Summary: Amends Section VIII Paragraph K of the Minority, Women and Veteran/Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business Enterprise Program Rules and Regulations to allow State of Illinois Veteran-Owned Small Business and Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business certification to be accepted for purposes of proof of VBE or SDVBE status by firms participating or seeking to participate on County contracts unless the firm has been denied by Cook County, provided that the firm submits a Size Standard Affidavit that demonstrates compliance with the requirements of the County Code.
