unlawful discrimination in the provision or distribution of any Cook County ("County") facilities, services, or programs. For purposes of this section, "unlawful discrimination" shall include immigration status, unless consideration of immigration status is required by Federal or State law.

(b) *Exception*. The Cook County Commission on Human Rights ("Commission") as defined in Section 42-34 shall adopt rules specifying any exceptions to the prohibition contained in this section based on bona fide considerations of public policy.

- (c) Sexual harassment.
- (1) No person shall engage in sexual harassment in the provision or distribution of any County facilities, services, or programs.
- (2) When used in this subsection, the term "sexual harassment" means any unwelcome sexual advance, request for sexual favors, or conduct of a sexual nature when:
 - a. Submission to such conduct is an explicit or implicit term or condition of an individual's use of County facilities, or the provision of County services or programs;
 - b. Submission to or rejection of such conduct by an individual is used as the basis for any decision affecting the provision or allocation of County services or programs, or the use of County facilities; or
 - c. Such conduct has the purpose or effect of substantially interfering with an individual's access to County services, programs, or facilities, or the conduct creates an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment for the provision of County services or programs, or in the use of County facilities.

Effective date: This ordinance shall be in effect immediately upon adoption.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

AN AMENDMENT TO THE COOK COUNTY RULES OF ORGANIZATION AND PROCEDURE

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Chapter 2 - Administration, Article III - County Board, Division 1 - Generally, Section 2-106 - Committees of the Cook County Code is hereby amended as Follows:

Sec. 2-106. - Committees.

(h)*Notice and agendas.* The agenda shall briefly describe all items that will be considered at the meeting. Material pertinent to an item on a committee or subcommittee agenda shall be supplied, along with the agenda, to the President and to each of the Commissioners. With the exception of materials that are confidential as provided by law, such material shall also be available to the public in the office of the Secretary.

- (1) Notwithstanding any other rules governing origination of items on the Board agenda, including subsection (o) of this Section, the following items types are permitted for origin with their respective committees: Litigation Pending; Recommendations of the Zoning Board of Appeals; Journals of Proceedings; Court Ordered Payments; Workers Compensations Claims; Subrogation Recoveries; Self-Insurance Claims; Proposed Settlements; Patient Arrestee Claims; Employee Injury Compensation Claims; Revenue Report; and the Cook County Health And Hospitals System Monthly Report.
- (2) Amendments or substitutes to any item placed on an agenda of any meeting of a committee or subcommittee shall be submitted to the Secretary no later than 24 hours in advance of the meeting at which the item will be considered. Upon receipt of the amendment or substitute, the Secretary shall immediately provide the amendment or substitute to the President, all Commissioners and all news media that have requested notice of meetings and it shall be posted in the Office of the County Clerk and at the location where the meeting is to be held, and shall be made available to the public in the office of the Secretary. This rule may be waived for technical amendments or emergencies.
- (3) Notwithstanding any action to be undertaken by committees or subcommittees pursuant to this Section, only the Board may take final action on any item referred to a committee or subcommittee. Any item contained on a committee or subcommittee agenda, as properly noticed pursuant to subsection (f) of this Section, shall also be referenced on the next regularly scheduled Board Meeting Agenda under the Committee Items Requiring Board Action for purposes of consideration and possible action by the Board. If a properly noticed item contained on a committee or subcommittee agenda is not included in the Committee Items Requiring Board Action section of a Board Meeting Agenda, the Secretary to the Board of Commissioners may include

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that item in an errata and the Board of Commissioners may consider the item as if it were properly noticed.

Effective date: This ordinance shall be in effect immediately upon adoption.
