- Grant-funded contract with Hektoen Institute for Medical Research, for administration of contracts for Community-Based Organizations relating to the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) Covid-19 Contact Tracing Grant, in an amount not-to-exceed \$6,025,996.00, for a twelve (12) month period from 6/01/2020 through 5/31/2021
- Grant-funded contract with Hektoen Institute for Medical Research, for temporary staffing relating to the IDPH Covid-19 Contact Tracing Grant, in an amount not-to-exceed \$3,581,220.06, for an eleven (11) month period from 7/01/2020 through 5/31/2021

On June 26, 2020, the CCH Board delegated authority to give final approval for these requests to the Finance Committee; these requests are being presented to the Finance Committee for final approval.

Chair Reiter provided an introduction to the items. At the last full Board Meeting, the Board held off taking action on the Hektoen contract that was related to Covid-19 contact tracing. It was delegated by the Board to come back to the Finance Committee for final approval on the contracts at a special meeting. Since then, he had a conversation with Debra D. Carey, Interim Chief Executive Officer, who reported that the administration was going to change the structure and how they were going to deploy the Hektoen contracts. Because it took some time to restructure, it is now being presented for final approval at this regularly scheduled Finance Committee meeting, instead of being considered earlier at a special meeting of the Finance Committee.

Ms. Carey provided additional information. She stated that part of the reason why the Hektoen contract was deferred was to make sure that there was communication with the unions. The administration went back and looked at how the program was structured, and looked at what positions at CCH had functions similar to contact tracing; it was determined that these positions are actually positions that CCH has individuals performing similar tasks, so it was appropriate that CCH would directly hire for these positions. The original proposal would have had these positions hired through Hektoen. It was also recognized that CCH has a commitment to begin the program as quickly as possible, and CCH's hiring process may not allow hiring to be done as expeditiously as desired, so the plan is for Hektoen to hire temporary staff with the intent of getting the program started and CCH will also begin to hire regular staff; eventually all of the positions will be on CCH's payroll. Today the administration is asking consideration of two (2) requests: 1) to have Hektoen engage community-based organizations on behalf of CCH; and 2) to have Hektoen employ temporary staff to be used as contact tracers for CCH as it ramps up the program and hires most of the individuals through CCH.

Director Driscoll noted that she will be asking for hiring updates at each meeting; later in the meeting, the Committee incorporated into the motion for approval the stipulation that monthly reports on hiring be provided to the Finance Committee for the next twelve (12) months. During the Committee's discussion of CCH hiring staff directly, Director Deer requested that a copy of CCH's Employment Plan be provided to him.

Dr. Rachel Rubin, Senior Public Health Medical Officer and Co-Lead, Cook County Department of Public Health, provided information on the number of temporary staff that will be hired via the Hektoen contract (that information is included in the transmittal).

Director Richardson-Lowry, seconded by Director Munar, moved to approve request numbers 1 and 2, as amended, and directed that a monthly report be provided to the Finance Committee for the next twelve (12) months regarding hiring through Hektoen Institute for Medical Research and directly through Cook County Health. On the motion, a roll call vote was taken, the votes of yeas and nays being as follows:

Charles Jones, Chief Procurement Officer, provided an overview of the contractual requests presented for the Committee's consideration. The Committee reviewed and discussed the requests. It was noted that request number 3 is being withdrawn.

During the discussion of request number 25, Director Koetting inquired how the organization gets reimbursed for these implants; he noted that Medicaid has specific billing for long-acting contraceptive devices, and he just wants to make sure that reimbursement is being received. Ms. Carey responded that the information will be provided.

Director Deer referenced a previous request for an update on the implementation of the Vizient contract for contract management and nursing registry services, which was approved late last year. He asked if an update is available yet. Mr. Jones responded that the contract has not yet started, as they've hit a snag with the terms and conditions of the contract. He expects to have it executed in the couple of weeks, but the vendor will still need 90 days to issue a Request for Proposals to get all of the vendors as necessary.

During last month's Finance Committee meeting, members of SEIU Local 73 provided testimony raising serious concerns about Morrison Healthcare's ability to competently manage Food and Nutritional Services. Thank you for quickly tasking Chief Procurement Officer, Charles Jones, to provide a full report on Morrison's performance. In this report, I hope to see answers to the following questions:

- 1. When was the last time that CCH evaluated whether the management of food services is better outsourced or brought back in-house in terms of costs, quality of service and food, and patient satisfaction? What were the results?
- 2. What is Morrison's profit margin on this contract?
- 3. How many managers does Morrison employ? What is the manager-to-staff ratio in Food and Nutritional Services?
- 4. What sort of working conditions does Morrison provide workers? What is the grievance history?
- 5. What is Morrison's policy for use of temporary employees under CCH? According to payroll records, has Morrison followed this policy?
- 6. What are Morrison's policies and processes for dealing with sexual harassment? Do they maintain any records of complaints, investigations, and outcomes? If so, are these records available to the board?
- 7. How does Morrison handle complaints from patients, doctors and clinical staff, administration, employees, etc.? Again, do they maintain these records of complaints and the company's response? Are these records available to the board?
- 8. What do patient satisfaction surveys say about the food services provided by Morrison?

Thank you for your commitment to vigorously evaluate the outsourcing of services in order to do what is in the best interest of workers, patients, and the public health of Cook County.

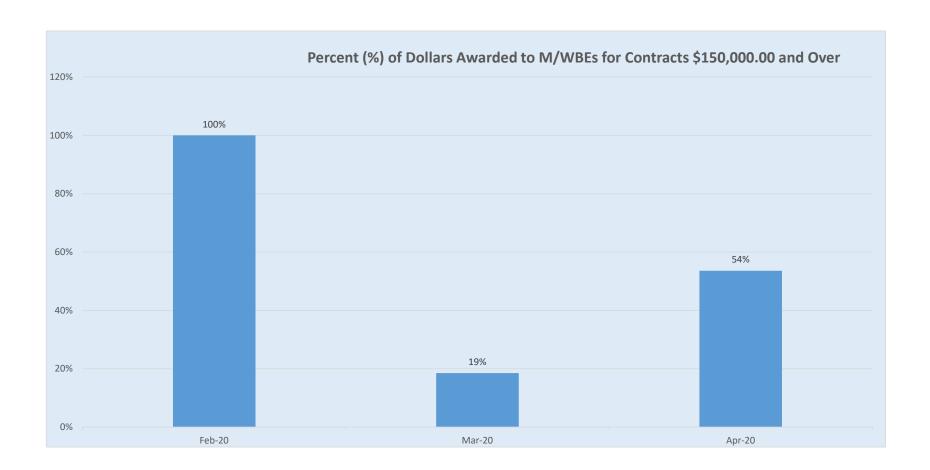

# **Executive Summary**

- Cook County Health (CCH) financial results for the six months ended May 31, 2020 are ahead of budget by \$52M
  - Primary negative variances are expense overages, partly driven by COVID-19 pandemic response costs, and the loss of revenue due to reduced volumes during the pandemic
  - ➤ Government support payments have supplemented the loss of "reimbursable" patient activity \$77.6M year to date from the CARES Act
  - Patient activity began to decline in March, and charges have improved to be only 30% lower than normal in May
- Key finance changes since our last meeting include:
  - > FY2019 Cost Report Settlement identifying \$15 million due to CCH this year
  - FY2021 Preliminary budget forecast issued
  - National emergency extended into October, which extends enhanced FMAP with over \$30M impact
- Key current finance initiatives include:
  - Forecasting and planning in anticipation of the FY21 budget submission
  - Accessing Federal and State financial support for the COVID-19 pandemic
  - Implementation of revenue cycle operational improvements

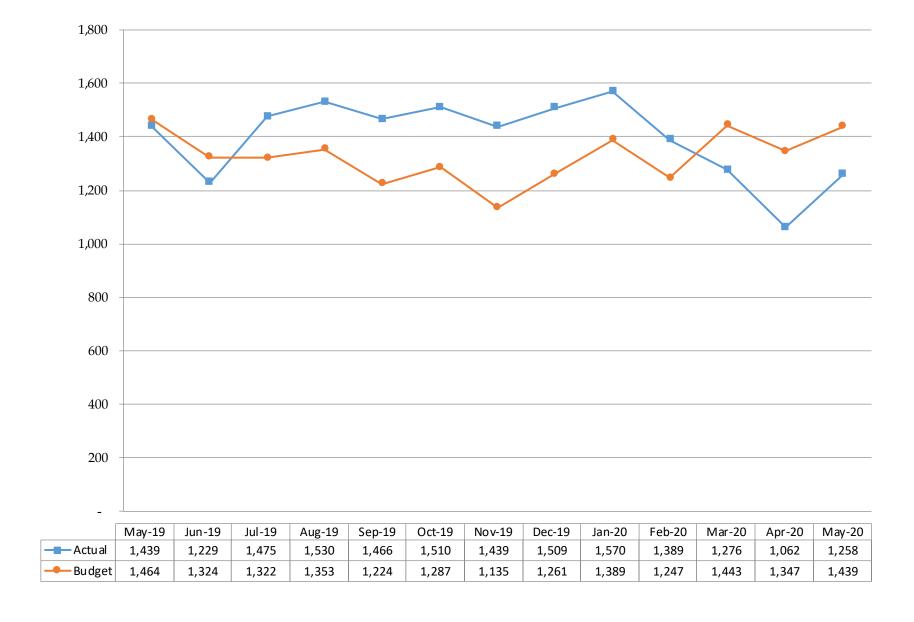

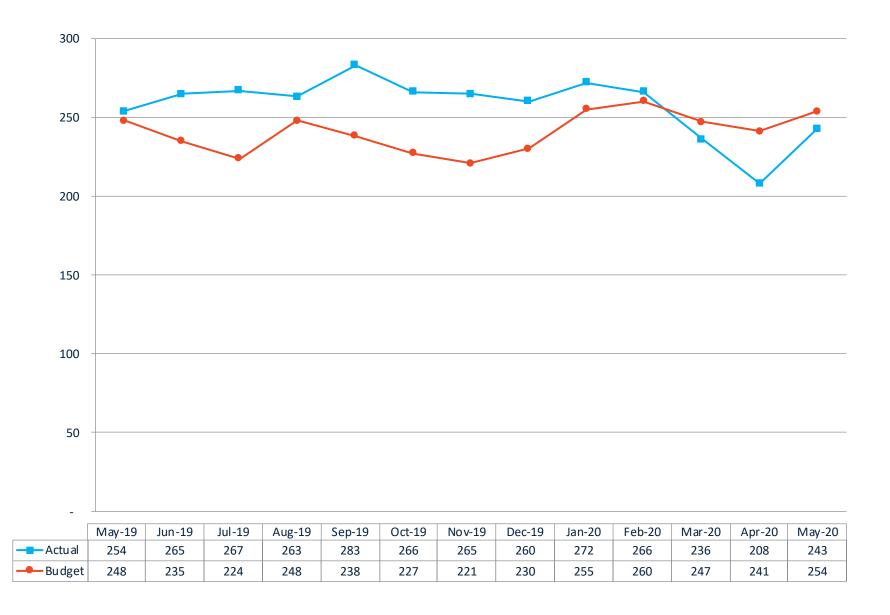
# **Commentary**

- ➤ Bi-monthly, CCH transfers all cash receipts to the Treasurer and the Comptroller books these transfers, providing CCH with revenue credit for these deposits. Additionally, the Treasurer receives some funds directly from the state through the IGT process (FFS Medicaid, CountyCare PMPM, DSH, & BIPA, for example); these funds are also credited by the Comptroller to CCH. Note, timing of revenue received impacts this number for seasonal revenues such as property tax and BIPA.
- The biggest driver of CCH's cash balance is the Cash Held By County Treasurer. Temporary negative balances in the pooled cash result from pooled cash funds being used for more payments of CCH expenses than expenses of other County funds. Although the net cash balance is negative for the month, the balance has improved by \$94.5M, as compared to the prior month.

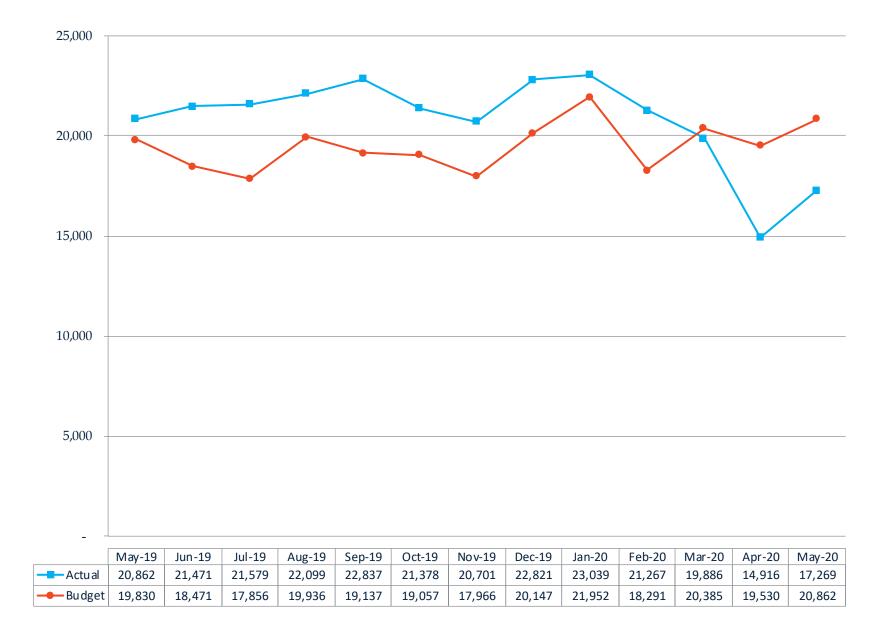
# CCH Health Prior 13 Month Admissions - FY 2020



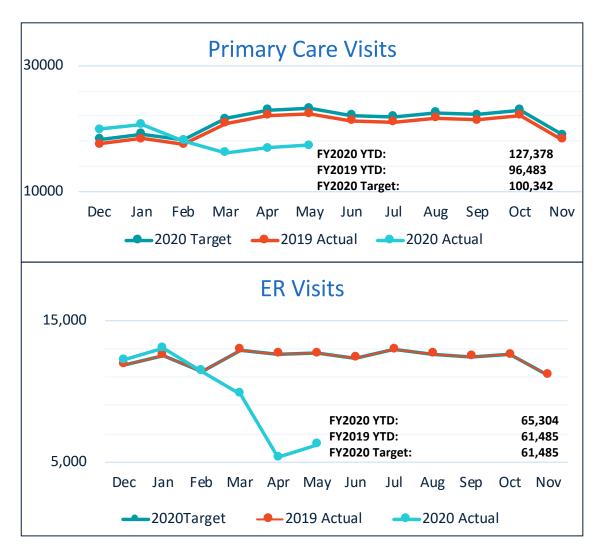
# CCH Health Prior 13 Month Ave. Daily Census- FY 2020

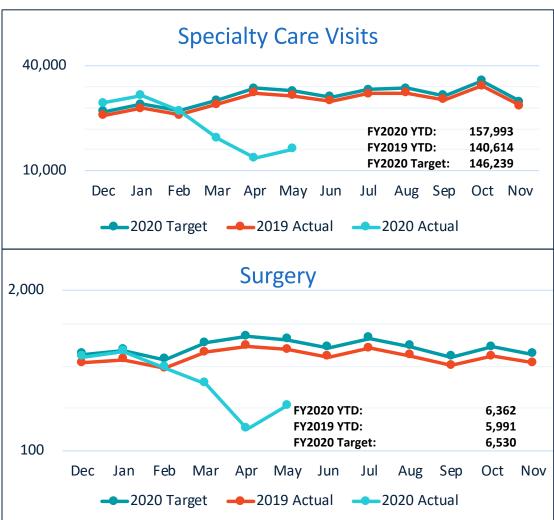


# CCH Health Prior 13 Month Adjusted Patient Days- FY 2020

# **Commentary**

- FY20 Capitation Revenue is above budget due to HFS eligibility retro adjustments and the addition of the Special Needs Children population
- While total member months are under budget, there has been an increase in membership for the month of May and membership is expected to continue to increase due to increasing Medicaid enrollment as a result of the COVID-19 induced growth in unemployment
- CountyCare's reimbursement to CCH is budgeted at \$86.4M and is currently above budget at \$100.4M.
- Operating expenses are currently above budget, reflecting the addition of the Special Needs Children population and higher than expected claims costs.



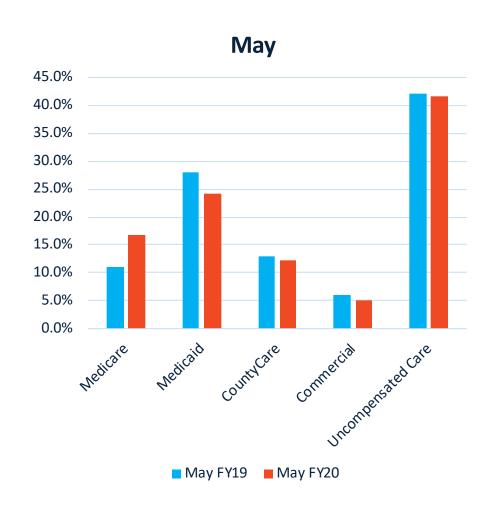

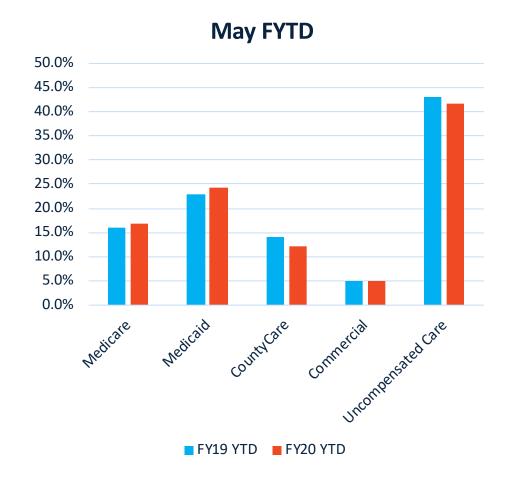

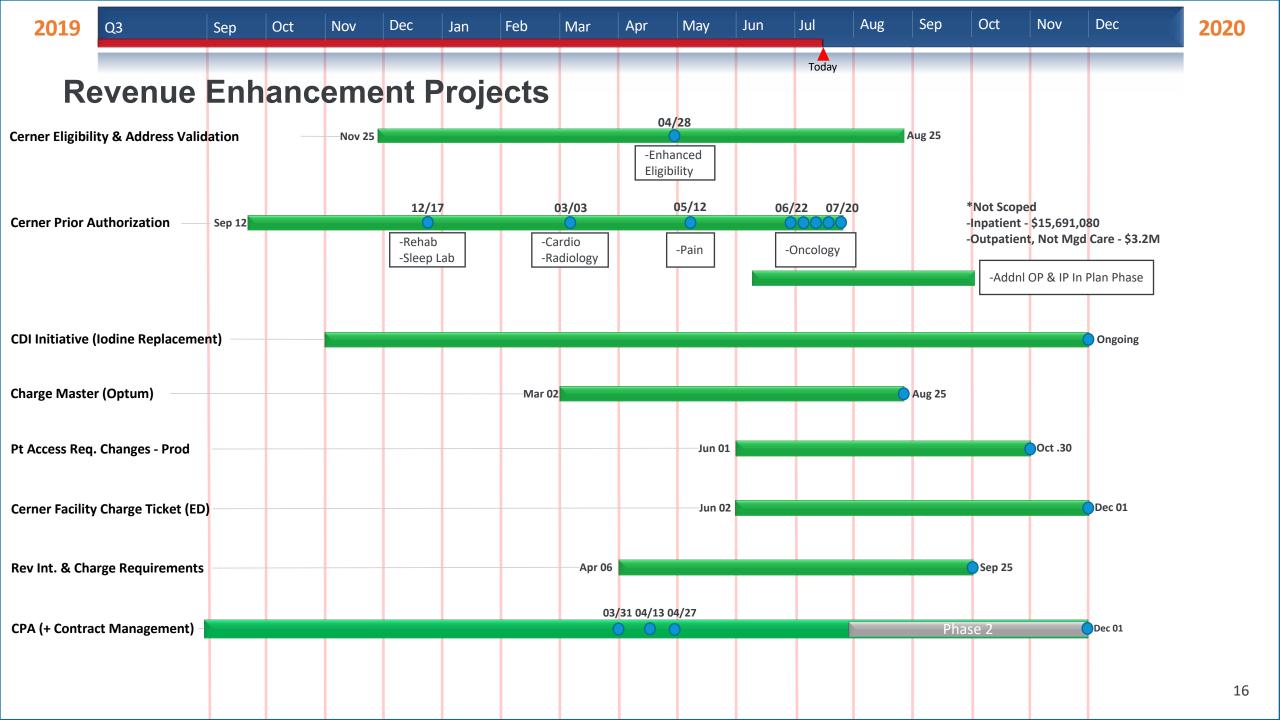

# Guiding Principles for the FY2021 Budget

- Correctional and Public Health are mandated services
- Trauma and Emergency Room are essential services
- Retain services with greatest revenue potential
- Reduction/elimination of programs necessary, while retaining functions required for mandatory and essential services and those that generate revenue to cover costs
- Ensure CountyCare, MORE Care and other insured patients can be seen in order to capture more domestic spend
- Delay expansion or re-instituting suspended services
- Limit services for uninsured to supplemental support received (DSH, BIPA)
- Volumes will slowly return to pre-COVID levels, while CARES Act funding ends
