WHEREAS, the De Geratto family migrated to the United States of America in the late 1800s; and

WHEREAS, the De Geratto's lived at 207 North Menard, Chicago, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, it all began with Phillip De Geratto I, in the 1950s opening and operating his first grocery store, "Big Bear Foods," located at 5007 West Chicago Avenue; and

WHEREAS, Phillip De Geratto I, would later open two other Big Bear Foods on the west side of Chicago with his son, Phillip De Geratto II, who renamed the stores "Buddy Bear Food Centers," and adopted the motto, "People Who Care, Shop Buddy Bear"; and

WHEREAS, during the Chicago riots in 1968, the Buddy Bear Food Centers on Chicago Avenue was destroyed; and eventually the two remaining Buddy Bear Food Centers were closed. Phillip De Geratto I, retired from the grocery business and later died in 1979; and

WHEREAS, Phillip De Geratto II (Buddy) and Phillip De Geratto III inherited their father and grandfather's entrepreneurial spirit; and
