**Comment:** The only way for this to work is for this to REPLACE what we currently do with our Public Safety funds with the crisis response system that NAMI Chicago mentioned is needed for the 590 programs to make sense. The money needed to build out this system is equivalent to the amount of money used to currently incarcerate this same population.

**Question:** Can a commissioner on the Public Safety committee talk about how/why they would choose to NOT fund a program like this to keep us safe, but are willing to fund (1.9 Billion) for programs like police/sheriff that cause us harm and do NOT keep us safe?

People are safe when others in their community have all the resources they need, especially mental health services. We need them healed through professional help and sent back to us whole and able to participate in family life.
